Letter to the Editor:

Our 17-C elected school board members now have the opportunity to reorganize the school districts and save us taxpayer's money. Basically there are three districts in Curry...Brookings, Gold Beach, and Port Orford for a total of 3,300 students. Yet we have three school superintendents, roughly one for each 1,000 students. I've been told Portland has approximately 15,000 students and one superintendent. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to see we are paying for three people to do the job of one. The yearly cost, county wide for us taxpayers is over \$400,000.

Each county school board could assign two members and form a county wide committee to select one superintendent for all of Curry county. The Superintendents' office could save money by cutting duplicated services. Central purchasing for materials, supplies, and cafeterias could be done in volume. Records could be centrally located, personnel and maintenance from a common pool. The possibilities are unlimited.

We must get all the school boards talking to each other, after all, Curry is one

county. We have some good dedicated teachers working for us and the savings could be spent in the class room, not on the top heavy management that we currently have. It's obvious more teachers are needed. Look at our drop out rate, our low test scores, drug use, and the increased enrollment in private religious schools. If it continues costing the taxpayer more and more money, if more parents become disillusion with schools, we will end up with a voucher system a revolt from the taxpayer. Before a replacement superintendent is hired, other possibilities must be explored.

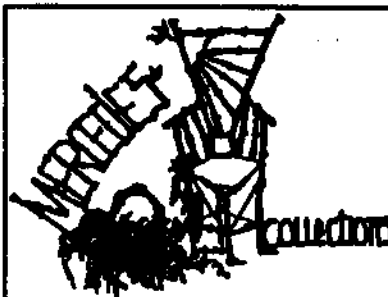

A former Portland resident, Wander has had more than 10 years experience helping smokers quit the habit. He has conducted quit-smoking programs for the American Cancer Society, the American Lung Association, Oregon Health Sciences University, Portland Public Schools and CODA: Programs in Substance Abuse and Mental Health. He also led a seminar during Curry General Hospital's National Hospital Week.

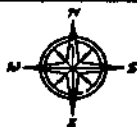

Curry Hospital

Curry General Hospital has become a partner in community cyberspace.

Meeting in regular session May 24, hospital board members gave a unanimous thumbs up to an arrangement that will help information-hungry computer enthusiasts access the Internet from central Curry County-without dialing long-distance.

In return for five Internet access hook-ups, the hospital will provide space for community telephone lines that will connect Gold Beach area callers to an international computer information databank known as the Internet.

"Within a month, anyone with a 247 phone prefix will be able to hook up a modem and dial into the Internet for free," Gib Cooper, an Internet user from Hunter Creek, says.

Currently, Gold Beach Internet subscribers must dial a long-distance number to access Internet, "and at 10 to 16 cents a minute, that runs you bill up quite a bit," Cooper adds.

He said Internet users still will pay a monthly subscription fee for the service.

Also, access to all other online information systems or Internet access companies still will require a long-distance call, he says.

Cooper, a member of Gold Beach 2010, says that the hospital has helped the 2010 group meet one of its goals-to bring local Internet access the area.

In discussing the issue, hospital board members agreed that the service would benefit the community while allowing the hospital free information access in far-reaching areas of health care. Hospital costs will come to approximately \$200 to install a doorway, Gordon Ensley, administrator, told the board.

Tell-A-Friend

A group of volunteers took preliminary steps to curb Curry County's death rate from breast cancer—the highest in the state—when they completed the first Tell-A-Friend training Wednesday, May 24. The training was held in the Curry General Hospital annex under the auspices of the Curry Breast Health Network and the American Cancer Society.

Armed with facts and information about breast cancer—Oregon's third biggest killer of women—the volunteers now will begin phoning their friends and acquaintances to tell them the best way to avoid becoming yet another mortality statistic.

"Get regular mammograms. Do monthly self-breast exams and have regular check-ups by your doctor or nurse practitioner," said trainer Raylene Dion, R.N., Oregon's breast health access coordinator for the American Cancer Society.

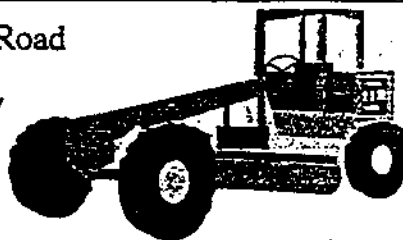
Dion, an energetic 40-year-old based in Portland, travels around the state to conduct Tell-A-Friend training's in towns large and small.

