Curry County Fair

The 61 st edition of the Curry County Fair is three weeks away now. The Fair's theme this year is "Cheers to Another 60 Years". The Fair runs from Thursday. July 28 through Sunday, July 31. The Fair features many events each day including entertainment, livestock shows, a karaoke contest, a rodeo, and the Fair parade on Saturday morning. Butler Amusements will provide the midway and carnival rides. This year features not only a return of demolition derby on Sunday afternoon but more importantly the welcome return of Ron Crook as fair manager. It was hard for me to enjoy last vear's Fair knowing Ron's position of Fair Manager had been climinated by the Fair Board who themselves took over management of the facility. Ron was rehired in June and will serve as part time manager for the 1994-95 year. The only member of the Fair Board that let Ron go last year remaining on that Board is Viola Cuatt.

The Curry County Fair received no money in the 1994-94 County budget. They did receive \$34,720 from the State of Oregon for this fiscal year. The rest of the money for the Fair and year round maintenance of the fairgrounds will come from whatever revenues are generated. Ron says his two highest priorities are to provide the best fair for Curry County that the staff and volunteers can, and to keep up the condition of the facility and keep it open all year. He says there are many volunteers from the community willing to help out with the Fair.

Fire At Cape Blanco State Park

A fire destroyed a motor home on Monday night at Cape Blanco State Park. The fire call came in during the fireworks show at Battle Rock Park. Sixes Fire Department responded and called on Port Orford for mutual aid. Coos Forest Patrol also responded to the fire. The large motor home parked at space #53 was totally destroyed. The propane tanks in the motor home burned and fire spread to brush around the camp site. The fire in the brush was contained to an area approximately one tenth of an acre in the vicinity of the motor home.







Letter To The Editor:

In the June 23 issue of Port Orford Today appeared a provocative article by T.J. Efferson, Langlois. His basic thesis seemed to be that there should be no social (i.e. political?) restraints upon the exercise of individual freedom and that any attempt to do so would lead to despotism. It is true that out of that beautiful Declaration of Independence came the rhetorical suggestion that "all men are created equal endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights..." but the fulfillment of such rights has never been achieved by any society no matter how democratic. Anarchy is a behavioral mode that is not tolerated nor can it be in a society that proclaims for itself common egalitarian objectives. "Life" is taken, "liberty" is restricted, "the pursuit of happiness" circumscribed when the common good is believed threatened.

So what are the objectives of our society? The exercise of absolute individual rights? Or the advancement, not of the Declaration's assumption that "all men are created equal" but a society in which all are given an equal opportunity" Do we seek a condition in which a degree of "managed freedom" may help to level

the playing field, a formula that will reflect our respect for the individual as well as the social whole?

When arguing for ratification of the Constitution, James Madison in his Federalist Paper #10, sought to balance the equation between public good and individual freedom knowing that "factions" would tend to dominate the body politic.

So what is freedom in the context of a representative democracy corrupted as ours is today by special interests, well-organized and well-heeled? Out of history comes much evidence that unrestrained individualism, powerful incentive that it is, can abuse the public good, exploit our resource base, foul our environment... Are we about to presume because our current distrust of representative government that the individual or the "factions", especially those of great wealth, can protect our society from dissolution, corruption, decay?

Was James Madison possessed of a wisdom about the nature of man that two hundred years later has yet to be understood? Makes for interesting speculation today.
