## Gas, Food and Lodging by Evan Kramer

Valerie and I got to play the tourist role this past Memorial Day weekend. We were debating whether to go to Crater Lake or Bend, neither of which we've seen. We decided on Bend but took the route that goes past the entrance to Crater Lake just in case. Bend has a good reputation as a recreational city and many people have expressed their liking for the city and surrounding area.

It seemed like every other car and truck we saw while traveling north and south along Highway 97 had a bike rack, ski rack, canoe rack or carried off road vehicles. We knew we were getting close to Bend when we passed the High Desert Museum. Then we came across a Wal-Mart under construction, a new looking Fred Meyer and mile after mile of fast food restaurants, gas stations and motels. I quickly got the feeling I'd been through all this before. We found a motel room easily despite the huge number of people and cars driving up and down Highway 97.

Whenever I go to a city I've never been to I always head for the downtown area. So we went to that part of Bend. It was Sunday and most businesses except the cafes were closed. Suddenly Fred Meyer and Wal-Mart started looking good.

We decided to see Eddie Murphy's new movie Beverly Hills Cop III at the Moun-

tain View Mall quadraplex located at the northern edge of town. There was so much popcorn and spilled soda on the carpet and floor of the theater from previous screenings I thought maybe they were trying to compost the stuff. Valerie wasn't too thrilled when the woman behind her sneezed on her hair. The \$5.00 per person tickets made video rentals look like a real bargain.

On Sunday we traveled south to the Lava Lands Visitor Center which is part of the Newberry National Volcanic Monument. From there we drove to the parking lot for Benham Falls on the Deschutes River. The trail that leads from the car corral to the Falls takes one past an artificially created logjam created many years ago to protect the railroad bridge just east of it. The railroad is long since gone and has been replaced by a people bridge. The trail then follows the route of the old logging railroad. There were numerous hikers, joggers and bicyclists sharing the trail to the falls which were created by the flow of lava.

From the Visitor Center there is a shuttle bus which takes you to the top of Lava Butte, once an active volcano and now an active tourist attraction. The whole area was full of semi-tame chipmunks all looking for a free handout. Instead they got their pictures taken.

Leaving Bend for Port Orford after a very brief stay in that city we decided to take the scenic route home via McKenzie

Pass. It was a good choice. The pass is set in an immense lava field not far from Mt. Washington and Mt. Jefferson. We'd never seen anything like it and didn't think twice about stopping. Small amounts of snow from winter still rested in the lava boulders crevices. Here and there trees grew despite the harshness of their immediate environment. For a first time visitor to the pass it was a memorable one.

June 6, 1994 marks the fiftieth anniversary of the Allied invasion of Europe better known as D-Day. Over 1 million troops representing the United States, Great Britain, Canada and other nations had massed in various parts of England prior to D-Day in preparation for the greatest invasion in history. Troops landed on various beaches along the Nazi fortified Normandy coast of France during the morning of June 6 in what became a successful attempt to retake France and all of Europe from the German armies. General Dwight David Eisenhower was commander of Allied forces and later became President of the United States. One of General Eisenhower's biggest concerns was bad weather. His meteorologists found him a small opening of tolerable weather condition on June 6 and the invasion began.
