Welcome Team Continental By Evan Kramer

This Labor Day weekend the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce and Team Continental present three days of auto racing at Cape Blanco State Airport, starting Saturday September 2 and going through Monday. Crews will start setting the track up on Thursday morning. Friday will feature Driver Training and Practice for members of the public.

Saturday, the race drivers will take turns practicing on the 9/10 mile track and begin qualifying runs at 1:00pm. Sunday morning there will be more qualifying runs followed by racing beginning at 1:00pm. Labor Day Monday will see more qualifying runs followed by racing and then track teardown in the early evening.

This year the members of Team Continental have subtitled the races "Danny's Race". They are honoring Danny Frasier, a young man who worked the races and one day wanted to be a race driver. He died of leukemia in March of this year.

Tickets for this year's racing event have been greatly reduced from last year. Single day tickets are \$3.00 for adults, \$2.00 for 10-18, while 9 and under are admitted free with an adult. Although the posters say tickets are available at four in-town locations, in reality they will only be sold at the entrance to the

racetrack. Auto racing will start at 9:00am and continue through 5:00pm each day. Food, soft drinks and espresso will be available from four different local vendors including those nice people who make sure we have Christmas lights every year, the Lightin' Bugs. Booths will be located next to the stands and in the pit area. The Chamber of Commerce has produced a program covering the races with help from Team Continental. It will be available at the racetrack and includes information about Team Continental, a complete schedule of all events this weekend and information about the types of race cars you will see in action this weekend.

Team Continental members have planned a race car parade from Cape Blanco Airport into and through Port Orford on Saturday night. Last year they drove through town and it was one of my favorite parts of this event. Race committee person John Ineson told me the drivers are scheduled to arrive in downtown Port Orford at 6:25pm. Get those cameras ready!

Cape Blanco Airport is located at the very end of Airport Road, west of Highway 101. If you turn the wrong way at Airport Road and Highway 101 you'll enter the parking lot of Pacific High School. Stay long enough and you too can begin the new school year on Tuesday morning, September 5.

Busy Labor Day Weekend

Besides the auto races there are several other events worth noting this weekend in Port Orford. The Port Orford Library is holding a benefit concert on Friday, September 1, from 7:00 - 11:00pm. Besides the previously announced Pete Lenihan Trio and Stone River Band the "all singing" group Bella Acapella will perform several songs. The group is composed of Corro Dyanne, Chris Hawkins, Julie Hawthorne and Debby Lohry. They perform with no musical accompaniment other than their fine voices. Tickets are a \$5 donation.

Saturday night, September 2, there will be a fifty year reunion of Port Orford and Langlois schools at the Sixes Grange Hall. Dance to the big band music of It's About Time, starting at 9:00pm. The public is welcome.

Flying Doctors. Los Medicos Voladores, says "Thank You" to the people of Port Orford and the adjoining areas who have donated eye glasses and other medical equipment for our trips to Mexico. I am happy to report that in June I was part of a team that flew to Baja, California, where I worked with an optometrist. Now I know where and how all those eye glasses reach the people who need them.

We examined several hundred people, young and old, and dispensed glasses whenever we could fit the people with the correct prescription. It was encouraging to see that very few of the children needed eye correction. We visited 3 different sites south of Ensenada, two of which had no running water or electricity. Living conditions were extremely poor at the last site. A small group of Indians are living on a plot of land at the

Regulated Use Closure

Due to increasing high fire danger, District Manager Gene Brock of the Coos Forest Protective Association announced that a Regulated Use Closure will go into effect Friday, August 25, 1995. This closure will effect all lands within Regulated Use Areas CS-2, CS-5, and all private, state, county and BLM lands within Regulated Use Areas SK-1 and SK-2. These requirements shall remain in effect until further notice.

SWOCC News

Beginning this fall, Curry County business owners and managers have the opportunity to take advantage of an intensive training course specifically developed to offer solutions to the challenges they face in their businesses today.

