How well do you know your U.S. Presidents?

President's Day by Evan Kramer

February 12 is Abraham Lincoln's birthday but our 16th President will have to wait until Monday for his Day. Lincoln, and George Washington whose birthday is February 22, are now remembered jointly on President's Day which falls this year on Monday the 15th. Schools, financial institutions and government will close for the day while most other forms of enterprise hang out the open sign.

Lincoln's distinguished profile has graced the front of the copper penny for the last 84 years while his full profile honors the five dollar bill. The Lincoln penny is the longest running impression of a President on our coinage. Which makes me wonder what ever happened to the Kennedy half dollar and Eisenhower dollar.

The Lincoln monument in Washington D.C., his face carved in stone at Mt. Rushmore, the numerous books about him including a series by Carl Sandburg, the movies - Young Mr. Lincoln with Henry Fonda impersonating Mr. Lincoln... Our 16th President lives on in many ways.

Lincoln was shot by John Wilkes Booth at the Ford Theater in Washington D.C. on April 14, 1865 and died the next day. The Civil War had come to an end on April 9 when General Lee surrendered his Confederate troops to General Grant at Appomattox Court House, Virginia. Lincoln had little time to enjoy the ending of this most tragic war. Reconstruction went ahead with Andrew Johnson as President.

2% Equal=Tax Meeting

The wildfire that is sweeping the state of Oregon known as the 2% Equal=Tax Amendment is coming to Bandon on February 13, Saturday evening 7:00pm, at the Barn. The Barn is Bandon's community center is located on 11th St. For people driving north on 101 turn left on 11th and proceed west several blocks. Mr. Walter Huss, one of the authors of the initiative will speak at this meeting. This too-good-to-be-true constitutional amendment is attracting more and more attention, and with that, a lot of questions. Now is a chance to meet with and ask the person who started it all your questions and concerns.

The 2%=Equal Tax would amend the state constitution. It would replace state and local income taxes, fuel and oil taxes, urban renewal financing, tax bases, property taxes and fees and assessments with a 2% charge on goods and services, wholesale, retail or otherwise.

The Direct Legislation League, based in Portland is currently circulating petitions seeking 125,000 signatures to get the 2% Equal Tax Amendment on the ballot.

The amendment is worded so that only a vote of 60% majority can raise the percentage of the tax. The percentage could be lowered by the people or the legisla-

Counties could raise the Equal=Tax by a maximum of 1% for the entire county for not more than 5 years by a vote of 60% majority vote of the people. At the end of five years the tax drops back to the original rate.

Efforts are being made to bring Walter Huss or another proponent of the Equal=Tax to Port Orford for a meeting. For more information contact Bill Brewster at 267-7109.

Bandon teachers earn nearly \$3,000 more. One of the teachers, Jan Kerker pointed out their profession spends many hours preparing and doing schoolwork on their own time outside of contract hours. Dale Bures, a science teacher at Pacific High School branded the Board salary proposal unfair. He said teacher morale was at all time low in the 20 years he has been with the district but said teachers were more united than ever. There was no response from any of the seven board members to the many statements that were made.

Besides a pay raise and continuation of the full health benefits they received in their previous contract which expired in



June of 1992 there are at least two other big issues. The teachers are asking for equitable preparation time for elementary (grades 1-4) teachers and contracts of two years in duration. A fact finding was held on Monday, February 8 attended by representatives of the teacher's union, board members representing their negotiating team and Superintendent Wold. The fact finder has 30 days from that meeting to issue his report and the district will have a couple of weeks to respond. His report is not binding on any of the parties. There are three scenarios shaping up here. The Board can force on the teachers their last best offer, the teacher's union and board can come to an agreement, or the teachers can strike.



I'm sympathetic to the teachers. They are truly on the front lines in the education process. The children in this community are our future and their education is of the utmost importance. The quality of the teachers is paramount. There's no doubt looking at the statistics this is one of the lower paid group of teachers in the state. Let's settle this thing. The last thing we need is a strike. This is coming from a person who had a lot of problems in school and caused a lot of teachers grief. Looking back now from a vantage point of many years I still remember the ones who got through to me despite all the obstacles I threw in their face. To those I say "thanks for not giving up on us hard cases and slow learners" and to those whose lives I helped make miserable I say "I'm truly sorry."
