This Friday, June 4, is a special day for students in our school district. The senior class of Pacific High School graduates on Friday evening at 8:00pm. The ceremony will be held in the school gymnasium.

This senior class is composed of 25 students. These fine young people are going in many directions after their graduation. I spoke with Tim Flake, a teacher and counselor at Pacific High School about this class, being curious about what they planned to do with themselves. He told me that four of them are going to join the workforce, two of them are going into the military including one in the navy, and nineteen are going to college. We have one student going to the Oregon Institute of Technology, one to Willamette University, three to Southern Oregon State College and others going on to SWOCC, Lane Community College, Skelton Beauty College, Basset Art Institute, Walla Walla University and University of Portland. Tim teaches a careers class which is mandatory for all junior class members. It's designed to get the students thinking about the kind of work careers they're interested in, and how to achieve their goals.

The students have been at Pacific for four years and they deserve a hearty congratulation for completing their high school education, many with scholastic and athletic honors. Now a whole new and big

world beckons just like it did for all of us old codgers who graduated in the pre-Personal Computer Era. Actually when I graduated from high school in the tumultuous year of 1968 we didn't even have calculators and no one had a car phone or beeper. Album rock had replaced singles and no one envisioned the explosion in electronic gadgetry.

Later on that evening the seniors celebrate the successful completion of their high school education under the auspices of Project Graduation. The traditional alcohol and drug free party which lasts all night concludes with breakfast the following morning at Driftwood Elementary School. The Project Graduation committee through its various fundraising efforts ends up with a rather impressive group of gifts for the graduating seniors.

The eighth grade class at Blanco Junior High School graduation takes place at the Blanco Awards Assembly which will be held on Thursday morning, June 10, bright and early, at 8:30am. Put the coffee pot on automatic pilot. This is also the last day of this school year. Now if the rain ever tapers, it will be easier to believe that summer vacation is upon us.

I was listening to the radio the other day and the announcer mentioned that this week is **International Volunteers Week**. This would be a good place to remember one of the Port Orford area's most tireless and dedicated volunteers. Charlotte Johnson died last Thursday, May 27. She

was the long term president of the **Common Good** and an active member of **Friends of the Library** besides being a wife and mother. Charlotte could be found all day on Wednesdays at the Common Good building helping with distribution of food and handling applicants for food baskets, clothing and other forms of help. She knew and understood the needs of the people seeking help at the Common Good. The last time I saw her she had come over to our store to return a video someone had inadvertently left off at the Good. She had called us to tell us they had it over there but before one of us could drive over, there she was at the store. Both the library and the Common Good, along with her family and numerous friends will miss her tremendously. She left a legacy of dedicated voluntary service to this community. I appreciate what she did for all of us.

This article is about transitions and there is one more that is on my mind. While I was away last week my friends Paul and Pat Lee, owners of the Silver Door Restaurant, had a going out of business sale. I knew the restaurant had been in the process of being sold and even before I left, had witnessed many changes to their small building. Down went the signs and on went a coat of white paint. 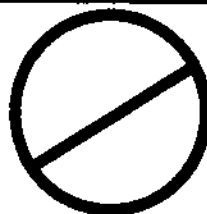
