





Your Computer Is Under Attack! by Valerie Jean Kramer

Has your computer ever locked up and you had to turn it off and on to fix it? Ever had to replace parts that failed for no obvious reason? Ever lost data and didn't know why? Had modem or network errors? All of these symptoms can be caused by problems with your electric power. I recently learned a LOT about power problems and cures.

Before I went to COMDEX this year, I was pretty complacent about power. I had surge suppressers on all of my machines and figured I was OK. Wrong! In this part of the country we can expect that in an average year we will experience 7,056 power problems! That's 6497 spikes, 502 surges, 27 sags, and 30 outages. True, many of these last for such a small fraction of a second that you can't see them but they can devastate a computer that routinely dices up a second into 33, 66, or 100 million parts! Here's a bit of what I learned.

A spike, or transient, is a very brief pulse of very high voltage. The voltage may reach several thousand volts but only for a few millionths of a second. You won't even know it happened. Spikes can be caused by lightning strikes or when a large load (such as a sawmill, electric heater, etc.) is switched on or off.

A surge, or overvoltage, is when the voltage increases slightly for a brief period. The voltage may rise 5, 10, 20 volts or more but significantly less than the thousands of volts in a spike. It may last for 1/20 of a second to a few seconds but significantly longer than the instantaneous spikes. You may see the lights flicker. Surges are caused by large load changes or power company switching.

Sags or brownouts are the opposite of surges. The voltage can drop 5, 10, 20 volts or more. You may see the lights flicker. Sags are commonly caused by electric motors starting (such as your home's refrigerator or heat pump or a

sawmill down the road) or by faults on the power company's lines.

Outages or Blackouts are when the power disappears completely. Outages are frequently caused by wind, auto accident, tree limbs, etc. that knock down power lines.

Any of these conditions can cause immediate failure, system lockup, loss of data, or can weaken parts resulting in later failure. I've been monitoring the power in the shop for almost 24 hours now. It seems we have consistently low voltage with frequent variations of 2-3 volts and at least three sags to a point where a computer might fail. As I write this, my line voltage is fluctuating between 111 and 116 volts.

The good news is that you can protect yourself against any or all of these conditions. There are several types of devices, each designed to protect against various power problems.

A "surge suppresser" offers protection against spikes. (Watch out for rip-offs with names such as "surge stick" that actually offer no power protection!) The more expensive (\$50 & up) may also provide some surge protection or offer protection for phone lines, satellite cable protection, etc. A surge suppresser is a must for any expensive electronics such as computers, TV's, satellite systems, stereos, copy machines, etc.

A Line Conditioner is a device that will offer protection against spikes, surges, and sags but offers no protection against outages.

A UPS (Uninterruptable Power Supply) is a device that can solve all of these power problems. The UPS includes batteries and circuitry that allows it to provide power for a few minutes even when the power from the wall dips or goes out. This gives you time to save your work and shut your computer off. There are many different kinds of UPS and a wide range of quality and features.

Now is a good time to evaluate whether your equipment is properly protected and to take action before the full winter storms hit! I'll be happy to help you evaluate your needs.






