Water Supply Threatened **By Evan Kramer**

The City of Port Orford's reservoir is in danger of being lost as the main supply of the city's water. The reservoir is located on Hubbard Creek. During the month of September logging roads and other excavation work including installation of two culverts was done on property owned by Earnest Bussman creating a serious runoff problem. The last appreciable rain fell in Port Orford on October 15 dropping half an inch of rain. This increased the turbidity level in the reservoir water to a rating over 4 which is unusable for drinking water. The water turned grayish brown. The City keeps a daily record of the turbidity and rainfall at the Hubbard Creek reservoir.

If the reservoir water becomes undrinkable the city will switch its water source to Garrison Lake. During the time it takes to start using Garrison Lake water the city will rely on its one million gallon reservoir located on Coast Guard Hill. Water use lately has been in the range of 170,000 to 200,000 gallons a day. A pipe will be run out along the Pinchurst floating dock and water taken out at a point just beyond the end of the dock. This will cause closure of this fishing dock to the public as a chain link fence will be erected to keep people out of the area. The water from the lake will be pumped to the city's water treatment plant adjacent to Buffington Park for

treatment. A slightly different batch of chemicals will be used to treat the lake water as opposed to the reservoir water. City residents may notice something of an odor when drinking this water. Gehrke and Madison are confident that after the water leaves the treatment plant it will be safe to drink. Many residents are concerned because Garrison Lake is where the city's treated waste water is dumped. The lake also has an algae problem and is home to a literal underwater forest of weeds.

Only time will tell what's going to happen. The consensus of opinion from the city officials is a rain of a couple of inches will almost certainly increase the turbidity level in the reservoir water to unusable proportions. The city is also faced with potential major silting in of the reservoir leading to a need for it to be dredged out.

According to a Saturday, November 6 story by John Griffith which ran in the Oregonian the Oregon Department of Forestry has issued two citations to Bussman to correct some of the situations on his property by November 15. I put in a call to Ron Fox at the Oregon Department of Forestry to ask him about compliance and enforcement of the citations but he was out of town until later this week. No one else in the office knew about the situation.

HGE Inc. of Coos Bay, the city's engineering firm has sent a three page letter to City Manager Dean Madison

outlining the problems facing the reservoir and the mitigating factors that need to be done on the Bussman property. They believe that unless their recommendations are followed "there would be little chance that Port Orford could use Hubbard Creek for its municipal water source this winter".

This issue will be discussed at the City Council's next meeting on Monday, Nov. 15 at 7:00pm in Port Orford's City Hall building. This meeting is open to the public.

Sales Tax Defeated

Voters in Oregon went to their polling places Tuesday and overwhelmingly defeated Measure 1, the sales tax initiative.

Voters rejected the measure statewide by a 3 to 1 margin. Curry County voters defeated the measure by an even greater amount than the rest of the state with 82% of the voters saying no.

This is the ninth time in this century that Oregon voters have rejected a sales tax at the polls.

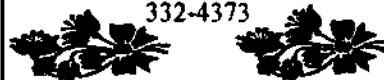

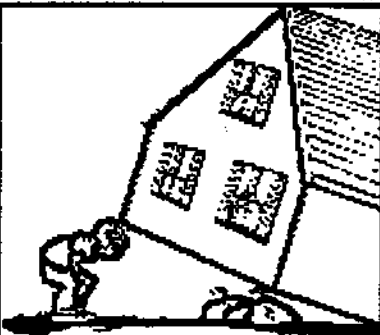

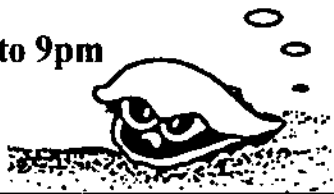

Skywatcher's Guide Continued

Sat. Nov. 13 - At dawn Sun., look very low in the ESE as 0.7-magnitude Mercury ascends past Venus. These two inner members of our solar system pass only $\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ apart and seem to be heading in opposite directions as they orbit the Sun. That's because Venus is now on the far side of the Sun, and Mercury on the near side.

Sun. Nov. 14 - An hour after sunset look for yellowish Saturn in the S. Saturn is now 90° from the Sun, as seen from Earth, giving observers with telescopes a good look at Saturn's shadow cast upon its rings. At such times, Saturn displays a striking three-dimensional appearance. When Saturn was 180° from the Sun in August, its shadow was hidden behind the planet.

