**Deadline Draws Near**

## Deadline Draws Near By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday evening, July 11. A reception was held before the meeting for the public to meet new city manager, Doty Myers, and bid farewell to city councilman Jim Gray. It turns out Mr. Gray will serve as councilman through August's meeting which will be held on August 8. The deadline for submitting a letter of interest to the city council for this upcoming council opening is Friday, July 15, at 5:00pm. Gray's term expires January, 1997. The deadline for submitting a letter for the vacancy on the Port Orford planning commission created by the resignation of Toby Dillingham is the same day and time. The council will announce their appointments at their next general meeting.

A report was submitted by Hans Von Spaeth representing the Coast Guard Hill road committee. The road, known as Park Road, would consist of one totally new segment, which when combined with the existing road would create a one way loop in and out of the state park on top of Coast Guard Hill. His group has drawn up a somewhat altered routing to the already existing right-of-way. The new citizen's committee recommendations would create a one way loop with minimal destruction of the mature trees that grace the area around the Coast Guard buildings. I walked the proposed street

routing and parking lot with Mr. Von Spaeth and from the committee's point of view it would be a lot easier on the residents on Flake Street who have to help turn the lost recreational vehicles around. The State of Oregon department of parks and recreation has given the City \$25,000 for this project which was to have been completed by October 1, 1994 but an extension has been granted until June 1, 1995.

There was a lengthy discussion about the Hoffman Driveway paralleling King St. on Coast Guard Hill. The driveway was built on the city right of way among other problems. The city believes an unsafe slope has been created which will further wash away during heavy rains. The council passed a motion to fill in the right of way with rock making the slope safe and bill the property owner for the work and expenses.

The city entered into an agreement with Port Orford Realty for an exclusive listing of its two lots on Coast Guard Hill. P.O. Realty agreed to a 6% commission. The city hopes to clear at least \$60,000 from the sale of the two lots.

The council passed a motion to patch those parts of Agate Beach Road which were destroyed during the sewer construction using sewer contingency fund money. During council discussion it came out that the road is not city property nor county property but belongs to the owners of properties bordering it.

Council members discussed an offer from Rocky McVay, representing the Curry County commissioners, to take over operation or ownership of Edson Creek Park. The park is now closed because of county budget cuts. The council expressed no interest in taking over the park. The deed to the park land stipulates it be used solely as a public park. Otherwise ownership will revert back to Georgia Pacific.

There will be an important town hall meeting at the Sixes Grange Hall on Monday, July 18, at 7:00pm to discuss the park and ways to save it. Once again the North County takes a hit.

The council passed a resolution prohibiting smoking in city buildings and city owned vehicles with two exceptions. They are the Community Building and the A-frame cabin in Buffington Park.

The council voted to send Mayor Delaine Kennedy to the Oregon Mayor's Association meeting in Hood River.

The council voted to draft a letter of support for the proposed North Curry Resource Center. Things like employment services, C.S.D. and volunteer services would use the resource center. Two of the people locally working on the resource center are Janet Pretti and Julie Farmer. The council voted to provide the resource center with free water and sewer during their first year of operation.

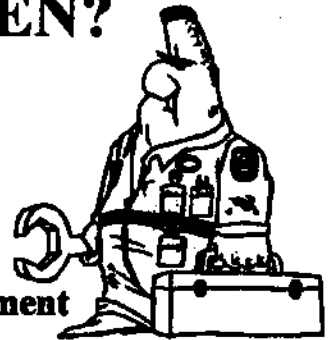

in Curry County. The campaign kicked off May 1 and will end November 1.

## Something's Wrong

In response to learning that myself and a colleague were privileged to attend a national seminar on the AIDS/HIV forum, the "Reverend" Popoff writes that "something is terribly wrong with all of this... I'd like to know why the necessary is held hostage to the trivial." I agree with Karl on one point. Something is terribly wrong. Since the early 1980's 230,000 men, women and children have died in America from AIDS. The international body count is in the millions. The 1994 USA death toll is expected to reach the 100,000 mark - half as many people as have died in the last ten years. The largest population of newly infected people are heterosexuals, mostly adolescents. A town meeting in Port Orford last winter on the subject drew a crowd of two parents. But attending a national conference to learn how to stem the tide of this disease here in Curry County is not what is "terribly wrong."

I must disagree with your characterization of AIDS/HIV as "trivial". There is nothing more necessary than Life. The corpses of 23 men, women and children lying in the morgue of the Coos Bay Hospital last year could hardly be considered inconsequential to their parents, their spouses and their dearest friends.

You suggest that the problems of domestic violence and homelessness should be given priority over education and community action about the power of the

One human tragedy is pitted against another in the political and religious arena until no one is healed. I must also remind you that the majority of people who sit at bedsides, administer medications, and comfort the survivors do so as volunteers.

The human community has many problems. Staying alive and living safely must come first. Regardless of your opinions of the training I received, I will continue to use my commitment to stop the flow of AIDS/HIV into Southern Oregon. Should you or your family or loved ones need my help, I will give it freely.

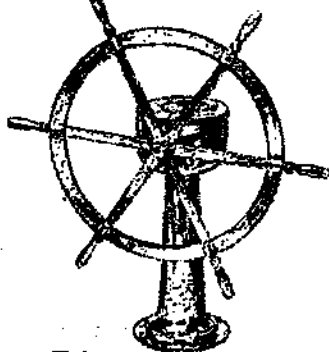

It showed how PHS student projects have actually benefitted local organizations and was produced in the high school's new (and still developing) video production lab.

ected as chairperson and vice chairperson respectively.

Two items will be of interest to the public. 1) Last year the board voted to allow PHS students to play football at Bandon. This year we voted, OSAA permitting, to allow Bandon players to join PHS for soccer.

2) Superintendent Dick Wold reported on the results of the State-Wide Assessment testing done this spring on 3rd, 5th, 8th, and 11th grade students.

The chart below shows the performance statistics. The 8th grade reading score of 6/7, for example, means that the group, on average, was at or above grade level in

six of the seven reading skill areas (such as word meaning, locating information, etc.) Looking at the results in more detail shows that our scores, even where we scored below grade level, are near the state average and do not show any big trouble. (Of course, we'd rather beat the pants off the competition though, wouldn't we?)

Comparing the scores of all students in each grade with the scores of only those students who were in our district last year appears to show that we do a better than average job of preparing our students - the students with 2CJ training did better, on average, than the mixed group of 2CJ and transfer students.

Dick mentioned that Oregon has the #2 position in the country in terms of education and we're holding our own against much larger and richer school districts. I'd say the district, its students, and their parents all have a lot to be proud of.
