The Port Orford Grand Prix II comes to Cape Blanco State Airport Saturday, Sunday and Monday, September 3, 4, 5. Time trials are scheduled for Saturday followed by racing on the triangular shaped track on Sunday and Monday. The races are sponsored by the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce and Team Continental of Portland, a member of the International Conference of Sports Car Clubs. The track is located at Cape Blanco State Airport and consists of the two taxi-ways plus part of the 1 mile long runway. The Chamber has assembled over 2,000 tires for use as public safety barriers. Four organizations and businesses have signed up to provide food at the races.

Tickets are on sale now at the following locations: The Wheelhouse Restaurant, Buck's Sentry Market, The Downtown Fun Zone and Chetco Federal Credit Union. Ticket prices include a pass for all three days are \$15.00 for persons 13 and older while those 12 and younger pay \$10.00. Daily tickets will be available at the gate for \$7.50 for 13 and older and \$5.00 for 12 and younger. The friendly folks staying out at Port Orford Trailer Village have volunteered to do the ticket taking. T-shirts and sweatshirts bearing the logo on the racing posters have been ordered and will be on sale the week prior to the races. The race dinner, catered by Bartlett's and Port and Starboard, is set for Saturday evening, Sep-

tember 4, at the Port Orford Community Building. Space permitting, tickets for this dinner will be sold to the public. There will be a dance after the dinner sponsored by the Port and Starboard with live music and it will be open to one and all.

Bed Tax Committee Update

The recently derailed Port Orford Transient Lodging (Bed Tax) Committee is back in business on Tuesday night, August 23, at 7:00pm. The first step in getting back on track will be at the Port Orford City Council breakfast meeting scheduled for Monday morning, August 22, at 7:00am, at the Wheelhouse Restaurant. The meeting has been changed from being a workshop meeting and it now will be a special session city council meeting. The council will then select one representative each from the bed and breakfasts, RV parks and motel owners to serve on the committee. Currently, there is one bed and breakfast located within the city limits of Port Orford. The draft revision to the original transient lodging tax ordinance which was discussed at the August 9 bed tax meeting has not been determined to be valid. According to city manager Dotti Myers she has found no evidence in going through the records including minutes of old meetings that the draft revision ordinance was passed by the city council.

Eight groups are competing for the approximately \$27,000 in bed taxes for the

fiscal period of 1994-95. The bed tax committee only makes recommendations to the city council as to how to divide up the tax.

Filing Deadline For Council

We don't mean to be repetitious but thought repeating the filing deadline for Port Orford City Council would be worth another paragraph this week. There are 4 openings on the City Council. The positions, incumbents and length of terms are as follows:

The filing deadline for these four councilor seats is August 26, 1994. The nominating petitions are available at the City Hall. You need 25 valid signatures of registered voters to qualify for the November 8 election.

Voters in the November election will be faced with a record number of state-wide ballot measures. They range from Measure 8 which would require public employees to pay 6% of their salaries toward their pensions to Measure 15, also known as Education First, to Measure 18 which would ban the hunting of bears with bait or dogs and the hunting of cougars with dogs to Measure 20, the 2% Equal Tax. In addition voters face a hotly

elect a man and woman precinct person to represent them in the Central Committee at the county level. If all 27 precinct positions are filled the CCRCC would be made up of those 54 persons. Those elected folks then choose officers and delegates to run the county party and also represent Curry Republicans at the state level. Every four years the state party formulates and adopts the party philosophy of government and policy, otherwise known as the party platform, and elects delegates to the Republican National Committee and Presidential convention, which in turn, nominates the party's candidates. The county chairs make up the Republican Congressional Districts. These district committees organize a convention every four years to choose officers (all elected precinct persons may vote) and choose the Electoral College representatives from Oregon. They, in turn, elect our President. It is the job of the CCRCC to recruit and elect Republi-



Port Orford Grand Prix

Labor Day Weekend, September 3, 4 & 5 marks the second annual Port Orford Grand Prix. This is a sports car racing event that is hosted by Team Continental (a Portland based race club) and the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce. The race is sanctioned by the International Conference of Sports Car Clubs, which is the largest sanctioning body in the north-west.

This year will be very unique with a full four days of racing action slated for the temporary circuit located at Cape Blanco State Airport, located 7 miles north of Port Orford. Friday, September 2, will mark the first ever Driving School to be held at the site. The school will be open to anyone in the local area and entry forms can be found at several business locations in the Port Orford area. Saturday will be practice and qualifying sessions from 9:00am to 5:00pm. Sunday and Monday will offer a full slate of ICSCC Championship races with over 200 entries from California to British Columbia expected. With two point races in one weekend this will be a must stop for any driver fighting for a championship in ICSCC.

The over 200 entries expected will have a significant impact on the local economy. A 1993 demographics study of ICSCC drivers reveals that the average entrant will bring 3.8 people with him as a support team. This means when the

drivers are included we can expect 760 people to attend. With a three day event the average entrant will spend \$329 on food and lodging while in the area or a total of \$65,800 for the weekend. This coupled with the fact that 100% of the net proceeds from ticket sales remain in the local area, makes the Port Orford Grand Prix good for business on the South Coast.

Searching For Ancient Fossils

Dave Taylor, PhD, will lead a field trip Thursday, August 25 along the coast from Port Orford to Gold Beach. Dr. Taylor is a Paleontologist with 25 years of experience excavating at sites in Oregon. He is curator of an extensive collection of marine mammals in Portland where he teaches at Portland State University. The field trip will include a look at both the geology and paleontology of Curry County.

The day will start at Cape Blanco with a hike toward the mouth of the Elk River where Dr. Taylor excavated the largest fossil ever found on the Oregon coast, a

one and one half million years old whale. Other finds in northern Curry County have included a Cape Mastodon jaw, fossilized birds and marine invertebrates.

Dr. Taylor will point out some of the spectacular features of the geology of Cape Blanco and the surrounding area. Up to four tectonic plates meet in the sea floor off Cape Blanco. The Cape itself is currently uplifting at the rate of 1"/year.

The day will continue with a drive ending south of Cape Sebastian. Participants will have a chance to stop and look at late Mesozoic and Paleozoic deposits along the way. And, Dr. Taylor will continue to point out interesting geological features

as the trip proceeds. Trip organizers also promise a surprise.

Those participating in the field trip should bring collecting gear including a knife, baggies and tissue paper for secure storage of their finds. Other arrangements will be made for any really large finds. Bring water and a lunch.

Participants should meet in the parking lot of Driftwood Elementary School in Port Orford at 10:00am on August 25. The cost is \$20 for adults and \$10 for students. To reserve a space or for more information call Martha Weaver-Britell at 332-9775. The field trip is sponsored by the Point Orford Heritage Society.
