Winter Kayak Challenge by Evan Kramer

Port Orford played host to the 1995 Oregon Coast Winter Kayak Challenge this past Thursday, February 2. Three men, Steph Dutton, Dave Slover and Lee Bonfiglio, set out along the ocean at Smith River on January 27 in their kayaks bound for the Maritime Museum at Astoria. The press release that accompanied them states this is the "first ever transit of the Oregon Coast in winter" in a kayak.

The purpose of kayaking north along the entire Oregon coast is to raise money for the Doernbecher Children's Hospital in Portland. Pledges can be made by phone by calling Dave Slover's place of employment which is the Alder Creek Supply Company at 503-285-0464 or mailing them to Alder Creek Kayak Supply, 250 N.E. Tomahawk Island Dr., Portland, OR 97217.

The men are paddling their way in Eddyline expedition outfitted sea kayaks. Steph Dutton works as the Ambassador for Eddlyine Kayaks. He lost his right leg in 1980 as a result of being hit by a vehicle while serving as a firefighter two years earlier. After losing his leg he became a paramedic and later graduated from the state police academy and worked as an undercover narcotics detective for several years.

Dutton is also the first person to kayak from British Columbia to Baia California, starting in Victoria and ending in Ensenada. This was a benefit for Team USAble, an organization which provides outdoor recreation activities for the disabled. Dave Slover is the sales and tour manager for Alder Creek Kayak in Portland. He loves the outdoors and has worked as rafting and kayak guide as well as instructor. Lee Bonfiglio is the co-owner of Lightning Paddles and National Sales Manager for USIA Drysuits. He is 25 and has been kayaking since the age of ten. He has been competing in the Whitewater Freestyle competition events and won the Gold Medal as the 1993 World Freestyle Squirt Champion at the World Freestyle Championships held on the Ococe River in Tennessee.

The winter kayak challenge has a support van and trailer being driven by Heidi. She maintains radio contact with the kayakers and drives ahead to scout out landing conditions. Accompanying everyone on the trip are a Blue Front Amazon parrot named Pirate and an 11 year old Chesapeake Bay Retriever named Doxie. Pirate is one of the more talkative parrots I've run across and is taking the whole tour in stride as he startles people who pass by the van with his loud chatter.

The people of Oregon have opened their hearts to the kayakers. One person in Brookings loaded them up with food to take with them. The manager, Mary Miller and the owners of the Castaway Motel donated a room for the night at the motel on Thursday and a local citizen treated them to a hearty breakfast at the Wheelhouse Restaurant on Friday moming. Steph told me that on his BC to BC '93 trip the people in Oregon treated him the best of the three states and two countries he visited.

After eating, they drove down to Dock Beach and started getting their kayaks ready. They carry a supply of fresh water, compasses, maps, camera, short wave radio and are dressed for wet and cold conditions. Dutton, Bonfiglio and Slover set off at Dock Beach at 9:30am, paddled past the breakwater and headed for Face Rock in Bandon. They picked a great day as the waves were relatively small though some of the fishermen told me there was a large swell in the ocean that day.

Conditions on Thursday when they left from Gold Beach for Port Orford were so bad that only Dutton made it past the breakers while the other two traveled north in the van.

One interesting side note. Steph is making his second sea going excursion of the Oregon coast yet he has never seen it from a car traveling on Highway 101. But just imagine what a view and a different perspective he has than the rest of us land lovers. Good luck to the Winter Kayak Challenge.







Volunteers needed for Sixes River tree planting

A work day to benefit fish and wildlife habitat is planned for the Sixes River on Saturday, February 11th, from 9 am to 3 pm, at Cape Blanco State Park, Spruce trees, willow cutings and native shrubs will be planted along the stream bank. Gloves, work boots, rain gear and a sack lunch are needed; coffee and pop will be provided. The event is sponsored by the volunteer program of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and Oregon

The work day is part of a larger effort to restore habitat along the lower Sixes River, and at the same time protect the valuable agricultural land in the area by reducing stream bank erosion. Healthy vegetation provides low cost protection along Oregon's many streams and rivers. This "riparian zone" of vegetation also keeps water temperatures cool for young salmon, and provides food and shelter for a wide variety of wildlife species.



What About Backups?

There are two kinds of computer users in the world: Those who firmly believe in good backups, and those who will. The programs and data on your computers disk drives can be lost due to any of many causes such as mistaken deletion, malicious damage by a virus, or because of mechanical or electrical failure. These files represent an investment that should be protected.

If damaged or lost, the programs can be re-installed from the original vendors' disks but this is time consuming, the disks themselves may have become damaged, and you may not be able to remember exactly how you had the software configured for your printer, mouse, video monitor, etc. It is much easier to simply restore the files from a recent backup!

