The Circus is In Town by Evan Kramer

The event we've all been looking forward to, comes to Port Orford this Saturday afternoon. None other than the Culpepper-Merriweather Great Combined Circus will be here. I've sure been yapping enough about these performances starting way back when the Chamber of Commerce was busy debating whether or not to sponsor them. Now the planning stage yields to the imminent arrival of the circus performers, animals, the Big Top tent and all the other equipment that goes along with a traveling circus. Some of the performers include Flamo the Fire Eater, the Kiss Trio and one acrobat who will walk upside down from the top of the tent.

The procession of vehicles bearing the circus is due in town around 9:30am on Saturday morning from Gold Beach. They have two performances scheduled for Friday afternoon and evening at Riley Creek Elementary School. They will circle the wagons at Driftwood Elementary School for two performances in the afternoon. You might want to get some film in your camera or camcorder and take some photos or a home movie of the circus folk raising the Big Top with the help Barbara the elephant, said to be the world's most intelligent elephant. I wonder what she got on her SAT's? The circus encourages people to come and watch them set up the tent for their performances later that day.

The last time we went to a circus was to see the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus playing in a building constructed for ice hockey and basketball. The sheer size and spectacle of their show was almost too much. One of the more interesting things about that circus was the train they traveled in, which was stationed along a siding in Lawndale, California. One of the traditions Ringling Bros. had was a parade from the circus train to the Forum. The one tradition however that they long ago gave up was performing under a real live tent in the middle of a cow pasture or a baseball field. Didn't know tents were alive did you? Well we can all watch as the Culpepper-Merriweather Circus unpacks their tent out of a truck, brings it out on the field at Driftwood and raises it in all its glory.

The circus will perform on Saturday whether it rains or shines although most of us vote for a pleasant balmy sunny Saturday. Tickets are still available at six area locations through Friday afternoon at advance sale prices. On Saturday tickets will be sold at the gate at higher cost than advance tickets.

For those people arriving early for either of the two performances there will be pony rides for the kids, elephant rides (maybe), an inflatable trampoline, cotton candy, popcorn, and other circus food. People attending the shows in Port Orford who can't get enough of the great tradition of the traveling circus can follow it to

Bandon where they have two performances scheduled on Sunday afternoon.

Several people in Port Orford have put in a lot of effort on behalf of bringing this circus to Port Orford. Chief among them is Al Affonso, vice president of the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce. It would be hard to list all the work Al has done in preparing the way for the circus since he's done so much. We'll nominate him as the honorary ringmaster for Saturday's performances. We also hear he'll be riding the elephant on Saturday. Thanks also to Al Luis of Sentry Market for heralding the circus on the big sign bordering the highway.

Step right up folks, the fun is about to begin!

Hard Decisions

article provided by Fair Board

Members of the Curry County Fair board made some hard decisions to balance the proposed 1993-94 budget at their May 13 meeting. These actions were taken as a result of the County's vote not to fund \$50,000 requested by the Fairgrounds. The Curry County Fair Grounds is not a mandated service for the County. The Curry County Commissioners and three lay members of the budget committee voted 4 to 2 not to fund the fair's request. In addition to the \$50,000 shortfall, the fair needs \$125,000 in unbudgeted deferred maintenance to buildings.

After much discussion the board decided to eliminate the manager's position and realign staff, effective June 30, 1993. The Fairgrounds currently employs a manager, secretary, maintenance coordina-

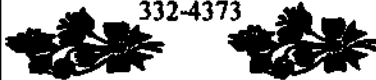

To All Our Recycling Customers

Please be advised that as of May 15, 1993, the following changes will be made in the area recycling program due to significant market conditions.

1. **Magazines:** As of May 15th, Curry Transfer & Recycling, Inc. will be pleased to accept old magazines as part of the recycling program. Magazines and catalogues with "slick" pages will be accepted. Please do not include phone books, paperbacks and non slick catalogues with your magazine recyclables, as they are considered contaminants.

2. **Plastics:** In order to make room for magazines and due to loss of market, plastic recycling will be limited to #2 HDPE clear milk jugs commencing May 15th. Other grades of plastic, including colored #2 HDPE (detergent containers, for example) cannot be picked up or accepted at area Recycling Depots until further notice. Please remember to properly prepare milk jugs by rinsing out and removing lids. In order to save space, you may also flatten the milk jugs as well.

The above changes will apply to both curbside and Recycling Depot services.
