All in all Mike and Sonja are handling the rush of business with their usual friendliness and aplomb. Meanwhile over at U.P.S. Gayle is busy checking in packages while John has so many to deliver and pick up they've given him a much needed assistant, Cary. The Christmas tree lots are open though up in our part of the country there are many good "U-Cut" lots giving you the opportunity to cut your own and haul it home.

One way I get in the spirit, or is it mood, for Christmas is listening to Christmas music and watching some of the many Christmas themed movies. I dug through the audio cassette collection and came up with my Elvis Christmas tape. That got me started so Valerie and I went out and bought a couple more tapes including an irreverent collection of Yuletide songs put together by Dr. Demento. The tape features such off beat standards as "All I Want For Christmas Is My Two Front Teeth" by Spike Jones, "Green Christmas" by Stan Freberg and "Grandma Got Run Over By A Reindeer" by Elmo and Patsy.

This weekend is the second and final weekend for one of the best Christmas events along the southcoast. The Friends of Cape Blanco are hosting their annual Christmas open house at Hughes House on Saturday and Sunday, December 18 and 19. The beautifully decorated old Victorian home will be open from 2:00-7:00pm.

Hughes House is located on Cape Blanco Road overlooking the mouth of the Sixes River and in the general vicinity of the historic Cape Blanco Lighthouse. According to the Friends there will be a children's room this year, decorated with the toys and gifts of a Victorian era Christmas. The front parlor room will be decorated with the trimmings of Victorian wedding. Refreshments, including hot cider, will be provided. Many of the Friends of Cape Blanco are on hand at these open houses to guide visitors through the house and answer questions.

The Hughes House was built in 1898 by P.J. Lindberg. The house is framed out of 2x8 Port Orford Cedar and is over 3,000 square feet in size. The House is part of the 1,800 acre Cape Blanco State Park.

Everybody keeps telling me the other "must see" for Christmas is the Christmas light display at Shore Acres State Park. Every year I threaten to go up and see this display of over 40,000 lights and every year I keep thinking how cold, windy, rainy and dark it is and never quite make it.

As of Wednesday morning there were still some tags left on the two Christmas giving trees at the Wheelhouse and Port and Starboard Restaurants. Already the majority of tags have been picked off the trees and many gifts for the children have been returned and placed under the trees.

You still have time to enter the Lightin' Bugs Christmas Lights Contest. The deadline is Monday, December 20. There are three cash prizes in the two categories, those being commercial and residential. Forms are available at the Fun Zone and Mary O. Loan Bookkeeping.

One of the best displays of Christmas lighting I've seen so far is at A & T Myrtlewood located on Highway 101 north of Pacific High School. The best way to see the residential displays is take some time one night and cruise around Port Orford and environs.

Christmas isn't just about music and shopping and who got the most Christmas cards or the biggest present. In the true spirit, the Port Orford Christian Center is presenting a Christmas story about giving entitled The Gift Goes On. The Christmas pageant puts its emphasis on the true meaning of Christmas. It takes place at the Port Orford Christian Center on Sunday, December 19. There are two shows, one at 11:00am and another at 6:30pm. They are free and everyone is welcome.

"Ravens in Winter"

One of my favorite books, "Ravens In Winter", is on the "598 shelf" in the Port Orford Public Library. The author, Bernd Heinrich, is a field biologist at the University of Vermont.

While vacationing at his cabin in the Maine Woods, he sees that Ravens, when they find dead animals, actually call other Ravens to share a common meal. Why?

Sharing food outside of the family is uncommon in the animal world. Exploring why Ravens seem to share food is the theme of this book.

The written record is surveyed. How does the Raven behave in ancient European and North American mythology? What observations have pre-twentieth century and contemporary naturalists/biologists made of Ravens? What methods and controls have they used?

Bernd details Raven physiology and life history. Calls are recorded and analyzed. Individual birds are identified and records kept. A nestling banding project is undertaken. Opportunities to observe Ravens feeding are created.

Bernd spent parts of four winters at his cabin, in the subzero Maine Woods. For Raven food the Highway Department provided road kill; deer as available and

once a moose. Moving a multi-ton moose to an appropriate site is a challenge. Finding an unobtrusive point of observation is also a problem. The top of a distant tree, during a snow storm, was one such site. Once everything has been prepared, frequently, the Ravens do not show up. Such are the problems of a field laboratory.

Woven of multiple threads, this entertaining book is more than a detailed scientific report. For all who enjoy natural history, humor, and matching wits with animals, this is a can't put it down book.

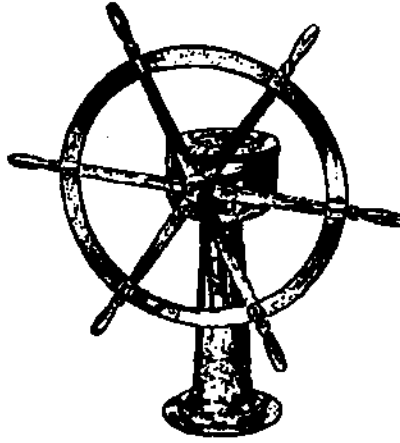

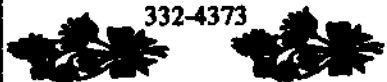

City Council Meeting

At the Port Orford City Council meeting on December 13 the main topic was once again the Hubbard Creek water problem. City manager Dean Madison showed a video tape he had made on the Bussmann property showing serious erosion at a culvert over a creek and along the road. He stated that Mr. Bussmann was being required by the Department of Forestry to take more remedial action but it is doubtful if he can do any work at this time because of the rain.

City attorney Lynn Heusinkveld was present to answer questions and advise the council on the possibility of a lawsuit. He stated that there was a violation of the health code but he would rather see the city attempt to get Mr. Bussmann's cooperation in repairing the damage than to institute an expensive lawsuit. He proposed a county ordinance for a watershed protection zone and a watershed management plan.

Presently the city has had expenses of approximately \$6,000 but if the problem continues and the city is required to obtain a new source of water (Elk River)

costs could be in the \$1,000,000 range. The city approved a motion by councilman George Kennedy to have the attorney send a letter to Mr. Bussmann requesting his cooperation in restoring the city's Hubbard Creek water source.

Councilman Jim Gray made a motion to send a letter to the Department of Forestry expressing the city's displeasure at the issuance of the Bussmann permit and subsequent damage to the city's water supply. Attorney Heusinkveld advised against it as it might be antagonistic and the motion died for lack of a second.

Dean Madison liked the idea of a watershed protection ordinance and thought the proper place to begin was with the watershed council. He and councilman Carl Eskelson attended the watershed meeting in Gold Beach last Friday. They learned that there will be \$10,000,000 available in Oregon for watershed restoration but the money for this area would probably go to the Coquille and Rogue Rivers.

At the request of Mayor Delaine Kennedy the council passed a motion to establish

a watershed council. The council will be composed of 15 citizens with diverse interests. Anyone wishing to serve on the watershed council should submit a letter of interest to the city by January 3. The city council will be represented by Carl Eskelson.

The sewer project bids will be opened on December 21.

A representative of CTR was present to express appreciation to the fire department for putting out a fire at the transfer station building. He presented a \$100 donation to the fire department.

Chris Keusink appeared for the Curry County Bar Association and asked the city council to pass a resolution supporting the bar's proposal to amend the law regarding the election of district judges so that only Curry County residents vote for the Curry County judge. The council approved the resolution.

The council approved new animal control and noise control ordinances. Dean Madison was given enforcement authority.
