Sewer Rates To Rise

New Faces, Same Places by Evan Kramer

The New Year's celebrating and bowl games are behind us now. Now the political activity begins in earnest (not P. Worri!). The House of Representatives has a new Speaker and for the first time in 40 years a Republican. I know we can anticipate Speaker Newt Gingrich making things very interesting in Washington DC the next two years. Over on the Senate side Bob Dole assumes the role of Senate Majority Leader, a position he held for the first six years of the Reagan Presidency. John Kitzhaber steps into the governor's seat in Salem replacing Barbara Roberts who chose not to run for reelection.

[I was listening to CNN on TV this morning and it seems Valerie heard a bit too much about the Republicans and Democrats. She said now she knows why government is so expensive - they're always partying. It's about time they got down to business. Looks like this year they might just do that.]

The Curry County Board of Commissioners has a new member as of Tuesday, January 3, 1995. T. V. Skinner, who was elected in November, took his position on the Board replacing Peg Reagan. Commissioner Reagan served one four-year term on the Board and got there by defeating Skinner four years ago. Skinner joins Terry Hanscam and Rocky McVay on the Board.

The first Port Orford City Council meeting of 1995 is set for Monday, January 9, at 7:00pm. There will be a public hearing starting at 6:30pm regarding the raising of sewer rates within the city. The rates will be raised to approximately \$30.50 a month. The purpose of the public hearing is "to inform the citizens of the need to increase rates and receive input from them." I would advise as many of you as possible to attend this hearing.

The Council will add one new member. Robert Warring will replace Gary Doran who did not seek reelection. On Monday night, recently reelected council persons Martha Weaver-Britell, Carl Eskelson and Tim Sparks, will begin new terms of office. Also returning this year are Ralph Donaldson, George Kennedy and Mayor Delaine Kennedy. We are talking about a trial by fire for these new and old councilors over the sewer rates.

One elected official who is not returning this year to fill out his six year term of office is Justice of the Peace Richard AuFranc. The voters turned down a serial levy to fund the two Justice of the Peace Courts in Curry County last November. County commissioners provided no budget for the courts starting in January 1995 and threw the funding into the hands of the beleaguered taxpayers. The rest, as they say, is history. I have used that court and am sorry to see it go, but the voters have spoken.

Want to participate in the governing pro-

cess? Several special district elections will be held on Tuesday, March 28, 1995. There are openings on the Port Orford Library board, 2CJ School District and Port Orford Rural Fire Board. The deadline for filing for positions on these boards is 5:00pm, January 26, 1995. There are two ways to get on the ballot. The easiest way is go down to the County Clerk Election's Division office in Gold Beach at the county courthouse and fill out an application and pay a \$10.00 filing fee. The other way is go to the same office and get a petition that you will then need to fill with at least 25 valid voter signatures of people who live within the special district. This will save you the \$10 fee.

There is no salary and to my knowledge few if any benefits in being elected to a taxing district board. The most important aspect is that you can be one of the people making the decisions on how the money is spent. Why not spend some of your time working from within rather than always complaining about the way things are run. Unless you are on the city council or school board when a "hot" topic is being discussed the meetings are sparsely attended. Give it a chance.


We lost a true friend of the Library last week—Roy Lundholm. Roy was on duty




Everyone is invited to the monthly meeting and potluck of the Port Orford Art Council on Friday, January 6, 1995, at the Senior Center.
