AuFranc Wins By A Landslide By Evan Kramer

The election results are in with all votes counted except those for write-in candidates. Justice of the Peace Richard AuFranc won another 4 year term of office at court #3 in a landslide victory over challenger Jeff Loan. Incumbent Curry County Sheriff Chuck Denney turned back challengers Mark Creighton and Bill Roberts and won a second four year term taking 53% of the vote. Incumbent County Commissioner Peg Reagan narrowly lost in the Democratic primary race to Gold Beach Mayor Marilyn Schafer, Schafer defeated Reagan by 7 votes. The Republicans chose former county commissioner T.V. Skinner over J. Fran Blanks to represent them in the November election in the commissioner's race. Lloyd H. Olds easily dispatched three opponents in the Brookings Justice of the Peace Court #1 with well over 50% of the vote. Olds served as Justice of the Peace in Brookings from 1980-1988. The elections department told us the write-in votes will be counted in the next several days. A write-in campaign had developed late in the campaign for State Legislative seat #48 where no Democrat filed. Republican incumbent Veral Tarno ran unopposed in his parties primary. There was a last minute attempt to get the 100 write-in votes needed to qualify either Dave Tipton or Veral Tarno (yes Republican Veral Tarno!) as the Democratic candidate.

Black Cod Season Opens

The black cod season opened on Sunday, May 15. On Sunday the first loads of black cod were brought back to the Port of Port Orford dock. We went down to the dock around 3:00pm and Merle Hasset told us one of the boats was due in soon. The seas on Sunday were the opposite of calm as Port Orford was being buffeted by a storm which dumped over 2" of rain on the town in a 24 hour period. At that point the only "fish" on the dock was a load of crab. The boat arrived about 3:30 at the Premium Pacific/Blue Water Harvesters hoist carrying 3,000 pounds of black cod. I didn't know much about black ood or whether I'd even eaten it under a different name. I was told that the cod being hauled up to the dock was bound for the Japanese market.

At the hoist Vicky Nowlin and Chris Felt had 4 crates full of ice ready for the fish. Each black cod had to be weighed individually with the weight determining the class of fish it was and what price per pound the buyer was paying for it. The black cod are caught using either pots or long lines with the hooks baited with squid. They're not a particularly good looking or interesting fish but they are bringing much needed dollars to our local fishermen and tonnage over the hoist which is important to the well being of the Port. Going down to the dock and seeing the boats come in loaded with crab or black end or urchin is one of the more

interesting things to do in Port Orford yet many local people seem to forget it exists.



Gray Named City Manager

Due to health problems the Port Orford city council's first pick for interim city manager, Norma House, will be unable to fill that position.

After interviewing two people, Tom Weldon of Ashland and Jim Gray of Port Orford, the council decided to go with Jim Gray. Gray is a council member and is currently a teacher at Pacific High School. He will fill in the city manager's job, at no pay, for 2-3 hours a day and weekends as necessary until school is out. At that time, if a permanent city manager has not been hired, he will be kept on at the rate of \$100 each workday with no additional benefits.

The city council will hold its first session to interview job applicants for city manager on Monday, May 23, at 7:00pm, in the council chambers. The meeting is open to the public and questions from the audience will be taken. The second job applicant interview session will be held on Tucaday, May 31, at 7:00pm, in the council chambers. Mayor Delaine Kennedy has told this paper that 41 people have submitted applications for the job of city manager.



Anonymous Float-A-Thon

Participants are sought for the First Paddler's Anonymous Float-a-thon, Saturday, May 21, on the Chetco River, a pristine Class 1 stream which empties into the Pacific at Brookings, in southern Oregon's Banana Belt.

Float-a-thon paddlers will collect pledges to raise money for Curry General Hospital's "Fill Curry's Heart" campaign. Paddlers must own or borrow their own floats, rafts, canoes, inflatibles or inner tubes with wetsuits.

The float-a-thon will begin at 9:00am at various points along the river, starting at the Chetco's South Fork, 18 miles up the Chetco North Bank Road. Other launch points include Loeb State Park (river

mile 9) and Social Security Bar (river mile 4). Paddlers can take out anywhere along the river, or float into the Port of Brookings harbor.

The Chetco winds over scenic sand bars and along wild banks of Douglas fir, cedar, fragrant wild flowers, and nesting habitat of hawk, osprey, king fisher and other birds. Clear deep pools and rocky outcroppings mark the length of the upper river, while deer often cross in front of drifters at shallow riftles along the way.

Rafts and other crafts are needed for those who wish to participate but do not have their own. Special t-shirts, designed by Bruce Johnston of Brookings and printed by First Impressions, will be awarded to paddlers who raise the most money.

Port land sale." Mr. Griffith does the best job of any reporter covering Curry County and he represents a Portland based newspaper. Basically Griffith wrote about the sale of a piece of county owned land at the Port Of Brookings to that Port for \$90,350. The county purchased the same piece of land from the Port Of Brookings 20 years ago for \$352,000. Terry Hanseam represented the County Commissioners in negotiations with the Port and he and Rocky McVay voted to approve this sale. Griffith's article notes that the Port Of Brookings went to the table prepared to pay \$150,000 for the property. All this has occurred amidst county budget sessions which if finalized on June 22 will lead to lavoffs of several county employees and an across the board wage cut of 5% to all county employees. Best thing to do is get a copy of Monday's Oregonian and read Griffith's entire story. Good job, John.
