

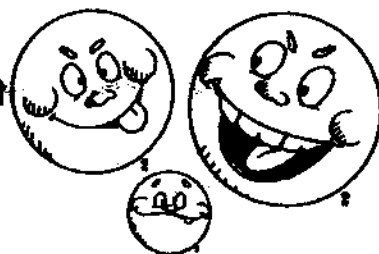

There are many signs of spring fever. It can be caused by such extremely pleasant weather that you can't sit still and have to spend all your time outdoors. Witness: Tuesday's weather. Bright, warm and sunny in the morning and afternoon making for nice dog walking weather. Just ask my dog Myrtle who got to walk me from Battle Rock to Hubbard Creek in the morning. In other parts of town gardeners were busy planting in one of Port Orford's great passions - back yard vegetable gardening. Sandy told me she spent the day in her large yard pulling weeds, pruning vines and trees that are now coming out of dormancy, spreading mulch under the vegetables and planting bedding plants. Another sure sign of spring fever is the geometrical progression of things to do. Among other things going on this week is National Library Week which goes from April 17 through 23. Both the Langlois and the Port Orford Libraries have events including an art exhibit at the Langlois Library and a talk this Saturday at the Port Orford Library. I can't think of many institutions that compare in the

positive effect that libraries have had on our world. Earth Day is this Sunday, April 24 and the Oregon Department of Parks and Recreation is honoring this day by giving away tree seedlings this weekend.

The Curry County Board of Commissioners has proclaimed the week of April 17-24 crime victim's rights week. That should include just about all of us.

The Port Orford Arts Festival '94 draws nearer and nearer and is set for the weekend of May 6, 7, 8 in locations from Port Orford to Sixes and Langlois. I spoke to Flo Lichtig earlier this week and she asked me tell people that the My Other Life art show scheduled for the Arts Festival weekend at the Lichtig Law Office would be canceled due to personal pressures and the need to catch up on their business. She and Howard apologize for any inconvenience but are hoping to participate in the 1995 Arts Festival. Last year was the first time they put on the My Other Life show which featured artists who do not exhibit in galleries and had good participation and attendance. The meeting will be at the Grantland residence located above the Grantland Mayfield Art Gallery. This takes place on Thursday night, April 28, starting at 7:00pm. At the last meeting of the Port Orford City Council held on April 14 the council sent back to the planning department the commercial zone change. This meeting will be an opportunity for people to help draft any or all changes.

The Port Orford Volunteer Fire Department which hasn't had a pancake breakfast in a couple of years is having one on Mother's Day, May 8, at the fire station. The department will be whipping up a pancake, ham and egg breakfast from 7:00am to 1:00pm. The monies raised from this breakfast are going to be used by the department to purchase hand held radios and upgrade radio equipment.

Last but not least the Port Orford Senior Center has a couple of fun things scheduled for Saturday, April 23. They're inviting everyone to spring on down and have lunch at the Senior Center at 11:30am for a suggested donation of \$2.50 and then later on in the evening they're having a spring fling dance with music by the Country Travelers starting at 7:30pm.

Curry General Hospital will present a free seminar, "Opening Doors: Independent Living In The Home," at 4 PM, Thursday, April 21. It will be held in the hospital conference room, 220 E. Fourth St., Gold Beach.

The seminar is geared toward elderly people or those concerned with loved ones living on their own as they age. The program will include a video and handouts from the American Association of Retired People.

"Older people with special health care needs can live at home by making some simple changes in their living arrangements and using community services," according to Carol Ravinski, CNA, guest presenter.

Ravinski works for the In-Home Service Program which receives support from Oregon Project Independence. The

program's services are designed to keep people home and out of nursing homes or other facilities "for as long as possible," Ravinski added.

The session will be the first of three sponsored by the hospital. Others in the series include:

"Your Future — Who Decides?" scheduled for 1 PM, Thursday, April 28, in the Gold Beach Senior Center. This program focuses on how to prepare now to retain personal control and diminish the chances of neglect or abuse in later life.

"Spousal Bereavement and Primary Health Care" is scheduled for 4 PM, Thursday, May 5, in the Curry General Hospital conference room. The presentation will cover medical treatment, medication and support services available locally for newly widowed persons.

Earth Day Seedlings

Oregon will be a little greener after Earth Day when the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department and Oregon Department of Forestry distribute thousands of tree seedlings.

About 30 state parks around Oregon will give away tree seedlings for people to take home and plant. Most of the seedling events will occur Saturday, April 23, while a few will take place on Sunday, April 24, to coincide with local Earth Day observances.

A variety of tree species will be distributed. They are selected to match local growing conditions.

The seedlings will be given on a first come, first served basis. Most participating parks will have only a few hundred to distribute and may limit the number of seedlings given to each family. Tree planting instructions also will be provided.

Locally, tree seedlings will be given away at Humbug Mountain State Park from 10:00am to 5:00pm, Saturday, April 23. The park expects to distribute 1,000 seedlings and is limiting each person or family to 5.

Letter to the Editor

When most people think of a Justice of the Peace, they think of performing wedding ceremonies, or perhaps fining people for traffic infractions. However, with the election for that office coming soon, perhaps people should consider what else this job entails.

In addition to performing wedding ceremonies and handling traffic matters, the Justice of the Peace is allowed to hear small claims and other civil actions involving disputes up to \$2,500. A Justice of the Peace can also order the return of property that does not exceed that amount in value. A Justice of the Peace also has the power to evict someone from their residence at the request of a landlord.

On the criminal side, a Justice of the Peace has the power to sign search and arrest warrants, set bail and try misdemeanors, in which defendants can be locked up for up to a year in county jail and fined up to \$5,000.

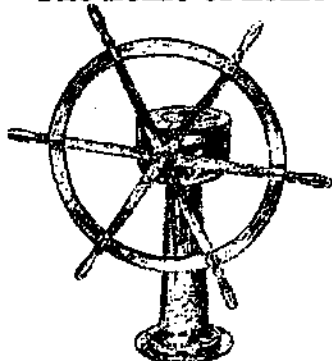
Under certain circumstances, a Justice of the Peace may also serve as a magistrate in more serious offenses, and also has the power to set bail.

Hopefully, when voters cast their votes in May they consider which candidate has more experience and is better qualified to make the tough decisions the job requires.

City Council Meeting
