Curry County Fair July 27-30

Chamber Hears From Brecke by Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Chamber of Commerce held their monthly membership meeting on Monday. State Senator Brenda Brecke was the invited guest speaker. She was introduced to the large gathering by Chamber President Dick Wold who described her as a friend of education.

Brecke started her term of office in mid April after being appointed to fill the vacancy created by Bill Bradbury's resignation. She serves on the Trade and Economic Committee and the Agricultural and Natural Resources Committee. She told the Chamber members and guests that her first couple of weeks in office were a real learning process. She expressed support for childcare projects and said she had worked to extend the enterprise zones, for the S.W.O.C.C. annexation, on behalf of small ports and for the limited entry crab fishery in this past legislative session.

She said the legislature is sending 8 referendums to the voters in the next election. She said Oregon needs to come to grips with school funding and that this state ranks 49th in the nation in spending for higher education. Brecke said she supports the Portland westside light rail extension. Several Chamber members didn't share this enthusiasm but at least one including this writer supports her. She did express concern about the condi-

tion of the highways including 101 south of Port Orford.

Brecke said we needed a dedicated fund for education spending but it was not being talked about in Salem. She said we can't depend on lottery dollars for education since their future is unstable as other forms of gambling grow more popular. The idea of a sales tax dedicated solely to education was presented to Brecke. She was skeptical about the idea because she saw no support for a sales tax dedicated to schools and she fell there was no impetus for the idea in the legislature.

Brecke talked a little about the Summit Program which is "boot camp" alternative to the standard prison term behind bars. She says she now sees the benefits which include a lower recidivism rate from the immates.

Senator Brecke said she was putting together several advisory committees, including one for senior issues and will be looking for people to serve on them. She stayed after the meeting was over and spoke with many people about their particular concerns.

Council Workshop Session by Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council held their monthly workshop session on Monday, July 24, at the Paradise Cafe. The council discusses a variety of subjects at workshop meetings but does not conduct official business like making and passing motions and resolutions.

The council discussed possible irrigation rates for city water consumers. Dotti Myers told the council since the new rates went into effect the city is receiving \$13,000 per billing cycle every two months from the water and sewer bills. She calculated that equals \$78,000 a year. Myers noted that there were a number of unpaid bills. She told the council the projected cost of running the utility is \$130,000 a year. The council had previously agreed to look at the situation at the end of one year of the new rates. It was stated towards the end of the meeting that some people with outstanding water bills will have their service shut off.

The agenda moved on to the strategic planning initiative. The consensus of the council is to use the Rural Development Initiative company to implement the \$20,000 strategic planning grant. The council oversees the citizen's group that works on the future plans. The idea of a community newsletter was introduced by councilor Robert Warring who has previously promoted this idea. The council will look for prices on printing a newsletter.

The sustainable tourism committee was discussed. Some of the ideas they've come up with so far are an elevated






State Park Programs

walkway through the trees, mountain bike trails and letting tourists harvest cranberries the old fashioned way. Curry County has formed a Tourism Steering Committee to develop sustainable tourism and signed a contract with Egret Communications to carry it out. Councilor Martha Weaver-Britell told the council she wants to see Port Orford receive equal representation on the committee. Councilor George Kennedy emphatically stated he wanted some of the tourism development dollars spent with local workers and suppliers.

The City will open bids for street improvements on August 1, 1995 at 1:00pm.

The City needs to drill two new test wells. The Department of Environmental Quality now requires a written plan report which will cost the city \$2,000. George Kennedy noted that this was an unfixaded mandate.

The council received a 16 page report from the Health Department regarding Cross Connection Control Requirements. Dennis Gehrke spoke about some of the costs associated with these requirements including the price of a check valve and installation. He said the units would have to be tested yearly and there were 15 possible cross connections in the city. A cross connection occurs when water flowing out of the system is able to backflow into the system.

Robert Warring asked that there be time set aside at the council meetings to discuss the management reports which Dotti Myers has been writing for the council. He said there had been no time allocated for discussion of the reports. Dotti mid there wasn't any secret stuff in the reports but she was concerned with naming names in them if they were to be talked about publicly.
