the sales tax
Tuesday, Nov. 9**

One More Election by Evan Kramer

Next Tuesday, a week later than the rest of the United States, Oregon holds its own election. On November 9 voters will go to the polls and decide whether to approve or disapprove the first sales tax in state history. The polling places for the North Curry County area are as follows

Precinct #3 Langlois Fire Hall
Precinct #4 Sixes Grange Hall
Precinct #5 Port Orford City Hall
Precinct #6 P.O. Senior Citizen Center
Precinct #7 P.O. Senior Citizen Center

The polls are open from 7:00am - 8:00pm. Actually voting is well under way as many voters opted for sending in absentee ballots. Results of the election should be known soon after the polling places close at 8:00pm.

A nice place to be Tuesday afternoon was the Dock in Port Orford. The boats carrying the urchin divers were coming back from a day at sea hauling back their purple, spiny cargo. The wind was quiet, the sun was shining, it was a great day for fishermen or just lollygaggers down at the dock. A good day to take the hound for a walk along the sand. Meanwhile, the salmon season between Humbug Mountain and Cape Blanco continues until the end of November. There were some salmon at both of the two hoists. According to Merle the boats that were bringing them in were catching them in small numbers. One fisherman was

casting off from the jetty. I'm the first person in recent days who went down to either the dock or Battle Rock Beach and didn't see one of the whales of Port Orford.

I went home last night around 7:00pm. A little while later I turned on the television and, having been left on CNN, it came up with their current image. I saw wind-whipped fire storms devouring hillsides and homes. My first thought was that they were replaying scenes from last week's huge fires in Southern California. They weren't showing "reruns". It was two new and huge fires. One in Malibu which people familiar with that area know, is not a stranger to devastating fires and floods. I certainly experienced déjà vu.

Here in the Port Orford area a slash burn above Elk River Road flared up and past the fire line on Thursday afternoon onto property belonging to John Mayca. Crews

from Coos Forest Protective Association and Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department kept it contained to a small area. They were helped by the fact they weren't dealing with 50-60 mile per hour Santa Ana winds. The response time from Port Orford Fire Department was quick. The department now has the use of it's two rapid attack vehicles (RAV's) in fighting wildland fires in it's jurisdiction which includes a heck of a lot of timberland, gorse and houses set in a very rural surrounding.

If you saw the helicopter at last Thursday's Elk River fire it belonged to Menasha Corporation and was used to drop large amounts of water on the fire (and firefighters). It was a welcome relief to see it coming back from the river with another load of water.

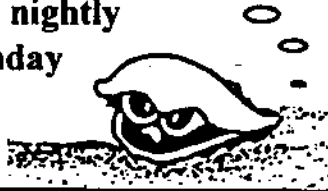

Tue. Nov. 9 - The current evening sky is graced by just a single naked-eye planet, Saturn. Well placed for viewing, Saturn reaches its high point in the S within two hours after sunset tonight, and in evening mid-twilight near month's end.

Wed. Nov. 10 - Thu. at dawn, Venus, Jupiter, and Spica are joined by the very thin crescent moon low in the ESE. Venus and Jupiter are still within 3° apart and are now separating, as Venus nears the Sun.

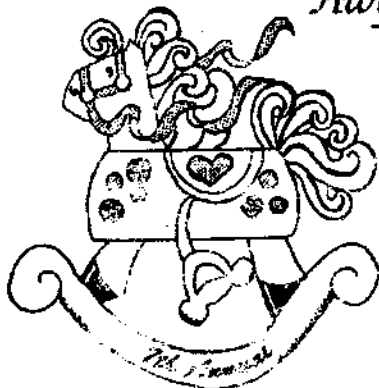

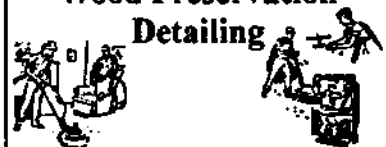
The next movie I want to see is "Sandlot" and then there's the new Disney movie "A Far Off Place," both rated PG also.

Skywatcher's Guide

Prepared by David Nette and Robert Victor thanks to Abrams Planetarium at Michigan State University.

Fri. Nov. 5 - An hour before sunrise Sat., brilliant Venus draws within $2\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ of bright Jupiter very low in the ESE. Bluish Spica is about $4\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ to Venus' upper right.

Sat. Nov. 6 - Sunday at dawn, the Last Quarter moon is high in the S with first-magnitude Regulus, the heart of Leo, 13° to its left. Very low in ESE, Venus-Jupiter form a brilliant pair only $1\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ apart. By Monday morning the waning crescent passes within 7° below Regulus,

while Venus and Jupiter pass each other only $\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ apart!

Sun. Nov. 7 - Rising in the ESE only a few minutes after dawn's first light Monday, dazzling Venus and bright Jupiter, only $\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ apart, form the year's brightest and closest planet pair! Spica is within 7° to their upper right.

Mon. Nov. 8 - At dawn Tue., Venus and Jupiter are still less than 1° apart very low in the ESE. Watch

Letter To The Editor

In the October 21 issue of Port Orford Today! you reported on a letter written by Norma Paulus, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. This letter was in response to numerous complaints from a number of individuals about School District 2CJ.

You gave a quote from the letter saying that the department "cannot find a basis for the department to intervene."

Your selective editing and lifting one line from the letter, out of context, completely altered the intent and meaning of Supt. Paulus' letter.

The letter in its entirety reads:

Dear Ms. King,

I have reviewed your letters of complaint, and cannot find a basis for the Department to intervene.

Renewing, extending, or not renewing a superintendent's employment contract rest squarely with the district's elected board of directors. There is no authority for me to substitute my judgment for that of your local board in this matter. Accordingly, I am returning the letters to you.

Your only other option would be to submit a complaint to the Teacher's Standards and Practices Commission, which I understand you have already done.

I'm sorry we cannot be of assistance in helping resolve this matter.

I'm afraid I do not see where my quote from Ms Paulus' letter substantially altered its meaning but we'll let the public judge for itself. Thank you for your interest.

The next meeting of the 2CJ school board will be Tuesday, Nov. 9th in the Pacific High School library. All are welcome to attend. The board is also seeking two community members to serve on the budget committee.

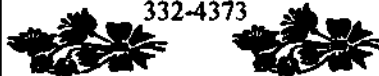
