Hilton Gives and Takes by Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met in regular session on Monday evening, April 11. All six city councilors and mayor Delaine Kennedy were present. Dennis Gehrke was present representing the City's public works department. City Manager Dean Madison was not present. Earlier in the day he had been taken to Curry General Hospital because of heart fibrillation (rapid heart beat). We were told he was home on Tuesday, feeling better and back to work.

Mayor Kennedy opened the meeting by stating the first item of business on the agenda, a public hearing on amendments to the zoning ordinance, would not be held because Chuck Nordstrom, county planning director and Madison would not be present at the meeting. That meeting will take place on Thursday, April 14, at 7:00pm in the council chambers. Kennedy also said the council would not be discussing Mr. Madison's job situation because he would not be present. Delaine also noted that she had received a letter from Oregon Department of Transportation notifying the city they had been turned down in their request for a traffic light at Highway 101 and 12th Street.

Mr. Frank Hilton, the city's lawyer handling the injunction against the Busmanns was introduced to the capacity crowd attending the meeting and spent

the next hour explaining the situation and answering citizens' questions. Hilton started off with a chart listing the two different kinds of injunction. The first, a prohibitory injunction, was the one he said wouldn't work. He said if the court issued a prohibitory injunction Busmann could walk away from the property and not fix the situation. A mandatory injunction is the type Hilton is pursuing which includes remedies to fix the problem and which the landowner can not walk away from the situation. The next court date is scheduled for April 26 where Hilton will seek the mandatory injunction. Busmanns and their attorney can sign an agreement on that date agreeing on the remedies with work to be completed by September 14. Hilton said the city would go to court in December to recover damages from the loss of its primary water source.

In response to a question Hilton said we (the city) can't stop Busmanns from cutting the trees on their property since the Division of State Forestry has approved his logging plan. Hilton said the problem wasn't the logging but the road construction on the property which he described as a "mess" with muddy water flowing into the creek. When asked about his ties to South Coast Timber and how it affected the handling of the city's case or whether it would jeopardize his career Hilton was forthright. He said he was proud to represent South Coast but that besides them he represented all kinds

of interests. He said he was handling the case as creatively as possible and that he agreed with the city's position.

Hilton explained that a key factor in this case is the turbidity levels in the water and that they can not be increased over 10%. The city has daily records of the turbidity levels on the two forks of North Hubbard's Creek, some of which show levels way above an increase of 10%.

Hilton described the Department of Environmental Quality as overworked and underfunded when asked if they had been brought into the situation and what they could do. Hilton described the March 10 court date and said at that meeting the Busmanns had been agreeable to the city's demands for what work needed to be done. He also said they agreed not to do any more road construction without the city being notified. Hilton said he wants the remedies to be based on what the city's engineering firm H.G.E. specifies. Representatives from H.G.E. have walked the entire property and have come up with a list of work needed to be done. When asked if the possibility of a housing development on the Busmann property would be addressed by the lawsuit Hilton said it wouldn't. One audience member urged the council to go in and condemn the Busman property. Hilton spoke and answered questions for nearly an hour before leaving the room to an appreciative and applauding audience.



Hilton Gives & Takes - Continued from Front Cover

Matt Gray, engineer from H.G.E. took the floor after Mr. Hilton departed the room. He stated that H.G.E. is close to completing the final draft of the City of Port Orford Water System Master Plan. Copies of the preliminary draft, dated December, 1993, had been distributed to the council, some media and a few private citizens. Copies of the proposed final draft will be given to the council and made available at the Port Orford Library. The council will review the document before putting the "final draft" stamp on it. Gray spoke about a recommendation from the water plan which is getting a better water source on Garrison Lake. He wants the city to extend the intake water pipe a couple of hundred feet further out in the lake to a spot around 15 feet deep. He said the Wildish Construction company is in town working on the sewer line and if the city went along with this recommendation it could be put on a fast track with Wildish doing the work. He estimated the cost of extending the water line, concrete pad and fine screening at \$30,000. However in H.G.E.'s preliminary water system master plan on page 8-4 under cost estimate for a new raw water intake in Garrison Lake the total cost is estimated at \$57,375. The plan addresses many issues including the city's water needs for the next 25 years.

The council then dealt with the citizen's ad hoc water advisory committee. The

committee drafted a letter for council approval that is addressed to the Department of Environmental Quality. The city in the letter asks D.E.Q. to consider the letter a formal complaint against Peter and Earnest Bussmann based on their actions resulting in the polluting of the City of Port Orford's water supply. The letter asks D.E.Q. to proceed with haste to restore Port Orford's primary water supply.

