Tsunami Warning Canceled

Tsunami Warning Canceled by Evan Kramer

I know it seems like old news now but the tsunami warning was canceled on Tuesday afternoon at approximately 3:30pm. The warning was the result of an 8.3 earthquake which had occurred off the north eastern coast of Japan. The Port Orford Fire Department was activated at 2:00pm and participated in the Tsunami alert. One fire truck and crew responded to Battle Rock Park. Their responsibility was to clear the beach and keep people off of it. Another crew went up and down several city streets including Pinehurst and Lakeshore warning residents of the alert. Another crew headed for Dock Road and assisted with the removal of boats from the Port Of Port Orford and keeping spectators away. Battle Rock Park was filled with tsunami watchers by 3:30, many with cameras, telescopes and binoculars. Others reminisced about the "big one" in 1964 when a tsunami hit the coastal town of Crescent City following the Anchorage earthquake and left scars and memories that linger until today. Schools in Brookings and Gold Beach were closed and students sent home early.

Meanwhile news of a structure and grass fire underway in Langlois on Floras Lake Loop Road crackled over the scanner.

Conjuring up wild thoughts about potential damage from the big wave made me think about the set for the movie "Godzilla". The TriStar film company

had started construction of the set for the movie which was to have been a Japanese fishing village at Lone Ranch State Beach, north of Brookings. Construction was halted by problems with the script and it was thought that filming, which was to have begun on November 11, would conflict with winter storms. This all according to the Curry Coastal Pilot. It made me wonder if Godzilla knew something more than the rest of us.

Anne Frank Community Exhibit

The Anne Frank Community Exhibit opened in Brookings on Sunday, October 2, as part of a national tour. Valerie and I traveled down scenic Highway 101 to see the exhibit which is being held at the Chetco Community Public Library in Brookings. The beautiful new library is located on Alder Street, just west of Hwy 101 at the south end of Brookings (Turn right just before the Dairy Queen.)

Part of the exhibit traces the life story of Anne Frank and her family from Anne's birth in Germany to the Frank family's move to Amsterdam in 1933, through the early years of the Nazi nightmare as it spread from Germany through Europe, continuing with the family's going into hiding in a secret annex in an office building in Amsterdam on July 6, 1942. The Frank family was taken into custody on August 4, 1944. Anne Frank and her sister Margot died of typhus in the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp in March of 1945. Only Anne's father Otto survived

the holocaust. The Frank family's only "crime" was the fact that they were Jewish. Anne kept a diary for more than two years while she, her family, the Van Daan family and Mr. Dussel hid from the Nazi's. It was left behind when Anne was taken away and saved by friends of the family. It has been reproduced as a book entitled, *Anne Frank, Diary of a Young Girl*, and has been turned into a play, movie and television show.

When you first enter the library one of the exhibit volunteers asks if you would like to have a number tattooed on your arm. If you agree a series of numbers is rubber stamped on your left arm. Concentration camp prisoners were tattooed with numbers. The "tattoo" you receive at the library can be washed off. The ones worn by survivors of Bergen-Belsen, Auschwitz and other Nazi concentration camps were permanent and for the survivors of the camps a reminder of a world gone mad.

At least half of the room is taken up by an exhibit on loan from the Simon Wiesenthal Center in Los Angeles. It outlines in a series of photos and articles the story of the methodical annihilation of Jews, gypsies, communists, liberals, homosexuals and others whom the Nazi's deemed not worthy of the new Aryan world order. Photos of piles of emaciated human bodies being bulldozed into makeshift graves after the war was over by an English soldier, artwork by concentra-

Letter To The Editor,

To: Mayor Delaine Kennedy

You and the city council were commended and applauded for taking action in the Bussmann watershed debacle. You wisely retained attorney Frank Hilton and obtained a stipulated agreement to require the Bussmanns to remediate their mischief in damaging the city's water supply.

The Bussmanns have not met the date specified for completion of the necessary repairs. The Bussmanns have again failed to perform what they agreed to do and have demonstrated not only contempt of court, but contempt for the citizens of Port Orford. The Bussmanns don't have to drink the Port Orford water and they could care less about those who do.

The failure to appear at the September 21 meeting also illustrates the complete lack of responsibility felt by the perpetrators of this outrage.

It is now time to request attorney Hilton to file a motion in circuit court to have the Bussmanns show cause why they should not be held in contempt of court. The City should also request injunctive relief

in the form of an order for ALL work on the property be halted until all agencies involved in oversight have the opportunity to reexamine the damage done and the feeble efforts to repair that damage. Imposition of a performance bond should also be considered. Surely the City Manager has been keeping records of all of the costs incurred by the City in this fiasco. All labors, materials, legal fees and other direct costs should be totaled and the court petitioned to award the City both actual and punitive damages.

By the way, when the Bussmanns file their application for sub-division of the property with the planning commission, please remember how they have demonstrated their greed, incompetence and

total disregard for the community well being. The sub-division application should be evaluated in minute detail. The planning commission should be made aware of the well-founded concerns of the citizens of Port Orford about any project undertaken by the Bussmanns. The commission, before considering granting approval, should remember this unhappy affair and require the most stringent sanctions and safeguards for our protection.

It is suggested that you and the council act quickly to implement legal action to correct our immediate problem.

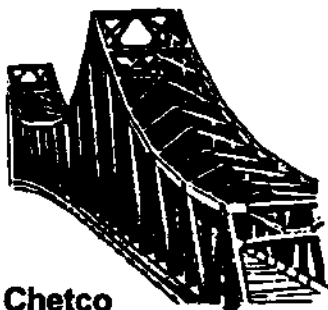
