Bad Fruit Year by Evan Kramer

One of the most popular activities in Port Orford is gardening. This summer has been a horse(radish) of another color out in the vegetable patches and orchards around the area. The three apple trees in my yard have a total of no apples on them this year.

Mirleen O'Hearn, who sells trees and nursery starts, told me the ash storm we had earlier in the year killed some of the cherry trees.

Ray Johnson said his apple trees had no fruit on them this year and his pear trees have only a few pears. He told me the bandtail pigeons were having a field day with his blueberry plants instead of the berries on the madrone trees.

Paul Lee and Rick Hazard both referred to this as a bad year for fruit.

Meivin Sutton of Elephant Rock Farm told me his apple trees had no fruit but plenty of mold on them.

Jim Britell dismissed this as an area to grow fruit with stones in it and said to stick with proven winners like potatos, peas, lettuce and chard.

Speculation about why this is so, centers on the amount of rain we had this year including a wet April and May. Trees that did blossom saw these blossoms washed off by the rain. Other theories

center on a lack of bees due to the wet weather.

Some plants seem to be doing just fine this year. The wild blackberries in our yard look to be a bumper crop. Just yesterday Valerie and I found a couple of ripe ones already.

This year I put in several grape vines which have taken but it'll be at least next year before we find out if they'll have any grapes or not. Yesterday I put in some squash and basil starts which I was given by Bob and Ellen Warring. So, I thought, why not turn over a new leaf and plant them right away. On some other occasions when I've bought or been given starts I've waited too long to plant them. Anyway, I went out in the garden area with a shovel and started digging holes. This was ground that a month ago was saturated with water. Now, after over a month without rain and days of wind the same earth seemed bereft of water and

not nearly as easy to dig up. After mixing the turned soil with a secret concoction I get out of my chicken coop consisting of disproportionate amounts of chicken feed, chicken manure and composted plant matter. I planted the Johnson and zucchini squash and the basil plants. I had two interested onlookers the whole time. One was of course Myrtle, our Black Labrador puppy for life and the other was a cat named Feitsheins who must be part dog. Feitsheins does one thing no other cat has done and that's follow along when I go walking in the neighborhood. And not just to the next house over. One walk was a good half mile or more and she followed the whole way. Yesterday when we took a walk after planting. I heard the most pitiful meowing and knew all was not well. Finally I spotted her high up in a tree and unwilling to come down. Fortunately she jumped into an-

There is an excellent yoga class offered by S.W.O.C.C. and taught by Debbie Lohry here in Port Orford. Yoga is so basic it can become part of your everyday routine, even if you're a busy person (the busier you are the more you need it).

I have lower back pain, so before I get up in the morning I lay on my back and pull my knees up to my chest, clasp my arms around my knees and relax. Then, after

a minute or so, I let my knees fail to one side, then back to the middle, then to the other side. Try it! It helps a lot.

Mama's Tips

Hooray for the summer! Now that it has finally arrived, Mamma's right in the spirit, dragging out the old barbecue sauce recipe from last summer. She adds a tablespoon or two of lemon juice to her sauces and marinades. The acid in the juice "intensifies" the flavor by "tysing" (the chemical word for "loosening" or "cutting open") the little flavor packets in the oils and spices, and cuts down on the amount of salt required at the same time. Recall

On Friday, June 25th, a petition for the recall of five (5) Port Orford/Langlois School District 2CJ board members was filed. In a remarkably short time, many more signatures than required were obtained from irate voters living in the school district. The signatures were turned in to Renee Kolen, County Clerk, on Thursday, July 8th. An election should be held soon to effect the recall.

The issues that most of the people were concerned about were renewing of Superintendent Wold's 4 year contract a year before his present contract would expire, the extremely low morale of both classified and non-classified personnel, the expensive reopening of a condemned school building (4 separate campuses for 530 students) and the lack of challenge for the Port Orford/Langlois students.

The above article was submitted by the Committee for Recall of 2CJ School Board.

The Committee for Recall turned in petitions with 300 signatures on them. These signatures were collected in a two week period. The necessary 205 valid signatures were verified by the County Clerk's office on Friday, July 9. The five school board members now facing a recall election are Larry Blount, Merrilyn Cuthbert, Marrilyn Haga, Mike Knapp and Don Smith. They had five days from Friday, July 9, to either resign from their position

or notify the County Clerk they would face the recall election. They are entitled to a 200 word or less rebuttal to the charges brought against them by the recall committee. Such a statement was submitted for all five members so the matter will go to a vote. County clerk Renee Kolen said vote-by-mail ballots should be delivered by Saturday, July 31. Ballots must be mailed or returned to the Elections Division by 8:00pm Tuesday, August 17. The results of the election will be available later that evening.

If some members, but not all, are recalled leaving a quorum of 4 members, these remaining members would pick the new school board members. If either 4 or 5 of the school board members are recalled, leaving less than a quorum, the seven member elected board of the Curry Education Service Department will choose replacements. Any members of the school board appointed to replace recalled members would serve a term of office through June 30, 1994 when they would be replaced by permanent members chosen in the Spring '94 election.

The cost of the school board recall election is paid for by the 2CJ School District and estimated at about \$3,000.




