Game Room Opens

City Could Lose Water!

The Port Orford City Council met on Monday evening, July 10. The council reviewed minutes of several previous meetings and approved them, some with minor changes.

Dennis Gehrke reported to the council that the city had hired Chris Marsh to fill the position of utility grade worker.

Tim Sparks said he had spoken to the city auditor, Rob Wall and that Wall was still working on the 1993-94 audit. Wall needs to complete the single audit and the job will be done.

City manager Dotti Myers said she was going to submit a grant request to fund a police officer for Port Orford for three years. It would be paid for by the Clinton Crime bill if approved. She said the deadline for submitting the grant request was July 31.

Requests by non profit civic groups for bed tax funds need to be submitted to the City by July 26 for the 1995-96 fiscal year. Of the projected \$28,000 in bed tax funds to be collected this fiscal year \$18,000 has been appropriated to the City parks department budget, \$2,000 has been appropriated to the Chamber of Commerce for the visitor center and the remaining \$8,000 is available for other groups this year.

Marc Farmer gave a presentation to the council on the Port Orford Enterprise Zone. This plan came into being in 1987 with a lifespan of 10 years with options to renew. The purpose of the enterprise zone is to encourage business relocation to this area. Some of the incentives includes a tax break on property improvements for three years and a 25% reduction in sewer and water charges for three years. Farmer said the enterprise zone incentives are intended for non-retail businesses and that 75% of their revenue has to come from wholesale sales. He said destination resorts qualify for enterprise zone incentives but that restaurants do not. He said two of the reasons Port Orford qualified for the enterprise zone it is a "Federal economically lagging area" and the population is decreasing (tell that to H.G.E.). Farmer said so far three businesses have been pre-certified for benefits. They are Certified Associates at the Port of Port Orford. The second firm is NC Electronics which has just built a new assembly plant at the end of Port Orford Loop Rd. The firm will be providing 15 jobs including 10 from our community. The third firm is Cranoo which will locate on Port Orford Loop Rd. and manufacture a machine to harvest cranberries. The enterprise zone comes up for renewal in 1997.

The City of Port Orford will hold its first Strategic Planning meeting on Wednesday, July 12, at 1:30pm, in the council

chambers. The city recently received a planning grant for \$20,000 from the Northwest Economic Adjustment Initiative to develop a strategic plan for the City's future. Note: By the time you read this the meeting will be over but it is only the first of several of which all people are invited to participate and come up with their ideas for the future of Port Orford. We will publicize these meetings if we find out about them in a timely manner.

Dotti Myers stated that there is an urgent need for Type O blood. The Red Cross is holding a blood drive at the Senior Center on Thursday, July 13, at 2:00pm. All blood is welcome but Type O is really needed.

Ralph Donaldson reported to the council on the Hubbard Creek watershed. He said Dennis Gehrke, geologist John Logan and he had entered the Busmann property above the city watershed last Friday for an inspection. Logan's preliminary assessment was that the City's North Fork Hubbard Creek watershed would be ruined if the planned development there proceeds. Donaldson urged all those in attendance in the meeting to give serious attention to the matter and show up when the issue comes up before the Curry County planning commission. He said that a plat plan development for the property has been applied for with the county. The council voted to hire Logan

She also was responsible for the beautiful flowers that filled the library with color.

The Port Orford library board has hired two people to replace Pat who worked 20 hours a week at the library. One of the people is Shirley Nelson who will handle the children's programs. She will lead the children's story hours on Saturdays from 11:00am - noon. When school begins she will conduct an after school hour for 1st - 3rd grade students. Nelson is a retired fifth grade elementary school

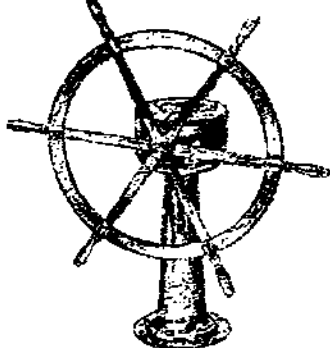

Economic Revitalization

Curry County was host to the thirty member State Community Economic Revitalization Team for the first time on July 6th and 7th in Brookings. The members represent federal, state and local agencies chartered to help administer funding from the Northwest Economic Adjustment Initiative dollars. The team also is focused on helping identify and remove project barriers, and to get prospective projects connected with appropriate agencies.

Curry county residents were given an opportunity to highlight progress on past funding recipient projects, with over \$2 million awarded to date, and to promote

new projects seeking assistance in the next funding cycle. Mayors Tom Davis of Brookings/Harbor and Marilyn Schaefer of Gold Beach both presented projects identified in their respective communities' Strategic Action Plans. Port Orford has just received a grant to assist their long term strategic planning efforts. Donaldson also said that Logan said the City could get producing wells but that it will take a larger diameter pipe and a deeper exploration than has been done before.
