Council Sets Water Priorities by Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday morning, May 22, and continued their discussions concerning the City's Water System Master Plan.

Martha Weaver-Britell presented the council and public with a print-out of her recommendations of water system improvements by priority and including revised costs. George Kennedy suggested the council add some money to the plan to explore the possibilities of finding and using well water. Ralph Donaldson concurred and recommended the city to "get going on wells."

Martha Weaver-Britell presented a motion to the council to have the City affirm Hubbard Creek as its primary water source and Garrison Lake as its secondary water source. The motion passed 4-1 with Councilor George Kennedy dissenting. The council agreed to write a letter and send it Premium Pacific/Blue Water Harvestors (the fish processing firms at the Port of Port Orford) informing them about this motion.

The council members put in their two cents about which were their priorities including George Kennedy who wanted the new Garrison Lake intake placed higher on the priority list of improvements. Robert Warring said he had no pet projects. He favored treatment plant

and Hubbard Creek raw water line improvements.

Martha Weaver-Britell made a motion setting the following priorities and that they be done simultaneously in a block. This motion passed unanimously. The following is the order of priority and costs:

1. Dredging of Hubbard Creek impoundment \$49,950
 2. Minimum replacement of Hubbard Creek Raw Water Line..... \$291,600
 3. Minimum water treatment plant improvements \$316,150
 4. New Garrison Lake Intake .. \$60,750
- Total estimated cost..... \$718,450

The second group of priorities are as follows:

1. Distribution pump station improvements
2. Balance of water treatment plant improvements
3. Reservoir improvements
4. Rebuild second Hubbard Creek pump
5. Balance of Hubbard Creek raw water line
6. Distribution line improvements

Total cost of entire project if completed would be \$1,542,495

Ralph Donaldson made a motion to hire H.G.E. to write the grants for the water project at a cost of \$3,000. It passed unanimously. H.G.E. had faxed the council a bid on completing the Oregon Community Block Grant application for a fixed fee of \$3,000 at 10:00am that morning. The city manager was asked to send Senator Brenda Brecke and Representative Veral Tarno a letter informing them of the grant application. George Kennedy requested the council that they use a qualified lawyer to go over the contract with H.G.E.

Martha Weaver-Britell made a motion for the council to accept the entire Master Water System Plan with new changes to the priorities and expense chart and that they ask H.G.E. to consider the South Fork of Hubbard Creek and test wells as potential water sources for the City. This motion passed unanimously.

The next step in the process is up to H.G.E., and the success they have with the grant application they will write. They will apply for a \$750,000 community block grant and another grant for \$500,000 which requires matching funds or in kind support.

Rescue At Sea

Port Orford witnessed a dramatic rescue at sea Sunday evening and Monday morning. A 16' boat carrying 3 recreational divers from Coos Bay and North Bend was hit by two breakers behind Island Rock at approximately 2:30pm and capsized. The three divers aboard managed to grab and put on their buoyancy compensators before drifting away from the boat. It wasn't until 6:30pm that it was noticed they were overdue and the Coast Guard was notified. Several boats from Port Orford set out to search for the missing boat and divers including the Dotti B which was first out with David Barnes, Gifford Barnes and Joe Andrews.



Port Orford Ambulance had 5 E.M.T.'s aboard the boats to provide emergency medical care. The Coast Guard sent two helicopters, a Coast Guard cutter and a Cessna airplane to search for the missing divers. They sent a fueling truck to Cape Blanco State Airport for quicker refueling of the helicopters.

The first diver was found at 9:00pm and taken to North Bend Medical Center in good condition. Crew members aboard the Andria Marie spotted the second person and he was picked up at midnight. The names of these two divers is Fred

The third person, Eric Cox, a teacher at North Bend High School, was found at 9:00am, Monday morning. Cox had died from cold water drowning. He was found 5 miles offshore near Frankport.






