Labor Day Weekend by Evan Kramer

What does Labor Day weekend mean to Well since you're not here to answer that question I'll fill in some of the blanks. 

Winter Garden by Sandy Eisman

Just because fall is coming, it doesn't mean the end of garden delights. Since we live in a fairly moderate climate we can still enjoy beets, spinach, lettuce, chard, brussel sprouts, cabbage, carrots, radishes, kale, etc. throughout the winter.

You may say that your garden is already full, but you can probably take out some old bean and squash plants that have finished production to start the root crops and lettuce. They do better when seeds are sown directly in the soil. The other seeds can be started in small pots or flats so they are ready to replace the summer veggies which grow into fall.

The secret of a winter garden is that crops are meant to be harvested not planted in winter. Start your seeds from now until the end of September. Plants don't grow much in winter so they must be started when there are still some sunny days to give a good start.

Watch how parts of your garden are shaded differently in winter as the sun moves toward the south. Put your plants where they'll get as much sun as possible. A good spot is on the south side of a building or wall which will reflect warmth. Plant taller plants like broccoli and chard to the north of shorter plants such as lettuce and carrots.

Plant a row of each variety now and another row in a couple of weeks to extend harvest.

Prepare the soil just like you do in spring, with compost mixed into soil and a balanced fertilizer. Do not use too much nitrogen as this will cause too much fast tender growth that makes plants susceptible to frost damage.

Choose plant varieties labeled "hardy". They can handle more rain and cold than regular varieties.

So get out your packages of seeds and get your winter garden started!