Mon. Nov. 15 - At dusk the young moon, just under 50 hours old for Michigan viewers, is very low in the SW and approaching the Teapot asterism in Sagittarius. The moon travels roughly 13° eastward against the stars each day. Where will it appear Tue. evening? The Moon will wax, or grow more full daily until the night of Sun. Nov. 28, when a very special event will take place -- a total lunar eclipse!

Tue. Nov. 16 - In Wed.'s predawn darkness hours the Leonid meteor shower, enhanced by a dark, moonless sky, should reach its annual peak of activity. From dark sites, some 15 meteors per hour, if their tracks are extended backward, may radiate from the Sickle of Leo the Lion. Leonid meteoroids enter Earth's atmosphere at speeds exceeding 150,000 miles per hour, faster than those of any other major shower. In 1998 or 1999, this stream may produce a spectacular meteor storm, as it did in 1966.

Wed. Nov. 17 - At dawn for the next five mornings, zero-magnitude Mercury is nearly halfway between brilliant Venus and Jupiter very low in the ESE. Look for Spica, the "ear of wheat" in the hand of Virgo, 9° to Jupiter's upper right.

Thu. Nov. 18 - For several nights around Nov. 20 each year, the Seven Sisters or Pleiades star cluster is up all night. Look for the Pleiades low in ENE as evening darkness descends, high in S in the middle of the night, and low in WNW at dawn's first light. Binoculars give a superb view of this compact dipper-shaped group.

An Appeal For Help

This is an appeal for help. You knew my sister, Glenna Smith. You cared about her and shared our grief when she was killed last June. What you may not know is that Detective Allen Boice has closed the case and the official investigation is at an end. He feels there's nothing else to do. I disagree. Strongly. Boice said the case could be reopened if anything else came up. In the meantime, he says it's okay if I pursue the matter myself. At present, I find myself trying to cover what I feel he should have already done, my theory being that an untrained, inept investigation is better than none at all.

You should be aware that the work done by officers and medical people at the scene was thorough and careful. Between that and the autopsy it was determined that there was no reason, either in Glenna's physical condition or that of the car, to suddenly swerve off the road. That narrows it down to an outside agency as cause of the accident.

There's a small chance it could have been a dog or a deer. Other leads gathered seem to indicate a better than good chance that another vehicle was the cause. Specifically a 70's Chevrolet Nova, ranging from faded blue to green, with a loud muffler. There are a few of those around and there hasn't been enough effort to locate all of them.

Some of you may have turned in information at the time and assumed it

confidentiality will be respected but if you wish to pass on information anonymously, Valerie and Evan Kramer, at the Downtown Fun Zone, have kindly agreed that such a person can slip an envelope in their video drop box and they will collect it for me.

Glenna deserved our best efforts. So do all of you. Keep in mind that there may be somebody out there who killed one of us and it could happen again. I already know there are kind and caring people in this community and maybe, with your help, we can resolve this. If we can't, at least we'll know we gave it our best shot. Thank You.

Skywatcher's Guide

Prepared by David Nette and Robert Victor thanks to Abrams Planetarium at Michigan State University.

Thu. Nov. 11 - An hour before sunrise on Fri., the old moon is very low in the ESE with brilliant Venus within 6° to its left. Bright Jupiter is 4° to Venus' upper right, and Spica another 7° to Jupiter's upper right. Binoculars might show elusive Mercury, now of magnitude +1.4, rising 3° to Venus' lower left. The moon, three planets, and a 1st-magnitude star all within 14°!

Fri. Nov. 12 - Keep watch these mornings for Mercury, now at first magnitude, very

low in the ESE. Getting higher daily and brightening rapidly, Mercury should now be visible to the unaided eye. On Sat. it's within 1½° to Venus' lower left, and on Sun. just ¼° to Venus' upper left. For the rest of the month, this elusive planet gives its best showing of the year, conveniently located between Venus and Jupiter, the two brightest planets!

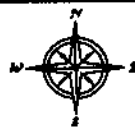

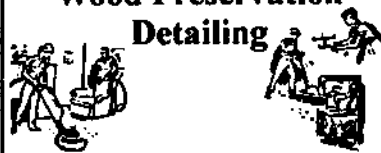

Mamma's Tips

If your jack-o-lantern has not turned bad, Mamma suggests you make fresh pumpkin pie for Thanksgiving. Pumpkin didn't always come out of a can, you know. Simply microwave wedges or squares of washed pumpkin for about 10 min. on high, or until soft. When cooled, remove rind with a paring knife. Re-cook either in microwave until quite soft, then put through food processor until mashed well. Strain through a screen-type colander if you wish. Freeze mash in ziplock bags until ready to make pie. Use as you would the canned stuff, but homemade will taste much fresher.
