Having slots of fun Wish you were here

Dateline Las Vegas

Valerie and 1 are attending the Comdex computer convention in Las Vegas. According to an article in the Sunday edition of the Las Vegas Sun-Review, 170,000 people are expected to attend the convention spread out over 2.2 million square feet of exhibition space.

On our automobile trip to Las Vegas we encountered snow flurries when we arrived in Reno on Saturday night. It was very windy and I thought the snow was a combination of rain and leaves. The trip from Reno to Las Vegas was a long ride through snow covered mountains, not a view I've seen often.

It's been three years since we were here for this big computer convention and Las Vegas continues to change at a rate of speed unparalleled in the known world. The population of the City of Las Vegas increased by over 10% last year as they added another 44,000 residents. Coming into town from the north on Highway 95, you go through miles of residential housing built on land that a few short years ago was covered with scrub brush and lined with dry gullies which came to life during the flash floods that periodically hit the Valley of the Sun.

The biggest change, though, is the nature of this gambling mecca. My mother first took me here in 1963, well before I could legally feed the slot machines. At that time the Sands and other hotels were

mainly low rise, spread-out sort of places. Big name entertainers like Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis, Jr., Dean Martin, Eddie Fisher, and Don Rickles ruled the roost. Thirty years later it's a different world here. The sleepy edge of Wilbur Clarke's Desert Inn and Bugsy Siegel's Flamingo have been replaced with hotels that continue to dwarf last year's model.

Driving down Las Vegas Blvd. one encounters the Grand Slam Canyon at the Circus Circus Hotel. This is an indoor amusement park that includes a roller coaster and a log flume ride. The brand new Treasure Island Hotel has to be seen to be believed. It's kind of like Walt Disney meets the roll of the dice. A fully enacted pirate ship encounter with a British naval ship plays out six times a day. The short battle leaves the British ship sunk amidst a wondrous display of pyrotechnics

Next door to Treasure Island is the Mirage Hotel, which boasts America's new version of Old Faithful. They have a volcano in front of the hotel which erupts every 15 minutes, stopping traffic regularly. Never was I more glad to see a red light.

Remember when the Hacienda Hotel was at the end of town? Now it sits amongst the biggest and the best of the new Las Vegas. It is now adjacent to the ninth wonder of the world, the Luxor Hotel. The Luxor is built in the shape of a huge pyramid and was designed by Architect Veldon Johnson, who also designed the Excalibur and the Grand Slam Canyon. The Luxor is a sight to behold as you enter the center atrium. It's part amusement park, part architectural fantasy, and big part crowd pleaser. Every room faces out into the atrium and it is quite a show. The new MGM Grand Hotel is almost finished across the street from the Excalibur and it's a big one, with some 5,000 rooms and includes a 33-acre amusement park.

Skywatcher's Guide

Prepared by David Nette and Robert Victor thanks to Abrams Planetarium at Michigan State University.

Thu. Nov. 18 - For several nights around Nov. 20 each year, the Seven Sisters or Pleiades star cluster is up all night. Look for the Pleiades low in ENE as evening darkness descends, high in S in the middle of the night, and low in WNW at dawn's first light. Binoculars give a superb view of this compact dippershaped group.

Fri. Nov. 19 - An hour after sunset the moon, approaching First Quarter, is in the S and nearing a bright yellow starlike object in the constellation Capricornus. This is Saturn. 110 to the moon's left.

Sat. Nov. 20 - At dusk, the First Quarter moon is in the S with Saturn within 70 below it. Note the moon appears half full. A pair of binoculars reveals lunar craters. maria (lava plains), and other features, and a small telescope reveals Saturn's magnificent rings.

Sun. Nov. 21 - Mon. at dawn, Mercury is still easy to find, nearly halfway between Venus and Jupiter very low in ESE. Mercury reaches greatest elongation, 200 from the Sun on Mon., and is at its

highest. For another week Mercury stays 70 upper right of Venus.

Mon. Nov. 22 - Visible in binoculars on the moon tonight is the 135mile-wide crater Clavius, deep in the moon's rugged southern region where the Sun is just rising. Farther north on the moon, look for the Apennine "mountain range" pointing like a finger at the 35-mile-wide crater Eratosthenes with its welldefined central peak. By Tue. evening the 60-mile-wide crater Copernicus will be in sunlight and in fine view, just north of the midpoint of the moon's terminator (daynight dividing line).

Tue. Nov. 23 - Within four hours after sunset these evenings, look for the constellation Orion the Hunter low in the east. Robert Frost aptly described Orion's rising in the open lines of his poem The Star

Splitter: "You know Orion always comes up sideways. Throwing a leg up over our fence of mountains,..."

Wed. Nov. 24 - This morning the waxing gibbous moon is 252,000 miles from Earth and at the point in its orbit farthest from our planet. Look for the moon low in ENE to E two hours before sunset today, soon after its rising. Tonight Sinus Iridum or "Bay of Rainbows", the young crater Kepler, and the ancient crater Gassendi are all prominent in binoculars near the lunar terminator (day-night boundary).



CITY COUNCIL MEETING

At the Port Orford City Council Meeting on November 15 the main issue was the impending problem with the city water supply caused by the logging and road building by Ernie Bussmann on the Hubbard Creek watershed. Twenty five people were present to voice their concerns about the prospect of drinking Garrison Lake water. They wanted to know how anyone could be allowed to destroy a city's water supply and demanded that the city consider suing Mr. Bussmann.

City manager Dean Madison and Mayor Delaine Kennedy assured the citizens that they were doing everything possible to alleviate the situation. They were of the opinion that the Department of Forestry had made a mistake. Matt Gray from HGE Engineering had visited the site and wrote a three page report outlining steps that he felt needed to be taken to minimize runoff to the creek. He did not know what remediation actions the Department of Forestry is requiring but Mr. Bussmann has 30 days to complete the repairs. In Matt Gray's opinion the problem will take at least a year to fully remedy. If Mr. Bussmann subdivides the


