

#### Notice of Public Hearing

There will be a hearing in Gold Beach concerning the petition for extended area service by the Gold Beach telephone exchange. The hearing will be held on Thursday evening, October 21, at 7:00pm in Gold Beach at the Docia Sweet Hall, Curry County Fairgrounds.

The purpose of the hearing is to establish if there is a community of interest in the extended service calling area between Gold Beach and Brookings.

The Public Utility Commission of Oregon will conduct the hearing which is open to the public. Ray Johnson from Sixes has been heavily involved in this process for several years now. It involves the phone rates between the interconnected communities of the south coast. One problem for people living in this part of Oregon is not only the distance between the cities and towns but the long distance phone rates between the different area codes. Put simply it's expensive for both individuals and businesses and affects the way they handle their communications. Ever try calling the county 800 number?

An extended area service exists between Langlois and Bandon.

#### School Board Meeting

Here are the highlights of the regular monthly meeting of the Port Orford-Langlois 2CJ school board held on Tuesday, Oct. 12.

Superintendent Dick Wold and district architect Lon Samuels visited Driftwood Elementary School checking for fire safety and adequate access for the handicapped/disabled. They determined that some fire extinguishers should be replaced/relocated as soon as possible at a cost of about \$500. More extensive remodeling will be needed in the attic at an estimated cost of about \$11,000. This will be presented to the budget committee for the 1994-95 budget with work to be done during the summer of 1994. Some access changes are needed asap at a cost of \$5000 and more should be done next summer.

State Superintendent Norma Paulus replied to a complaint filed with the Dept. of Ed. by Joyce King and the Committee to Recall Members of 2CJ School Board. In her letter, Ms. Paulus states, "I have reviewed your letters of complaint, and cannot find a basis for the Department to intervene."

Pacific HS Principal, Michael Nickless reports that a new Drama class is being held and that a series of one-act plays are planned for the first quarter. New clubs this year are Choir and Debate. The Pacific HS band won first place at the Bandon Cranberry Festival for the second year in a row.

On Sept. 29th, the Curry County Sheriff drug detection dogs were on campus to test their abilities and to familiarize them with the campus. Both the dogs and the school received an "A" grade for the day. They successfully sniffed out all the drugs planted by the Sheriff and proved the school to be drug-free. Congratulations PHS!


#### School Board Meeting Continued

Although not budgeted for this year, the board agreed to find the money somehow and directed the superintendent to pursue the purchase.

Blanco Middle School Principal Phil Sword reported that they will receive a \$2,000 grant from the Curry Soil and Water Conservation District for an outdoor classroom. Science teacher Dan Leighton is developing a curriculum and has students setting up study plots and cleaning trails.

voted to accept a bid of \$52,336 for a 1993 Blue Bird 71 passenger bus. The tive-year transportation plan calls for no further bus purchases for the next two vears.

School enrollment is slightly below the state Dept. of Ed. projections. We had 514 enrolled on Oct. 4 vs a projection of 528. This translates to about \$120,000 difference in funding from the state untess enrollment increases. The shortfall is mostly at the high school level.

With PHS students now participating in Bandon football, the question was raised. "Why can't Bandon students join our soccer program?" Apparently the rules say that students from a smaller school can participate at a larger school, but students from the larger school can't participate in the smaller one. The superintendent will investigate and see if an exception can be made in our case.





#### SKYWATCHER'S GUIDE

(Prepared by David Nette and Robert Victor thanks to Abrams Planetarium at Michigan State University)

Thursday, October 21 - The moon, approaching First Quarter, is in the south at dusk tonight. Note the moon appears slightly less than half full. By the time the moon rises on Friday afternoon, it will be past First Quarter and therefore slightly more than half full.

Friday, October 22 - An hour after sundown the next three evenings, watch the waxing gibbous moon approach and pass the bright planet Saturn. At dusk tonight the moon, just over half full, is in the SE within the constellation Capricornus. Saturn is far to the moon's lower left.

Saturday, October 23 - Look in the SSE at dusk for the moon and bright Saturn just 7° apart. Look 22° to the lower left of the ringed planet for Fornalhaut. This first-magnitude star is sometimes called "The Solitary One" because it resides in a part of the sky lacking other bright stars.

Sunday, October 24 - At nightfall the moon has passed Saturn and appears in the SSE in the constellation Aquarius. Look for yellowish Saturn 10° to the moon's lower right. Uranus and Neptune now pass each other for the third time this year and will not appear as close

again until 2164-65! Use binoculars and a finder chart to locate these faint planets.

Monday, October 25 - Two days ago the Sun entered the astrological sign Scorpio, but against the star background it appears two zodiacal constellations to the west of Scorpius, in Virgo. Over the millennia since the origins of astrology, the Earth's precession, or "wobbling" motion of its rotational axis, has created a widening offset between the astrological signs and the constellations after which they are named.

Tuesday, October 26 - One hour after sundown look very low in NNE to NE for

a yellowish first-magnitude star. It is Capella in Auriga. From northern Michigan, Capella is circumpolar and never sets! Circumpolar stars "circle the pole" near Polaris, the North Star, and remain visible throughout the year.

Wednesday, October 27 - An hour after sundown the ringed planet Saturn is well up in the SSE. Since May, Saturn has retrograded, or moved west against the stars. Today Saturn ends this motion 10 N of the 3rd-magnitude star Deneb Algedi, the tail of the Seagoat. Keep watch in coming weeks.

State School Superintendent Norma Paulus has released her second annual "Oregon Report Card" reporting on the status of our school systems. Here are a few facts from her 100+ page booklet.

Schools spend about 80% of their budget on salaries and benefits

74% of senior level students graduated in 1992 and another 6% finished four years of school but lacked the requirements for graduation. 82% of Oregonians over 25 have a high school diploma compared with only 78.4% nationally.

Home schooling is effective. Of the 4,868 home schooled students tested for 1991-



#### **School System Report Card**

92, 72% tested at the 50th percentile or above and 22% tested at the 90th percentile or above. Only 5% tested below the 15th percentile. (If you test at the 50th percentile it means that as many public schooled students tested below you as tested above you. At the 90th percentile, 90% of public schoolers tested below you.)

Statewide school enrollment is growing by about 2.57% annually.

In the 1993 reading tests, 11% of 3rd graders, 16% of 5th graders, 18% of 8th graders and 17% of 11th graders did not have acceptable reading skills.

In mathematics unacceptable skill levels were found in 15% of 3rd graders, 21% of 5th graders, 17% of 8th graders, and a whopping 35% of 11th graders!

Many students do not prepare themselves to learn. More than 1/3 of secondary students skip breakfast 3 or more times per week. Nearly half skip lunch twice a week or more. 2/3 sleep 7 hours or less a night and 1/3 of 11th graders work 8 hours or more a week not counting weekends or vacations.

Oregon students rank highly compared to many other states but being the best of the bad is no great honor.
