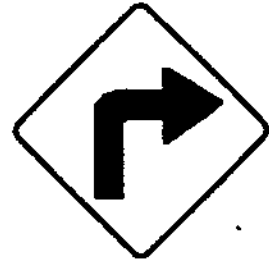

It's not easy to write about Port Orford when you haven't been here for a week. I did notice with interest as I drove north on Highway 101 through Brookings on my way back from Southern California that the new Fred Meyer store is under construction. An hour later while driving through Port Orford I saw to my surprise work has started on rebuilding the BP gas station. No thanks to ODOT.

Driving down to the San Fernando Valley was a good reminder how high the fire hazards are right now. North of Santa Rosa a large grass fire alongside the freeway squeezed drivers down to one lane backing up traffic for miles. To their credit the California Highway patrol kept the looky loos moving. Do you ever see another driver do something so ridiculous you wish there was a policeman around? Well here we're all idling in our cars and trucks. Along comes a car in the emergency parking lane against the center divider. Now he's moving at a fast rate of speed, throwing graveling and dirt up as he passes the rest of us. Well, there is justice in this world. At the point the two lanes became one he was pulled over to the side and being issued a ticket.

Going through the Santa Barbara - Ventura county areas you could see the smoke from the huge fire in the Los Padres National Forest. This fire which a few days ago was at 34,000 acres was

started by a young man's cigarette. Now that's going to be an expensive pack when he gets the bill. Let's see 3,000 firefighters, airplanes, bulldozers, etc...

The purpose of this trip to Woodland Hills was to divide up my mother's and father's possessions. She died in late May of this year and with my father having preceded her seven years ago it was now time to do something with their things. They were quite the readers and accumulated a lot of books over the years. It was easy to tell which were my father's since he signed and dated them. My sister and I had some very capable help from a couple of other relatives and a friend of my mothers so what could have been slow going and depressing turned into a pleasant social event. The main legacy my parents left was their three children. I know my mother enjoyed getting copies of this paper. The whole thing has been a window for friends and relatives into life in a small town.

But it seems inevitable the legislature would return to the voters with a proposal to raise the tax. A simple NO vote would be a good solution to this problem.....for the 9th time.

Many business owners wonder what it will take for them to increase business. After traveling 1,800 miles during the last week I've come to the conclusion it all depends on which side of the street or

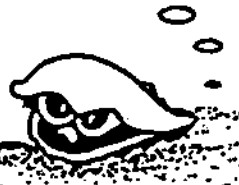

Modern Folklore

I recently participated (unknowingly) in spreading as fact a bit of modern folklore. I'd like to clear the record and, at the same time, show how modern legends come about.

Last week I defined a "Blue Moon" as the second full moon in a calendar month. I based that definition on an article in Sky and Telescope magazine. This week I read an interesting article by Philip Hiscock, of the Memorial University of Newfoundland Folklore and Language Archive, who took the trouble to research the history of the phrase "Blue Moon."

The oldest reference appears to be about 400 years old when someone wrote, "He would argue the moon was blue" (ie. something that would never be true.)

In 1883, the moon did turn blue. The volcano Krakatoa exploded and threw so much dust into the air, that the moon

appeared blue for nearly two years. It happened again in 1927 during a monsoon in India and in Newfoundland in 1951 as a result of a forest fire. By the 19th century the phrase, "Once in a blue moon" meant something that happened rarely and randomly.

"Blue moon" is also used, mainly in songs, as a symbol for sadness or loneliness.

Still in all of the astronomical, historical, or etymological references there was nothing about two full moons in a calendar month. Finally, by checking with the Trivial Pursuit company, he was led to a children's book, "Facts and Records" published in 1985. Where they got this

"fact" is unknown but they may have invented it to help establish copyright protection for their book.

The new definition is precise, and denotes a condition that happens about every 33 months on average with significant variations (There will be two blue moons in 1999) so has quickly become adopted as an "official" definition of blue moon. And that's how modern legends are born!

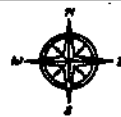

Tuesday, October 12: On Wednesday an hour before sunup the very thin crescent moon pulls nearly even with Venus. Look very low between E and ESE for the pair 80 apart. Binoculars will give you a striking view of faint earthshine framed by the sunlit crescent!

Wednesday, October 13: Tomorrow through Oct. 27, at about 1½ hours before sunrise, the sky will be dark and moonless - optimal conditions for viewing the Zodiacal Light from rural locations. This softly luminous glow tapering upward from the E horizon appears as dust in the plane of the solar system reflects sunlight back to Earth.

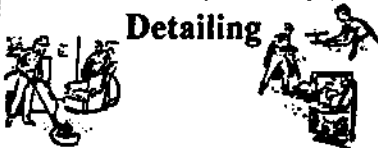

SKYWATCHER'S GUIDE

(Prepared by David Nette and Robert Victor at Abrams Planetarium, Michigan State University)

Saturday, October 9: Uranus and Neptune are within reach of binoculars as darkness falls, just over a degree apart in Sagittarius, and within 30° of the 3rd-magnitude star Pi. A detailed finder chart is needed to identify these planets of magnitude 6 and 8 respectively from the background stars. Late in the month, these planets will appear to pass each other for the third and final time this year, and not again until 2164-65.

Sunday, October 10: Before dawn tomorrow the waning crescent moon is high in the ESE, within the constellation Leo. The bluish first-magnitude star 90° to the moon's lower left is Regulus, the heart of the Lion. Regulus also marks the bottom star in the "Sickle", a backwards question mark of stars forming the Lion's head and mane.
