## School Board Meeting by Evan Kramer

A large crowd of students, parents, teachers and other citizens showed up for the March 9 meeting of the Port Orford 2CJ School Board. So many in fact, that the meeting was moved into the Pacific High gymnasium.

The meeting started with a demonstration put on by the high school cheerleaders. When this was over school board Chairman Frank Smith presented Debbie Beck with an award for all the work she has put into the cheerleading program.

Dean Davis, teacher at Pacific high school, introduced the school's yearbook staff and its editor Molly Reese, who spoke about the changes with this year's book. The most important one is that the pages will go to the printer camera ready for the first time. From my vantage point the pages looked very well done.

Board member Mike Knapp made a motion to alter the agenda and instead of proceeding to reports from the superintendent, principals, etc. that the board move into the time allotted for public input. The reason for this was that most of the 150-200 people present were there because of the contract negotiations between the teachers and the school district. Several held up placards in support of the teachers and many wore purple ribbons also signifying their support. Many had signed up to speak to the board.

Several people including Christo Schwartz, Yvonne Ousley and Karim Shumaker asked questions of the board which were not answered. Frank Smith repeatedly quoted from a press release the board had issued centered around ORS 243.672 as the reason the board wouldn't answer questions. This press release is printed in its entirety on the back page of this paper and should be read to understand where the board was coming from.

At this point in the meeting *every* 2CJ school teacher got up and walked out of the gymnasium to facilitate more open discussion between the board and the citizenry.

Lizzie Smelzer spoke in support of the teachers. Linda Foster spoke forcefully about the morale being low at Driftwood Elementary School where her two sons attend. Flo Lichtig said she was glad she wasn't on the school board tonight (amen) and thanked the special work several teachers had done with her daughter. Bob Wilson, a retired school teacher from California spoke about how the taxpayers in the Port Orford had rallied together and created several taxing districts including the school and library districts which he was proud of, but was now embarrassed by the current situation.

Several others spoke, all in support of the school teachers. The last person from the public to speak, Vic Farris, read a letter

from the Central Courier Geozette written by Gloria Rodgers concerning the amount of money county taxpayers spend on school superintendents.

Frank Smith brought up the point that only one member of the public had attended the fact finder's hearing even though it was a public meeting. School board member Larry Blount emphatically stated that ORS 243.672 which was enacted in 1973 was a mistake but that it is the law and has to be followed. He advised people to contact their legislators about changing the law. A question was asked of Frank Smith about how much money was spent on negotiations. He responded by saying it was more than the difference between the salary that the teachers are asking for and what the district is offering, but he didn't have an exact dollar amount. During the evening board members had been passing out to public speakers copies of District Exhibits for the Factfinding Hearing. After the meeting the teachers offered to make copies available of the Polta Exhibits for the Factfinding Hearing. Note: These are two distinctly different documents.

At the conclusion of the public input a break was called by Chairman Smith. The people then exited to the hallway and broke into conversations with the self exiled teachers. When the school board meeting opened again in the li-

brary the vast majority of people had left. They had come out to show their support for the teachers and their point had been made though their questions remained unanswered.

And now for the editor's rambling observations.... There are still seven unresolved contract issues between the district and the school teachers. The Factfinder, John Hayduke will mail his report on March 19. Nothing in it is binding on either party. Of the seven issues no one including me seems to know which one or ones are the most important or difficult to resolve. Board Chairman Smith says the money is there for 92-93 but is concerned about not having the money to pay for the contract for 93-94. This year the district has received \$250,000 from the State for equalization funds. Senate President Bill Bradbury wrote a letter to the school board on December 2, 1992. In the letter he offered some thoughts on why the equalization money was provided. To quote him, "An equal educational opportunity means a sound physical plant, but it also means a great teaching staff and the ability to attract that staff through an adequate compensation and benefit package". He also says, "I would suggest that the legislature's interest was to see these expenditures and carry-overs balanced with a commitment to the human resources of education - namely, teachers".

There are no doubt people out there who support the school board's position in the negotiations. But at this point all letters in the paper have been in support of the teachers except one, all public comments have supported the teachers at the last two school board meetings with no public comment in favor the district's position. On a public level this community has rallied around its school teachers. It is important that all opinions be heard and questions be asked. Individuals should contact the seven school board

members with both their sentiments and questions. Both Factfinding Exhibit Books should be read. They provide arguments for both positions. I hope that the community's interest in their school district remains high after these contract negotiations are settled. Issues like curriculum are important also. Most school board meetings are poorly attended when there isn't a hot topic on the agenda. For that matter most special districts monthly meetings are held without public interest.

Let's settle this contract without a strike.