The training program, FastTrac II, is designed for established business owners/managers. Businesses of any size can benefit from the program. The program is being offered in Curry County through the cooperative efforts of the SWOCC Business Development Center, the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce, the Gold Beach Chamber of Commerce, and various local businesses.

Through a combination of monthly meetings and consultations, participants will gain business strategies that can be used to develop a business plan that the business owner can start using immediately.

Meeting sessions will focus on a range of topics, including management, legal organization, marketing, managing finances, sources of capital, and negotiations.

FastTrac II will begin on Tuesday, September 26, from 6 to 9:30 pm, in Brookings. The program includes three meetings per month for a total of 12 sessions. Instructor Gary Liddle, a businessman from North Bend, is the Coordinator of the program.

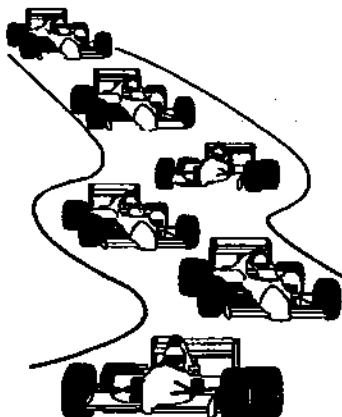

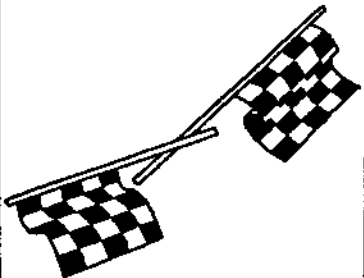

Letter To The Editor,

Those who depend on the City of Port Orford's water supply will be interested to know that a hearing on the proposed Bussmann development on Hubbard Creek will be held in Gold Beach on September 14. This hearing is scheduled for 7:00pm in the Curry County courthouse annex "Blue Room." The county planning commission will hear Bussmann's request for approval of a development of nineteen homes on the Port Orford watershed.

You will surely remember the problems caused by the Bussmann's lack of candor and concern for the damage done to the water supply during the past two winters. The Bussmann careless grading, road building and logging caused Hubbard Creek to periodically not be usable as the city water supply. The city has had to spend a great deal of our dollars to try to get the Bussmanns to promptly and prop-

**Open Letter
by Gayle Wilcox**

As a citizen of Port Orford I respectfully urge you to join Port Orford Watershed Council in recommending against development of the Bussman Subdivision Proposal on the north fork of Hubbard Creek.

Our watershed on Hubbard Creek is perhaps our most precious resource and has been designated as our primary water supply. Our secondary water supply is Garrison Lake and that is unreliable at best. It is vulnerable to daily contaminants running off Hwy. 101, any possible toxic spill on 101 and possibly the plume of hazardous waste from the dump. Garrison Lake could permanently be rendered useless at any time.

We are fortunate to have such a water source as Hubbard Creek and must work together to preserve and protect it. A development in that area will put our

water supply in serious jeopardy. Having worked in excavation, I have had hands on experience in road construction, land slide and erosion control as well as hazardous waste removal. I know from experience that no matter how well organized and careful one is, problems can and do arise that are beyond human control. If a development were allowed, our water supply would be vulnerable to run off from roads, slides, erosion and siltation, as well as the possibility of seepage from septic systems.

Work on the property has already rendered Port Orford's primary water source undrinkable for many months at a time. To allow a housing development where it will certainly continue to adversely affect the water supply of Port Orford would be unconscionable.

Next, September 3rd - Birthday party - all are welcome.

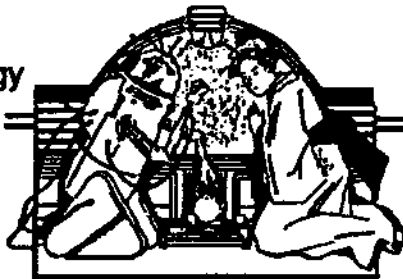
Then September 10th is the breakfast.
