Valerie and I got to play the tourist role this past Memorial Day weekend. We were debating whether to go to Crater Lake or Bend, neither of which we've seen. We decided on Bend but took the route that goes past the entrance to Crater Lake just in case. Bend has a good reputation as a reoreational city and many people have expressed their liking for the city and surrounding area.

It seemed like every other car and truck we saw while traveling north and south along Highway 97 had a bike rack, ski rack, cance rack or carried off road vehicles. We knew we were getting close to Bend when we passed the High Desert Museum. Then we came across a Wal-Mart under construction, a new looking Fred Meyer and mile after mile of fast food restaurants, gas stations and motels. I quickly got the feeling I'd been through all this before. We found a motel room easily despite the huge number of people and cars driving up and down Highway 97.

Whenever I go to a city I've never been to I always head for the downtown area. So we went to that part of Bend. It was Sunday and most businesses except the cafes were closed. Suddenly Fred Meyer and Wal-Mart started looking good.

We decided to see Eddie Murphy's new movie Beverly Hills Cop III at the Mountain View Mall quadraplex located at the northern edge of town. There was so much popourn and spilled sods on the carpet and floor of the theater from previous acreenings I thought maybe they were trying to compost the stuff. Valerie wasn't too thrilled when the woman behind her aneczed on her hair. The \$5.00 per person tickets made video rentals look like a real bargain.

On Sunday we traveled south to the Lava Lands Visitor Center which is part of the Newberry National Volcanic Monument. From there we drove to the parking lot for Benham Falls on the Descinstes River. 





June 6, 1994 marks the fiftieth anniversary of the Allied invasion of Europe better known as D-Day. Over 1 million troops representing the United States. Great Britain, Canada and other nations had massed in various parts of England prior to D-Day in preparation for the greatest invasion in history. Troops landed on various beaches along the Nazi fortified Normandy coast of France during the morning of June 6 in what became a successful attempt to retake France and all of Europe from the German armics. General Dwight David Eisenhower was commander of Allied forces and later became President of the United States. One of General Eisenhower's biggest concerns was had weather. His meteorologists found him a small opening of tolerable weather condition on June 6 and the invasion began.

The scope of the invasion was staggering. The number of soldiers, boats, planes and other equipment was unparalleled during the war. The Allied forces used used 5,000 ships in the invasion known militarily as Operation Overlord

Locally, the Port Orford American Logion remembered our veterans on Memorial Day. The Legion put crosses and flags at the cometeries in Port Orford and Denmark. They also dropped a wreath into the ocean at the Port Orford dock in honor of our veterans. The Ladies Auxiliary of the American Legion made the cedar awage that were put on the veteran's CTOSSCS.