The council made and passed a motion accepting the letter and agreeing to send it off to D.E.Q. the next day. They also agreed to send a similar letter to seven other potentially interested organizations including the Army Corps of Engineers, Office of the Governor, Division of State Lands, Curry County Commissioners, Oregon Attorney General, Curry County Health Department, and Curry County Planning Department.

Janelle Haller, president of the Chamber of Commerce, spoke to the council with a budget request for \$10,000 to be used on hiring a manager for the Chamber office/visitor center. Mayor Kennedy said the budget committee would take this request under consideration.

School Report

The Port Orford Langlois 2CJ School District Board held it's regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, April 12. No further action was taken on the controversial plan to move the fourth grade from Driftwood Elementary School to Blanco Middle School next year. Instead, a plan was submitted in which meetings will be held to discuss perceived problems and solutions. Parent informational meetings are scheduled for April 18 & 20 at Driftwood and April 19 at Blanco. Meetings with staff and committees will take place at various times throughout the month. The principals will review all the input and make a recommendation to the board for action at the May 10 board meeting.

Driftwood Elementary School Principal Harry Shipman reported on class sizes in his school as follows: Kindergarten: morn-

ing 24, afternoon 17 (total 41); First Grade: 46; Second Grade: 40; Third Grade 35; Fourth Grade: 31 for a grand total of 193 students. From this we see that the fourth grade must be prepared to swell to 148% of its present size three years from now.

On the lighter side, a set of clogged sink and water fountain drains at Driftwood produced a mystery worthy of the district's own Sherlock Holmes. District staff weren't able to unclog the drains. 



What Is Going On?

[Ed Note: The following is a press release issued by Bill Roberts, candidate for Curry County Sheriff]

Elections are full of surprises and this years Sheriff's race in Curry County is no exception. Candidate Bill Roberts discovered to his surprise that he was the subject of a Grand Jury investigation. On March 29 he received a fax from the Douglas County District Attorney's office. It stated, "the Curry County Grand Jury has been empaneled to investigate a matter in which you are accused of committing an offense. The Grand Jury will meet on Friday, April 1, 1994, at 1:00pm."

On telephoning the assistant District Attorney involved in the case, Roberts was informed that the investigation stemmed from a case he had been involved in as an investigator for the South Western Oregon Public Defender's Office. It is alleged that during a telephone

conversation in November, 1993, the called party was led to believe that Roberts Was with the Curry County District Attorney's Office.

Roberts, who has an extensive corrections and law enforcement background, knew immediately what this meant, he could be charged with criminal misrepresentation. With his background in professional investigations, Roberts has learned to be thorough. Since the call was placed from the Public Defender's Office, he had recorded the phone call. The tape clearly records that Roberts did properly identify himself as calling from the Public Defender's Office. Roberts promptly informed the Douglas County

District Attorney's Office and a copy of the tape was delivered directly to them. Until then, the District Attorney's office was unaware that such a recording existed.

For Roberts, just weeks away from a critical election, having this misunderstanding could not have come at a worse time. Front page coverage of "an investigation" in the local press has compromised an open and careful campaign. "This is a bad dream," said Roberts, "thank goodness I have that tape!"

Has the Grand Jury met? If so, what were their findings? Many in Curry County want to know but no one seems to be able to answer. "This whole thing is like a soap opera!" lamented Roberts. "Why did it come out just before an election?" Was Robert's opponent, the incumbent sheriff involved in any way? Why was it turned over to the Douglas County District Attorney rather than staying in Curry County? When will Roberts be able to defend himself and will it be in time to save the election? How much is this whole thing costing the taxpayer?

"We've improved the process substantially", said Reagan. "The General Economic Development and Ecosystem Investment Ad Hoc Committees have developed a new form that has specific instructions for completion and we added a training session for applicants who need some assistance in completing the

form. The class will be held on Saturday, April 23, 1994, from 10:00am to Noon in the basement meeting room at the Courthouse Annex."

Applications received will be reviewed by the full Ad Hoc Committee and, based on the ratings assigned to individual projects, an applicant may be invited to make a personal presentation before the committee. Because this committee must comply with public meeting laws, after the personal interview has been completed and the committee is satisfied that the project meets the criteria of the NEAI, specific financial information for individual applicants will be requested by Coos Curry Douglas Business Development Corp. That criteria includes the creation of jobs for displaced workers and that the project is a viable one and is ready to go.

"The first round of project solicitations was a real learning experience," ex-

plained Reagan. "We were trying to comply with state and federal instructions that were changing every day. We have identified several barriers and proposed solutions to overcome those barriers. The process is improving at both the state and federal level. I think we have greater opportunities available to Curry County during this second round."

Anyone interested in submitting an application for possible funding through the NEAI may attend the class on April 23, or request a copy of the form after May 1, 1994.
