Mayor Kennedy Hospitalized Council Makes Appointments by Evan Kramer

Mayor Delaine Kennedy left the City Council meeting on Monday night holding her side in pain. Later that evening she was taken to Bay Area Hospital. As of Wednesday morning she was still at Bay Area and is scheduled for gall bladder surgery today. We hope for the best and a speedy recovery to Delaine who has done a great healing job as Port Orford's mayor.

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday, October 10, rolled up their sleeves and got right down to business.

Those councilors attending the meeting were George Kennedy, Todd Smith, Martha Weaver-Britell, Tim Sparks and Mayor Delaine Kennedy. Former Mayor Mary Yoder sat in the audience at the meeting as she often does. Mary is now the president of the Senior Center.

Rick Cook spoke to the council under public input about the disbursement of city bed tax funds. He asked the council if they were going to ignore the advice of their lawyer, Lynn Heusinkveld, who had written a letter concerning the city's disbursement of bed tax funds. (Not only has the bed tax ordinance been interpreted in different ways but so has Mr. Heusinkveld's letter.) City Manager Dotti Myers said she would speak to Mr. Heusinkveld and ask him if the city has violated the ordinance and then get back

to Rick Cook. Jim Grantland spoke to the council on the subject and told them if they are in error they've been in error for the past several years.

The City's engineer, Matt Gray, from H.G.E. spoke to the council about the sewer project, water situation and Garrison Lake water study. He said the new sewer plant would be on-line by October 27. He asked for additional funding for several items for the sewer project from the contingency fund and they were approved.

Gray said in regards to the North Fork Hubbard Creek the Bussmanns had completed the remedial work required by the Oregon Department of Forestry. The City received a letter from Gary Schulz, Forest Practices Forester, O.D.F., dated October 4 that confirmed the property owners are now in compliance. Dotti did say that the city's lawsuit against the Bussmanns for damages would be on December 13.

The council voted to accept a contract with SRI/Shapiro for a study of an underground water source known as the Garrison Lake Reconnaissance Contract at a cost not to exceed \$2,592.00.

The City Council accepted a bid by Riffle's Repair for work on its front end loader at a cost of \$4475. It was the only bid.

The council appointed Ellen Warring to fill one of two vacancies on the Port

Orford Planning Commission.

Mirleen O'Hearn was named to the fill a vacancy on the Hubbard Creek/Garrison Lake Watershed Council.

By a 4-0 vote the council hired Norma House to fill the position of City Planner. She will work on a trial basis for six months.

The council at the suggestion of Mayor Kennedy named Robert Warring as the city council liaison person with the planning commission.

The council passed a resolution proclaiming the week of October 23-31 as Red Ribbon Week. Citizens are encouraged to wear red ribbons indicating their support of a drug free community in Port Orford.

Mayor Kennedy did the first reading of an ordinance amending ordinance #278, the zoning ordinance of the City of Port Orford. The amendment deals with development in areas of geological hazard. The council deadlocked with Weaver-Britell and Smith voting for it and George Kennedy and Tim Sparks voting against. Mayor Kennedy, who votes only when there is a tie, stepped up to the plate and voted for the amendment and it passed.

Martha Weaver-Britell, who serves as parks commissioner for the city council, spoke on the city parks said she wanted

Voter Registration

There are a few short days left to register to vote. The deadline for filing is Tuesday, October 18, at 5:00pm. First time voters and people who have changed their address or name need to fill out a voter registration card. Meanwhile, absentee ballots have already started going out for the Tuesday, November 8 general election. According to Shannon at the Curry County Elections Department the County voter's pamphlet will be mailed out to voters this week and she thought the state voter's pamphlet would be mailed out on Tuesday, October 11. A voter registrar will be in Port Orford at the City Hall on Tuesday, October 18, from 1:00-4:00pm to sign up voters and distribute applications for absentee ballots.

Curry County voters will choose between Republican T.V. Skinner and Democrat Marilyn Schafer to fill the County Commissioner position now held by Peg Reagan. Schafer defeated Reagan in the Democratic primary. On the state-wide front incumbent Republican state legislator Veral Tarno won both the Republican and Democratic primary elections in May and faces no challenge to another two year term. Tarno's name will appear under the Republican heading on the ballot.

Curry County voters will vote on two county measures in the form of serial levies. One is a five year serial levy for operation of the Justice Courts in Brookings and Port Orford. The levy, which would begin in fiscal year 1995-96 would raise \$109,317 a year for five years. The "estimated" tax effect on the property owner would be an increase in their bill of 8 1/2 cents per thousand dollars of assessed value. A homeowner with a house worth \$100,000 would pay an additional \$8.50 a year. The money raised from this levy if passed would go to funding the justice courts in Brookings and Port Orford only.

The other measure is a three year serial levy for the sheriff's department operations. It would raise \$2,303,430 a year and the effect on property taxes would be to raise them \$1.80 per thousand dollars

of assessed valuation. A homeowner with a house assessed at \$100,000 would pay an additional \$180.00 a year. The wording in this levy specifies that all money raised from it would go to fund the sheriff's department only.

The City of Port Orford has four councilor positions on the ballot. Three persons, Robert Warring and incumbents Carl Eskelson and Tim Sparks, filed for the three four year positions. Voters will have a choice for the two year position, choosing between Martha Weaver-Britell and David Elsdon.

The tax collection office in Gold Beach has informed us that property tax bills should be on their way or in your mail box by October 17. By law they have to be mailed by October 25 with the first payment due on November 15.

Congratulations to the Crazy Norwegians on the completion of their first (and successful) year in Port Orford.

She stated she wanted to build a rapport with commissioners Rocky McVay and Terry Hanscom. Schafer told the crowd "Let's stop fighting, let's all work together". She talked about the Port of Brookings-County land sale and said she would have done things differently. She has been involved with the Regional Strategies Board involved in where we are going by the year 2010. She spoke about her involvement with eco-tourism and the Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor Schafer, who worked hard to form the Tri-City council says she works well with other south coast mayors and city managers including Port Orford city manager Dotti Myers and Mayor Kennedy.

When questioned about the county measure concerning the sheriff's department serial levy Schafer said she would probably vote against it. In response to other questions she stated her opposition to Measures 13 and 15 and came down particularly hard on Measure 20, the 2% Equal Tax Amendment which she said would take a bad toll on Oregon made products. In response to a question about the Curry County planning commission she said she didn't believe the make up of the commission violated state law. Schafer said she would be willing to look at home rule for the county and would be in favor of forming a committee to study the idea if elected.


