Langlois Fair
Saturday, Sept. 11

The Langlois Community Fair by Tobe Porter

The Langlois Community Fair came about after two Langlois families had a garage sale and thought what a good idea it would be to have a community garage sale so more people could be involved and benefit.

Next year, the first official fair held 5 years ago was a very successful community garage sale held in the Currydale Farms barn. Blackberry cobbler was made and sold by volunteers to earn start up money for the next year's get together.

It was during the second year that the free lamb barbecue started. That year, about 400-500 plates were served, growing by about 200 a year since then. Last year almost 1,000 people were served and this year members of the Fair Committee and other volunteers are meeting on Friday morning to chop enough cabbage to make coleslaw for over 1,000 hungry folks.

The reasons for the fair have not changed over the years, according to Pam Manning, one of the founding people and head of the Fair Committee this year. Even the first year the idea was to promote ways for people to come together to have fun, provide a big selection of things to buy whether it be fresh produce or antique linens and allow individuals and groups to make more money. This is a good opportunity for a non-profit group to become involved and raise funds.

It's the people behind the scenes that make it all happen and make it a success. Many members of the Langlois community contribute time, talent, energy, and goods. The meat is donated by many people as well as the zillions of heads of cabbage and let's not even talk about all that volunteer slaw chopping (guess what I'm going to be doing Friday morning?)

This year all the booth space has been sold. New this year is the pit cooked pork barbecue that will be enticing people toward the free barbecue food line located just north of the Langlois Market. There will also be 4-H horse games that will begin about 1:30pm.

The Langlois Public Library, in addition to their annual book sale, will have an interesting bunch of items to raffle. For a \$1.00 donation you could have 5 chances to win breakfast for 4 at the Greasy Spoon Cafe; lunch for 2 at the Langlois Market, \$20 gift certificate from Sweet Memories Antiques, 6 gourmet lamb chops from Currydale Farms; \$20 gift certificate from Mercedes collection; or 3 bales of grass hay from B & B Farm Supply.

A big hit last year, and back this year, is the 10K run and the 2 mile run/walk. Both events begin at the Langlois Lions Club at 4:00pm. You'll have time to enjoy the free barbecue lamb or pork, listen to the Old Time Fiddler's play, stroll past the many booths of local produce, collectibles, antiques, delectable

desserts and cool drinks. Stop by the library book sale and then pre-register for these two enjoyable athletic events.

And to completely round out the day plan to come to the Langlois Lion's Club and for a modest price enjoy a turkey dinner with all the trimmings. If you want to you can arrive in Langlois at 9:00am, leave after dinner at the Lion's Club and in between have some absolutely great fun.

What else could he use?

During the invasion of Sicily in World War II, General George Patton was preparing to take the city of Palermo. Expecting rain, he ordered copies of the New York "Times" placed beneath the tailgates of the troop transports so the men could keep their feet dry.

His staff was mystified. Why the "Times"? Why not the "New York Daily News" or the "Paris Match"? Patton was adamant; and one did not argue with the General. As five tons of old copies of the "Times" were being loaded, the General issued one of his greatest quotes to the assembled war correspondents: "These are the 'Times' that dry men's soles."

Native American's Sacred Sites

Ed Little Crow, a Native American traditionalist, will speak in Port Orford about the protection of sacred sites. Little Crow is a citizen of the Dakota Nation (also known as the Santee Sioux). Raised within his people's traditional culture, he considers English as a "borrowed" language.

Little Crow, who believes that Native Americans through their rites act as caretakers for the land, is a member of the Willamette Valley Sacred Sites Committee. He will describe the Committee's efforts to obtain protection for Native American sacred sites in Oregon.

The talk is sponsored by the Port Orford Arts Council. It will be held at 7:00pm on Saturday evening, September 11 in the Port Orford city hall council chambers.

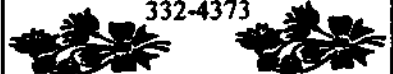

The area was also once renowned for its cheese factories including the Langlois Blue Star Cheese, the Denmark Cheese factory and the Cudahy Packing Company which produced the Meadow Grove Cheese.

The area was known as Dairyville until 1881 when the Postal Service requested the area change its name because of similarity in name to the town of Dayville. Langlois was the name of one of the first families in the area. In 1981 Langlois celebrated its Centennial and a book entitled Langlois 1881 - 1981 was published as part of the celebration. The above information and more is available in this book which is can be read at the Port Orford Library.
