Fire Board Heats Up by Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Rural Fire Board met in their regular session on Tuesday evening, December 14. One of the Board's five elected members, Doyle Greene, had recently been killed in a tragic automobile accident. The Board was faced with the decision of appointing someone to take Doyle's place.

Being on the board I made a motion to nominate Bill McMullen to fill the position with a second by Brice Wagner. When the vote was called for Wagner and I voted for McMullen. Board members Bill Foster and Lou Cobb supported the appointment of Frank Barrows. The Board remained deadlocked with 2 in favor of McMullen and 2 supporting Barrows despite much discussion on the merits of the two men. An offer to make a decision by flipping a coin was turned down.

It takes a majority vote of the Board to appoint a member. Based on Oregon Regulatory Statue section 195 regarding succession on special taxing district boards the decision was sent to the Curry County Board of Commissioners. At their Monday, January 3, meeting they chose to meet on the Rural Fire Board appointment on Monday morning, January 10, at 11:30am in Gold Beach at the Courthouse Annex. The meeting is open to the public.

So what's it all about? The Port Orford Rural Fire District is a special taxing district that exists for the purpose of providing fire protection to the residents within its boundaries. The district does not include the City of Port Orford. It does take in the urban growth boundaries north of the city including properties along the south and western sides of Elk River up to the state owned fish hatchery. The southern boundary includes Hubbard Creek, China Moustain and Fir Road.

The Fire District owns a fire station located on Elk River Road. The land was donated by the Marsh family who have just recently donated an adjoining parcel. This will enable the District to build a new building and more than double it's capacity. The District's 1993-94 budget included \$30,000 for construction of the new fire station.

The District owns several pieces of fire fighting equipment including one KW tanker, one Desert Storm air force tanker (capacity 5,000 gallons), one very old Dismond T fire truck which you get to see every Fourth Of July, and several other vehicles.

The District doesn't have a fire department. Instead, it contracts out to the City of Port Orford for fire protection. It pays \$12,000 a year to the city for this service. For that \$12,000 we the tutpayers get quite a lot. Dial 911 if there's a fire and you live within the district and you'll get all the needed resources of the city

and rural district at your door as soon as

The District has been collecting more taxes than it needs to pay for equipment, maintenance, and the city contract. It has been saving to buy a fire truck to replace the 1953 Diamond T truck. It has accumulated over \$200,000. Seems like a lot but brand spanking new fire trucks can cost that much and more.

An alternative to purchasing a new fire truck built to district specifications is purchase of a used truck. There are plenty of them for sale. Many departments don't keep their equipment as long as we do here. The City of Portland rotates their equipment on a five year basis. Recently the North Bay fire district had a gas powered fully equipped fire truck for sale in the neighborhood of \$45,000. We missed a chance to see that one, but other good deals do come up.

The Board's goal has been the purchase of a new truck but it's not written on stone tablets delivered from on high. "Thou shalt buy a new fire truck. Thou shalt not covet thy neighboring district's used fire truck." The reason for the Board's inability to reach a majority decision on selecting a replacement for Doyle Greene is the struggle for control. McMullen leans toward purchase of a used piece of fire fighting equipment. The savings could be used to build an

The proposed "Blanco Middle School Outdoor Classroom", or Land Lab, will provide a vital experience in an outdoor school setting and allow for (1) the revegitation of a watershed area and (2) increased student understandings of important interrelationships between environmental resources and human needs. The project will provide an appropriate, continuously renewing, hands-on learning environment for students.

The project aims to create an outdoor classroom on a sixteen-acre plot located directly behind the school. Seven clearcut acres provide the opportunity to develop a reforestation project which will also deal with real problems of erosion, watershed concerns, and a range of environmental issues.

Gold Beach Receives Two Grants

The Gold Beach Promotion committee was notified last week that it was the recipient of two separate matching fund grants for which they had submitted. The City of Gold Beach, Oregon requests were approved by both the Oregon Tourism Division's Matching Grant Program (lottery dollars) and the Cycle Oregon 1994 Grant Program.

Thursday brought the news that the Oregon Tourism Division had awarded \$4,000 to the City of Gold Beach for the purpose of further promoting the area. The grant is targeted to update a "Day trip" brochure that gives tourists a guide to things to do in the area during their visit. The brochure will highlight local activities along with interesting things to do along the Southern Oregon coast. The grant will also help fund re-editing of the 1985 Gold Beach video to sell and to use as a promotional tool with members the tourism industry.

On Friday the good news continued, when the city was notified that the \$5,000 Cycle Oregon grant had also been approved. The grant also is designed to fund the purchase of the necessary start gate and lights required for Gold Beach to conduct sanctioned BMX racing.

The combination of both grants, equaling a sum of \$9,000 will be matched by funds or "in-kind" services from the City of Gold Beach, the Gold Beach Chamber of Commerce, The Curry County Reporter, Curry County Fairgrounds and local merchants.