But it is more than job satisfaction that fuels her inner drive. This month she will celebrate her five-year survival since discovering a malignant tumor in her own left breast. She said she was among the 80% of women who get breast cancer with no family history. Luckily she caught her cancer in a very early stage.

"It was really hard. Our two children were 5 and 7. My husband thought I was going to die," she said, recalling the trauma to her family. "But the more I found out about breast cancer, the more I knew I could beat it because I found it in the early stages.

After treatment Dion said she felt the need to help others, "to educate them, because there is no way to prevent breast cancer. But we can prevent death from breast cancer. The way to do that is to catch it early. And that's where

mammograms come in."

The Tell-A-Friend program works by one of the simplest communication methods around, word-of-mouth. But sometimes it takes a few tries to recruit volunteers, Dion said. For instance, the first time she visited a small burg in eastern Oregon, no one showed up for the training.

Unfortunately, the same thing happened last week in Brookings. Dion instead discussed volunteer recruitment with Debbie Bourdlaics, who serves the area from Crescent City to Brookings-Harbor for the American Cancer Society, and Patty Scantlin, a member of Soroptimists International. Soroptimists in Brookings-harbor and Gold Beach recently provided low-income mammograms through the

Curry Breast Health Network.

About a dozen women attended the two-hour training in Gold Beach. Meanwhile, additional volunteers are still needed in all parts of the county, according to Kathy Comer, R.N., coordinator of the Curry Breast Health Network. Comer plans to conduct subsequent training's in Brookings, Gold Beach and Port Orford.

Those interested in learning more about Tell-A-Friend are invited to a free breakfast hosted by the Breast Health Network at 10 am, June 15, at Curry General Hospital.

Additionally, Comer said she is available to speak before employee groups, organizations and clubs. For more information, phone her at (503)247-6621, ext. 171.

Gastroenterologist

John Walker, M.D., a gastroenterology specialist, spoke before Curry General Hospital medical staff and other hospital personnel in an illustrated informational session Wednesday, May 31.

Dr. Walker is one of four specialists with Gastroenterology Consultants in Medford. In addition to his clinical work, he practices at Rogue Valley Medical Center and Providence Medical Center Medford. He estimates that he and his colleagues consult with Curry General Hospital staff once or twice weekly.

While his talk focused on internal bleeding of the esophagus and general abdominal region, the purpose of the session was much broader.

"These talks also help establish more effective communications with the doctors and nurses who call us regularly for consultation," Dr. Walker said.

Dr. Walker's presentation was arranged through the hospital's quality assurance consultant, William Nickerson, M.D., and Reginald Williams, M.D. chief of staff.

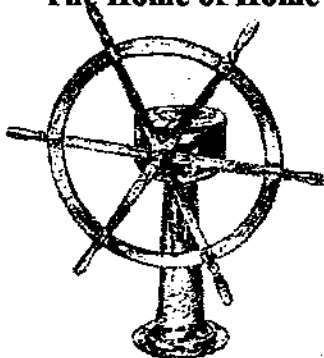

Council Meeting

Ernie Bussmann has indicated he plans to cross Hubbard Creek with a road built to County specifications. Ralph Donaldson was authorized to obtain the names of Geologists to prepare the City's assessment of any plans the Bussmanns file with the County. Dottie Meyers was asked to check with City attorney about hiring an attorney to handle the City's interest in any proposed development. Frank Hilton who handled the earlier suit was suggested as a candidate.

Matt Gray of HGE was present to update the Council on the City's application for funds to upgrade the City's water system. The Council unanimously authorized a current project of approximately \$1,070,800. This would provide a new Garrison Lake intake, dredging of the Hubbard Creek impoundment, replacement of much of the Hubbard Creek raw water line, treatment plant improvements,

distribution pump station improvements, reservoir improvements and rebuilding of one of the Hubbard Creek pumps.

In a best case scenario, with the City obtaining maximum grants, the City would not need to borrow any money to make these upgrades. Gray said it was unlikely that OEDD would require the City to make more of a contribution. He said a comparison of the City's rates to other towns would be made and the City would probably be required to raise its rates. The only way to avoid this is to limit the grant request to \$375,000 or less. This would mean the City would not receive enough funds to complete its top priority improvements.

Gray will prepare a grant for the design phase of the project. This will be presented at the Block Grant Hearing Monday, June 19, at 6:00pm in the Gable Council Chambers.
