How Politicians See The Public

What do auto racing and food have in common? I'm not talking about road kill stew either. This coming Labor Day Weekend which falls on Saturday, Sunday and Monday, September 2, 3, 4, the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce is CO-sponsoring auto racing at Cape Blanco State Airport. This is the third year the Chamber and Team Continental have joined forces to hold the Port Orford Grand Prix at the airport.

One of the popular events offered to the public from last year's racing event was the Driver's Training. Because of its popularity it will be held again this year. You can reserve you space now for race-prepared or street cars by calling Howard Allen with Team Continental at 503-246-4852. Driver's Training will be held on Friday, September 1.

What does all this have to do with food. Every year several private citizens and community groups set up food booths at the races. This year the Chamber is once again soliciting for food concessions. The Chamber race committee has set a list of priorities for who will be selected:

- Persons or organizations who ran a booth at last year's auto races
- Businesses or individuals who belong to the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce

- 3. Local non-profit organizations
- 4. Other people or for profit groups

The 1995 Port Orford Chamber Labor Day race concession applications are now available at the Chamber office located at Battle Rock Park and the Port and Starboard Restaurant. They must be returned to the Chamber office or race concession chairman Frank Smith at Port and Starboard no later than 10:00am, August 14.

Some of the things you must provide the race concession chairman are a copy of the county health permit application prior to the deadline for submission, an agreement to participate all three days of the racing, provide 30 gallons of drinking water with disposed and provide trash receptacles. A \$50.00 deposit is required with the form with \$25 refundable if the area is cleaned and trash disposed of on a daily basis. There are two areas where food will be served. One is in the pit area amongst the racers and their cars and the other is by the bleachers.

Bed Tax Committee

The City of Port Orford Bed Tax committee will hold its first public hearing on Tuesday, September 5, at 7:00pm in the council chambers. The time has passed for organizations to submit their requests for the bed tax which is accrued through a 6% tax collected by motel operators and bed and breakfasts. Interestingly in our recent travels around the country we found Port Orford's 6% rate to be about the lowest. Many cities like San Francisco are at 10% and above. What a wonderful way to greet the traveling public. I like Valerie's reference to bed tax as taxation without representation. Certainly the people paying it in the vast majority are long gone when the booty is divided up. I was told that 8 non-profit organizations have applied for the 8 - 10 thousand dollars available bed tax funds.



Mobile Mammography

Curry General Hospital's mobile mammography unit will make its monthly visit to Curry Family Medical clinic in Port Orford, Wednesday, August 9.

The American Cancer Society recommends a first-time mammogram for most women by age 40. Mammograms are recommended every one to two years for women 40 to 49, and annually for women 50 and older. Those 60 and older should be especially aware of the importance of early detection because they are at increased risk for developing breast cancer, Kathy Comer, Curry Breast Health Network coordinator, says.

Regular screening by mammography, and clinical and self-breast examination clearly saves lives, Corner says. "If we can reach women not currently receiving these services, deaths from breast cancer can be reduced."

Inability to pay should not be a concern to Curry County women, according to Comer. The Curry Breast Health Network works with Brookings and Gold Beach Soroptimists to provide low-cost mammograms. Additionally, the Texasbased Susan G. Komen Foundation has also offered to provide free mammograms to eligible patients.

Besides scheduling visits in Port Orford, patients can schedule mammograms throughout the month at Curry General Hospital in Gold Beach.



Planning Commission Meets by Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Planning Commission met on Tuesday, August 1. Chairperson Viola Cuatt gaveled the meeting open at 7:00pm. The commission was greeted by a large audience and proceeded with two important pieces of business.

The commission first took up the issue of the Brueske Gold Run Creek subdivision phase 1. Several large maps of the sub-

division were displayed and showed a subdivision with 14 lots. The commission heard from the Brueske's attorney Jerry Lesan who spoke about the subdivision and was attempting to get final approval for the plan. City-hired geologist John Logan gave a lengthy report on the Brueske property and also showed a video he had made of the land. He recommended that a geologic risk assessment be done first before approving the Continued in this issue



subdivision. He said the property was composed of sandstone and shales which are susceptible to weathering and slumping and he saw no hard rock in the area. He said there was much subsurface water evident and that a couple of the culverts were fed by springs. The video Logan showed displayed erosion on some of the lots and on a paved road. Ellen Warring made a motion that a geologic risk assessment report be done by the property owner at his expense. Alan Mitchell seconded the motion which passed. Attorney Lesan challenged the vote on the grounds that the evidence the commission was using from Mr. Logan had not


been provided to him and that by law he was to receive it 7 days before the meeting. City lawyer Carol Cyphers concurred with Lesan. A motion was passed to rescind Warring's motion. The meeting will be continued on Tuesday, Sept. 5, at 7:00pm, in the council chambers.

At 8:45pm the commission took up what was referred to as the "Bussmann issue". This matter dealt with the Bussmann application for the proposed Doer Creek subdivision on their property located above the city reservoir. Their application will be heard by the Curry Planning Commission on Thursday, September 7, at the county annex building in Gold Beach. City planning director Norma

House read a memo from city watershed attorney Frank Hilton saying that all steps are being taken to protect the watershed in the North Fork of Hubbard Creek including retaining geologist John Logan and the engineering firm of H.G.E. and that the city needed to insure there would be no septic system failures. Hilton suggested that the planning commission make no recommendations on the subdivision until these reports are in.

John Logan's report is due by August 10. The planning commission will hold a special meeting the night of August 10, at 7:00pm in the council chambers. It will be open to the public and their input will be allowed.


