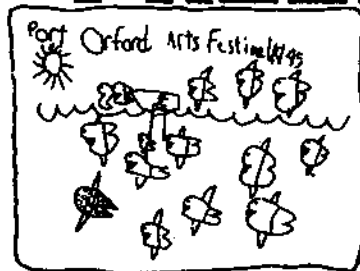

Arts Festival This Weekend

Council Highlights

A standing room only crowd greeted the city council on Monday night. The large gathering was prompted by concerns about the deck at Battle Rock Park.

Beautification Committee member Ruth Bryant read a letter to the City Council. They are dropping their plans for a whale watching observation deck at Battle Rock Park. Their letter is reprinted in a different section in this newspaper.

The Council received a letter from their lawyer in Coquille. It was requested that the letter only be read at executive session and not be made available to the public. The opinion of the attorney is that leasing the land to the Common Good is not the correct use for that land.

The council discussed a proposed retreat. Carl Eskelson said the retreat was not a desirable idea. Ralph Donaldson said he couldn't be part of a trip to Brookings with meals and a motel room that many local citizens couldn't afford. Robert Warring spoke in favor but suggested it be held at a local historical building. George Kennedy said the council should get away so they wouldn't have citizen input. Martha Weaver Britell said the council needs more input and wanted to keep the retreat in town. Delaine Kennedy said it would give the council a chance to be relaxed and to give it a chance. She said the council could do some visioning.

Dotti Myers talked about the council using the retreat for goal setting. After all was said and done the council voted to table the retreat until after the master water plan system grants are written.

The council passed a motion to buy 2 new blowers for the sewer treatment plant after hearing from Matt Grey, from H.G.E. The City has already spent \$5,000 on two rebuilt blowers for the new sewage treatment plant. The council and city manager Dotti Myers worked Grey over before approving this motion. Part of the motion requires that H.G.E. pay the difference in price between the 2 used blowers the city bought and these new ones. George Kennedy told Grey that H.G.E. should stick to the contracted price of the sewer treatment plant.

John Mayea gave a report on the watershed council. He spoke of the two projects the council has had approved including a newsletter and a project to construct two weirs, one at the Arizona Street culvert one on Mill Creek. Mayea asked the council for a memorandum of understanding between the city and the state on the project. He asked them to approve the weir project and provide two loads of shale, the use of a back hoe and city operator to unload the shale and for the city to maintain it. Maintenance will include removing the boards in winter and putting them back in summer. The weirs are to be constructed of pre-cast concrete. The purpose of the weirs is to

increase biofiltration of the water entering Garrison Lake from the Mill Creek drainage.

The council appointed George Kennedy to the safety committee and Robert Warring to the Coast Policy Advisory Committee on Transportation.

The council said good night Gracie, good night George.

The plans called for:

1. Erosion control
2. Redoing the pathways
3. Cleaning out brush and replanting
4. Replacing the existing picnic tables
5. Building an amphitheater around the existing steps
6. Building a whale observation deck

We started with the observation deck because we felt that it would not only be aesthetically pleasing but that it would draw in tourists who right now see our vacant buildings and "For Sale" signs and drive right through our town.

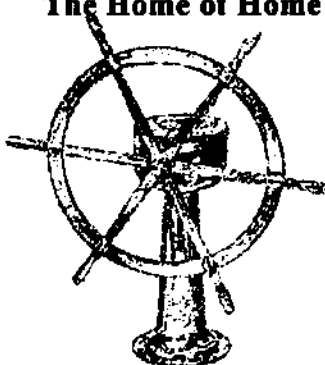
To the Editor,

Garrison Lake has a unique factor that is not apparent unless one uses local common sense. Quite simply the lake has twice as much water flowing into it as flows out of the outlet. This can be best observed in August and September. During these two months the outflow slackens to a drizzle.

The unique factor is that the inflow continues to fill the lake with additional water. For some reason, that is not apparent, the lake maintains its mean level year around. The obvious conclusion here is that somewhere there must be a free natural supply of water available at con-

stant hydrostatic pressure. (If law, action-reaction).

This hydrostatic pressure manifests in constant year around artesian wells on Coast Guard Hill. The lake is the aquifer that supplies the purified water to the artesian well-heads. The several small creeks that flow from Coast Guard Hill are artesian outflows from Garrison Lake.

In my opinion Port Orford has an option to develop a local gravity water system without applying for a grant. This option may not be as much fun to the City Council as strutting around on a spree spending other peoples money. Finding local popular solutions to difficult City problems can also be fun.

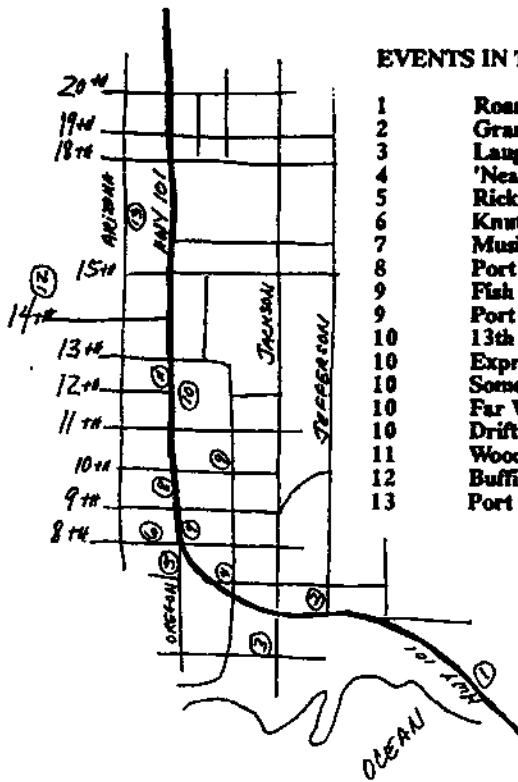

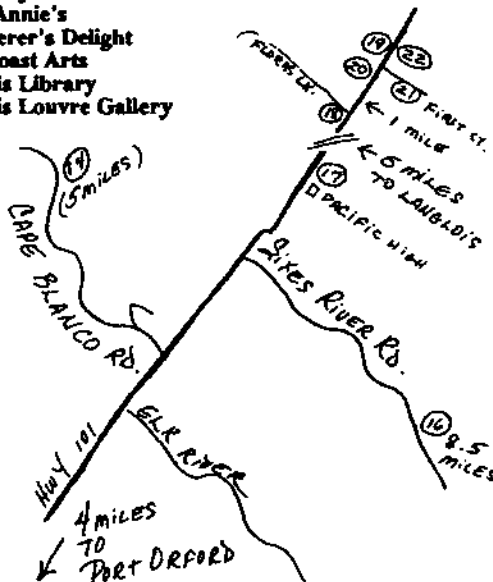
