Gas And Oil By Evan Kramer

The big news along Highway 101 is the new look at the two Port Orford gas stations. The Union 76 big orange revolving golf ball was carted away as the station became a Texaco dealer. We can all stop waiting for another winter storm to implode the other side of their bright orange sign. A couple of days later, on Friday morning, the recently closed BP station was smashed to the ground in a couple of hours. The tanks were dug up and then cut into smaller pieces. The metal remnants of the station were trucked off to the transfer station while the rest was consumed in a ball of flame.

Meanwhile down on the street corner speculation built about what kind of new BP station would replace the old rusted one. I was told among other things it would include a new 24 hour mini mart and that it would have a self-served car wash. Neither of which is true according to the owner of station, Lane Colvin, of the Colvin Oil Company. He did surprise me with his explanation of what it would be like if it is rebuilt. If it is rebuilt, it will be a simple block-long station with a canopy, small office and restroom similar to the ones in Coos Bay and Bandon. The problem is the company wants two driveways into and out of the station on Highway 101. The Oregon Department of Transportation is only interested in granting them one highway driveway access. It seems that the long range plans of ODOT are to eliminate highway access to business and have cars enter them from the side streets. Highway 101 in Port Orford is 6 lanes wide including four lanes of traffic and two for parking. Traffic travels at the speed limit of 30mph when it is obeyed. It doesn't seem like a major problem for a car, truck or recreational vehicle to enter a filling station from 101. One goal the city has is to have ODOT install a pedestrian accuated traffic signal at 12th and 101.

The City of Port Orford and city manager Dean Madison have thoughtfully been working on behalf of Colvin Oil and have contacted ODOT concerning the station getting two driveways. In the meantime there is one station left in Port Orford in a town that once boasted 8 or 9. We'll leave it to one of the old timers to tell us

how many operating stations there were in the heyday of gas and oil. All I know is that every fourth building used to be a gas station.

Happy birthday to Ray Iida who was born a mere 60 years ago on August 26. His wife Joyce and other family members threw him a wonderful surprise birthday party last Saturday at the senior center in Port Orford. I was fortunate enough to be invited to this Hawaiian themed party even though I got there toward the tail end. Ray's son and three daughters were there with their children and many other family members including a cousin Ray hadn't seen for many years. The highlight for me was a short video that Ray's daughter Janis had made using some 60 photos of Ray and various family members over the years.




Descendent to Speak

Robert Kentta, of Shasta decent and a member of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz, will speak in Port Orford on the indigenous people of southwest Oregontheir cultural heritage and their survival into present times. He will explain their world view and describe ceremonies such as the Feather Dance and the First Salmon Ceremony.

Kentia, Who has researched treaties for the Siltz Tribal Government, will discuss the process by which Euroamericans took possession of the land of southwest Oregon. This process lead to the removal of the indigenous people to a coast reservation. Early reservation life was very difficult as the people's culture and tribal structure was suppressed, and the US Government's promises of treaty payments were not fulfilled. But, through it all the people now united as the Confederated Tribes of Siletz survived.

Kentta's presentation is sponsored by the Port Orford Arts Council as part of their lecture series on Native American issues. He will speak Saturday, August 28 at 7:00pm in the Port Orford City Council Chambers. Everyone is invited to attend and learn more about the area's Native American heritage.
