Races A Big Success by Evan Kramer

This past weekend's Port Orford Grand Prix was by nearly all accounts a big success. 150 racers, their crews, and assorted family and friends descended on Cape Blanco State Airport for two days of racing. Practice and qualifying runs started Saturday and continued Sunday morning with the trophy races on Sunday afternoon ending around 5:30m in the evening. The weather was even in a good mood, with only mild winds, no rain, and plenty of sunshine. Team Continental and the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce had been busy at work getting the airport transformed into a race track, which was no minor job. Tires had to be brought down from Portland, holes drilled in them and then banded together, concrete barriers had to be placed in strategic locations, an access road had to be opened up into the pit area, bleachers had to be set and concession stands were brought in to feed the hungry crowds.

The races were jointly sponsored by the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce and Team Continental of Portland. This was the first time the airport had been used for this style of racing and the Chamber came through with flying colors. President Janelle Haller, Vice President Al Affonso, and race committee members Frank Smith, Dean Madison, Jim Campbell, John Ineson and Viola Cuatt contributed a lot of their time to the

smooth running of the event. There are many others who helped but we'll let the Chamber say something on their behalf.

I spent some time at the races on Saturday and all day Sunday in the pit area. I was impressed by the care and effort the race drivers put into their cars. These people are serious hobbyists as Team Continental races are for points and trophies rather than cash prizes. One owner of a 1960's Datsun roadster, Dennis Peters, told me he had nearly \$40,000 invested in his car.

The final race of the day featured special racing cars using motorcycle engines including a crowd pleaser driven by John Berger. The custom fiberglass body of his car rested about two inches above the ground.

The race car drivers and crews couldn't say enough positive things about the race track and the assistance from all the local volunteers in setting up and putting on these races. Their attitude as they were departing on Sunday evening was to leave the airport in as good a condition as possible. They even had people walking along the track picking up cigarette butts and on Monday walked the length of Airport Road picking up any trash along the road or in the ditches.

The members of Team Continental look forward to racing again next year at Cape Blanco State Airport.

Bits and pieces department - Tuesday was a great day for whale watching at

Battle Rock Park. We saw at least two grey whales clearly visible without binoculars from the park. Between their spouting and continual diving and surfacing they're an interesting animal to watch. (Just received word at press time that four more whales were sighted playing off Agate Beach. Most of the whales seen off our coast are Gray Whales though we just heard that a couple Killer Whales have recently been seen.)

Last week I mentioned having a cafe latte while sitting in the sunflower garden at Gwendolyn's Bed and Breakfast. I guess I inadvertently created the impression lattes are available at Gwendolyn's, which they definitely are not. I did get the fine cafe latte a few blocks up the street at Swinney's Espresso, where you can also get Italian sodas and other treats.

Unless you've been visiting another planet you've heard and read plenty about the current recall election of five members of the 2CJ school district. The election is quickly drawing to the finish. Those people who received their ballot and haven't sent it back have until Tuesday at 8:00pm, August 17, to get their ballot to the elections department at the Gold Beach courthouse. They'll start tabulating sometime during the day on Tuesday and have the first unofficial results available right after 8:00pm. Shannon at the elections division said that as of Tuesday, August 10, 52% of the ballots had either been mailed or handed in.

Hydroplane Races in Gold Beach

The Gold Beach River Racing Association is co-sponsoring with the community of Gold Beach, the third annual hydroplane races on the fabulous Rogue River. Between 15 to 20 sleek hydroplanes are slated to compete, racing at dramatic speeds in excess of 75 miles an hour in head to head competition.

Racing will start on Sunday, August 15 at 1:00pm at Huntly Park on the south bank of the Rogue River, approximately 7 miles up river from Highway 101. Racing will start and finish at Huntly Park location, with awards immediately following the race (approximately 2:00pm).

Racing may be viewed from the west boundary of the race at the old Champion mill site, to the eastern boundary at the Lobster Creek bridge.

Racers will earn points as part of the Cal/Or River Racing Association's full racing circuit. In addition to the points they might earn, this race represents good old fun for participants and viewing enjoyment for the spectators.

A pre-race calcutta will be held Saturday night at the Rod'N'Reel restaurant, on the north bank of the river, across from Jot's, starting at 9:00pm.

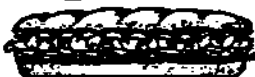

Coos County Fair and Rodeo Gets Underway

The 1993 edition of the Coos County Fair gets off to a fun filled start on Wednesday, August 11, and runs through Sunday, August 15. The Fairgrounds are located in Myrtle Point.

The Fair theme this year is *Wagon Wheels and Ferris Wheels*, a salute to the Oregon Trail and the anniversary of the Ferris Wheel.

The Ferris Wheel was invented by George Ferris for the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago. His wheel was 250 feet high and 2,000 people could ride on it at the same time.

Admission to the Fair is \$6.00 for adults, \$3.00 for children 6-12 and under 6 free when accompanied by an adult. Special price days are Friday when seniors can gain admission for \$3.00 and Sunday-Family Day when adults get in for \$4.00 and children for \$2.00. Admission to the rodeo on Friday and Saturday evening is free although there are reserved box seats available for \$7.00.

Some of the other entertainment scheduled this year includes the Dom J. Moyers Reptile Safari featuring an Asiatic cobra, an alligator, monitor lizard and other reptiles, The Kingsmen - remember the perennial hit *Louie Louie*, Billy's Brass Band and Ethan Allen King.

The Fairgrounds are located adjacent to Myrtle Point High School on 4th Street. All in all a worthwhile way to enjoy several hours amongst the livestock, floral and horticulture displays, commercial exhibits and of course the midway.

Bed Tax Committee Meets

The City of Port Orford's bed tax committee meets Thursday evening, August 12, at 7:00pm in the city hall council chambers. Approximately \$25,000 is available for use by non profit groups for the promotion and development of tourism.

Blue Water Harvesters Cooperative

Blue Water Harvesters Cooperative, formed by Oregon commercial fishermen engaged in the harvest of sea urchin began operations on June 1, 1993. The Cooperative's offices are located at Premium Pacific Seafoods plant in Port Orford. Negotiations on the sale of Premium Pacific Seafoods, Inc., a sea urchin processing plant employing 65 persons in Curry County have been tentatively reached. Blue Water Harvesters Cooperative took over plant operations on July 1, 1993.

Michael Ricks has been hired as President and General Manager of Blue Water

Harvesters and Premium Pacific Seafoods. Mr. Ricks brings his years of experience in the processing of sea urchin as well as his ability to speak Japanese. This cooperative was formed for the purpose of stabilizing an Oregon presence on the Japanese markets. While the quality of Oregon sea urchin, or uni as it is called by the Japanese is very high, Oregon product is often split up by out of state buyers that market it from their own processing plants. Over 99 percent of the uni processed by the cooperative is directly marketed to Japan.

School Registration