Data that you have created is another story. Your word processing documents, spreadsheets, accounting files, and database information is not available anywhere but on your hard disk and on the backups you have made!

In the good old days, we backed up our 20Mb, 40Mb and even 80Mb or 120Mb hard disks to floppy disks. A 120Mb hard disk could require as many as 80 floppy disks! With today's 340Mb, 540Mb or 1Gb disk drives, floppy disk backup has become impractical. Unfortunately, many people haven't given the matter much thought and have disasters just waiting to happen!

Modern disks need larger backup media and the most cost-effective solution is a tape drive. Today's typical tape drives hold more than 100Mb per tape, often up to 350Mb or 420Mb per tape! Another benefit of tape is that you can start the backup and let it run overnight unattended. No need for someone to sit at the computer laborously inserting floppy disks for hours at a time. A Colorado Jumbo 250 tape drive sells for about \$160 and can hold up to 250Mb per tape. Tapes sell for about \$17-20 each. (By comparison, one tape holds as much as 175 floppy disks which would cost \$87.50!)

You should use at least three sets of backup tapes and rotate them. The first week, backup to set 1. The next week to set 2. The third week to set 3. The fourth week you re-use set 1, and so on. Businesses may want to use a series of three tape sets for weekly backups and a separate series of three sets for end-of-month backups, end of quarter backups, end of year backups, etc. A good backup plan can take time to develop and is a bit of work to live with but I have seen a single backup tape save a company \$10,000,000,00 and have read of other companies that went out of business for lack of good backups. It's worth it!

About Printers

There are three kinds of printers in common use: Dot Matrix, Ink Jet, and Laser. Actually, all three kinds print by forming





an image made of tiny dots. "Dot Matrix" today really means an impact printer where tiny wires push a ribbon against the paper to form the series of dots that make up your characters. 9-pin Dot Matrix printers have 9 wires in the print head and produce a more coarse image than the 24-pin printers which use 24 wires. Dot matrix printers are slower, noisier, and produce a lower quality image than ink jets or laser printers but they are also cheaper and can print on 2-part, 3-part or other multi-part forms. Many dot matrix printers can print in color with an optional color kit. Dot matrix printers should be chosen if you must print to multi-part forms or if cost must be kept to a minimum and print quality can be sacrificed (such as on a home system.)

Ink Jet printers spit little dots of liquid ink onto the paper to form the image. They are quiet, fairly fast, and produce a very high quality image - often indistinguishable from a laser printout. Their cost is in between dot matrix and laser printers. The biggest drawback is that the ink will smear if it gets wet. Setting a coffee cup down on an ink jet printout can totally ruin it. You cannot use multi-part forms with an ink jet printer since there is no impact to transfer the image to the second and subsequent copies. Many ink jet printers include the ability to print in color. Ink jet printers should be chosen for economical high-quality printouts or for high-quality color printouts. They make great home printers for the more

About Printers - Continued

affluent and may be a good choice for a second printer, especially if you already have a dot matrix or a laser printer. Some models hold only one cartridge which must be changed to switch between printing black and color documents.

Laser printers are also quiet, fast, and produce very high quality images. They work by melting small particles of plastic onto the paper. They are the most expensive of our three kinds of printers and cannot print in color nor can they use multi-part forms. Laser printouts will not smear if they get wet. Laser printers should be chosen where speed and quality are more important than cost. They are often a first choice for businesses where printouts are to be mailed out and a smeared document could affect your company's image.

Be sure to look at both initial cost and operating expense. In many cases a printer with a lower cost will use higher cost ribbons or toner thus making it the more expensive printer over its entire life. One printer we encountered was great in many ways until it was discovered that it could only print about three pages from one \$8 ribbon!



This past weekend Valerie and I decided to "get away" and go to the big city. No. we don't mean Coos Bay. We drove up to Portland and staved in the shadow of the new basketball arena across the Willamette from downtown. On Sunday we drove east through the Columbia Gorge along Interstate 84 to Cascade Locks. I had only been through the Gorge once before many years ago at a different time of year. We drove only as far as Cascade Locks and then turned around and headed back to Portland. The cascades at Cascades Locks were covered over with water well before we got there. Actually they disappeared in 1937 when Bonneville Dam went into operation.

We picked up the very narrow and historic Columbia River Highway between Ainsworth State Park and Troutdale. This road is more interesting than the freeway and takes you right by Oneonata Gorge and Latourell Falls as well as several other worthwhile stopping places. The Highway also led to Crown Point where the historic Vista House sits perched atop the Gorge affording visitors a really incredible view. Vista House was closed for the winter but when it reopens it will serve travelers as a visitor center and gift shop.
