No, there's isn't going to be an Ed Wood Film Festival at the Star Theater in Port Orford. Instead, mark your calendars. The Port Orford City Council meets on Monday night, March 13, at 7:00pm for their regularly scheduled monthly meeting. Topping the agenda will be consideration of at least two different resolutions concerning raising the sewer rate fees. The council met in special session Wednesday, March 1 to work on the sewer fee schedule. The council first considered and voted on two ordinances. #0195-03 and 0195-04, providing for the issuance and sale of City of Port Orford revenue installment sewer bonds in the amount of \$900,000. They both passed unanimously.

The council then settled into considering a resolution providing for changes and rates for the City of Port Orford's sewer system. This is a departure from the original resolution which was based around the concept of E.D.U.s (Equivalent Dwelling Unit - how much an average household would consume in water per month). However, a motion was made by Martha Weaver-Britell to table the resolution until the following week. She was concerned that since the new resolution was different than the previous one, the people needed to know about it before the council voted. Her motion was seconded and the vote was 3-3. Mayor Delaine Kennedy broke the tie by voting to table and that, as they say, was that, last Wednesday.

The following is a summary of the newest sewer rate increase resolution.

Section # 1: Rates

Bond Payment - based on 500 users

Bond Payment \$48,916 due annually = \$16.30 per user

Sewer Debt Reserve \$4895 due annually = \$1.64 per user

Sewer Equipment Reserve \$4980 duc annually = \$1.66 per user

Total Bi-monthly billing bond payment per user \$19.60

Consumption Rate - pays for operation and maintenance of new sewer plant

\$130,000 divided by 42,000,000 gallons of water estimated yearly use = \$3.10 per 1,000 gallons

To sum it up all users share equally in the bond payment and reserve funds. Each user then only pays for what they consume in water for the operation and maintenance of the plant. This will benefit small users because with the original resolution you would have paid for a minimum of one E.D.U. Now, if you use less than one E.D.U. you pay only for the water you use.

For a complete copy of the resolution

which includes a page of general regulations, stop by City Hali before Monday and get one. They will also be available at the meeting on Monday night.

The Port Orford Chamber of Commerce board of directors met last week and unanimously agreed to support the new resolution as described above. The Chamber's position is that all subscribers should share equally in paying the sewer debt. A letter was sent to Chamber members and other business owners supporting the new resolution.

Winter Challenge Ends in Triumph

Steph Dutton, the disabled athlete who successfully paddled the US Pacific Coast in 1993 from Canada to Mexico, added another milestone to his sait water career on Sunday, February 27, when he paddled up the Columbia River. His arrival at the Columbia River Maritime Museum in Astoria completed the 295 mile Oregon Coast Winter Challenge.

In past issues you've read how the three

man team started on Jan. 27 and how his partners, Lee Bonfiglio and Dave Slover, had to leave the event. Heidi Tiura, expedition manager and navigator, stayed on with Dutton to complete the Challenge, a fund raising effort for Doernbecher Children's Hospital in Portland.

"The Oregon coast, where tourists flock just to watch storms, is not a place I would have chosen to paddle alone in the winter," Dutton said. "But when my

companions left, I had no choice. When I agreed to do this, I swore I'd finish."

"I think I have an advantage being disabled," says Dutton. "I'm accustomed to pain. I've learned to let it wash over me,"


When he agreed to participate in the Challenge, Dutton asked that it be used as a fund-raiser for Doembecher. His inspiration came from family friend Brandon Howe, 8, of Astoria. Brian was diagnosed with a brain tumor at age five and is being treated at Doernbecher. The Howe family credits Doernbecher with saving Brandon's life.

Heidi Tiura is a licensed vessel master and very familiar with the open sea. She has worked on tugboats in Alaska, Washington and Oregon and is currently operating Triumph II, an anchorage launch vessel based in Astoria.

Dear Editor.

The forthcoming vote on the anschlus of Curry County by SWOCC is an issue of major importance for the taxpayers in the county.

I am most bothered with the apparent lack of depth of reasoning and misinformation being disseminated around regarding the implications of the proposed measure.

While I can fathorn a potential advantage to Curry County with the proposed location of an arm of SWOCC in our midst, I am not convinced that more than rudimentary academic offerings to ever be offered in the county.

The proponents of the measure keep on promising us there will be no (immediate) impact on our property taxes. While it is true that the tax rate earmarked for education on the assessed value of our property cannot surpass a given ceiling, Our officials have already discovered

means to circumvent the voters' wishes by considerably increasing the assessed valuation each year and thus making more money available. Furthermore, there will be a negative impact on pre-community-college educational needs in the county.

One needs to have the entire contractual arrangement. What exactly shall we get and where and when will it be made available? Will local students have toll-free access to Coos Bay college faculty and computer facilities including the Internet? Will SWOCC commit to offer here a variety of quality academic programs or will it more of the underwater basket-weaving, aerobic-dancing, crafts & gardening variety? What are the long term commitments and impact on property taxes? Can we secode if it becomes prohibitively expensive?

We are facing here another case of something, while potentially beneficial, being rammed down our throats by self-serving interests without sufficient time and information made available to consider the implications. Let us refrain from rushing to adapt a half-baked idea, especially when the proponents will not reveal the details. Under the circumstances, my vote at this time must be NO.


