SBA Here Now by Evan Kramer

Two representatives from the Small Business Administration are in Port Orford Thursday, Friday, and Saturday to meet with local business owners at the Port Orford City Hall council chambers. The hours for these meetings are 7:00-9:00pm Thursday, May 13 and 9:00am-5:00pm on both Friday and Saturday, May 14 & 15. The representatives will hand out loan applications for businesses affected by the recent 15 day closure of Highway 101 due to the landslide. They will answer questions and give out information about the loan program.

The federally sponsored S.B.A. Economic Injury Loans are done at 4% interest. Beat that, Mastercard! They are authorized to loan up to \$500,000 although their average loan is in the \$20,000 - \$30,000 range.

Besides offering the low interest loans, a deferred payment program up to 5 months is available with the possibility of extending it further. One bit of information the S.B.A. will need from businesses is prior tax returns.

The S.B.A. program in Port Orford was coordinated by Chamber of Commerce President Janelle Haller. She went to work immediately after the landslide started taking its toll on area businesses preparing the loan request packet which went to Governor Barbara Roberts of-

rice. Janelle will assist the S.B.A. officials with your questions at the Thursday evening session. She says these loans have been given a high priority and may be processed within 30 - 60 days of submission.

The recently concluded Port Orford Arts Festival '93 was a big success. The weather even cooperated after Friday's rainy start, leading into two wonderful days of sunshine and warm weather on Saturday and Sunday. I would like to thank the Arts Council members and all the artists and other participants who put on this thoroughly enjoyable weekend.

Letter to the Editor

Re: May 4, 1993 School Board Meeting

Dear School Board Members:

The above referenced meeting had more the appearance of a puppet show than a serious school board meeting. This observation is based on the following:

(a) The meeting was conduct by Chair-
man Smith at variance with the com-
monly accepted parliamentary procedure.

(b) The board chairman was the first to
vote on all motions. The board members,
without exception, followed Mr. Smith's
lead. The chairman of a meeting or
panel, properly should only vote in order
to break a deadlock.

(c) The board members whispered among
themselves in a blatantly ignorant man-
ner, thereby excluding the public from
the subject being discussed. This is the
"keep them in the dark" theory practiced
in the corporate world.

Quite possibly the most flagrant abuse of
executive power was the manner in which
the board tabled the contract renewal of
Mrs. Van Riper, and others. Chairman
Smith stated "the board was too busy to
evaluate some employees", even those
on a year to year contract. However, they
(board) were not to busy to renew the
contract of Superintendent Wold, one
year in advance of its due date of expira-
tion.

memory for other programs which may
then malfunction.

2) Smartdrv does not immediately write
your data to disk. Disk corruption can
occur if you turn off the computer before
Smartdrv finishes flushing its buffers.

Smartdrv can significantly speed a
computer's operation and it's great that
more people will benefit from it. At the
same time, it's important to understand
how to use it safely. We also advise all
users to avoid DoubleSpace for now.

Fort Orford Cornerstone

Recently a luncheon was held for Agnes Baker Pilgrim, a Siletz/Takilma elder. She was invited to give her views regarding the rebuilding of historical Fort Orford. Her opinion was that rebuilding the Fort is a misguided effort and our time would be better spent by putting up a historical marker and or building an interpretive center.

The midden on the old fort site may be a sacred land to the Tututni. Agnes Baker-Pilgrim offered to have the drummers from Siletz come with her and other Indian spiritual leaders to have a smudging ceremony for all the sacred Indian sites in our vicinity. She is on the sacred lands committee at Siletz and has the opportunity to discuss this with them.

Agnes emphasized that our efforts can be redirected toward the positive aspects of all our cultures and giving an overall picture of the site rather than just one the period of the fort's existence. Our afternoon with Agnes ended with 2 Indian songs (one of mourning, one of joy) and a prayer.

Our meeting of May 11 was to discuss what we had learned from our afternoon with Agnes Baker Pilgrim and to determine what action should be taken until we hear from her or the Siletz tribal council. So far, only one segment of our community's 'silent majority' has chosen to convey their thoughts and feelings
