





P.O. Chamber Report By Evan Kramer

Port Orford City Councilor Martha Weaver-Britell was the guest of the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce at their August membership meeting. She started out on the topic of the strategic planning initiative. She told the chamber members she doesn't own a business in town but is involved with many community groups. She said RDI would start interviewing people in September to be on the strategic planning committee. She suggested that the city try to involve people who are not normally involved in the process. She said one of the goals of strategic planning is ask the question "where are we going in coming years?"

Weaver-Britell spoke of a vision of Port Orford. She said there was no urban core in the city but that it is spread out. She would encourage infilling in the city rather than strip development in the urban

growth boundary. She recommended renovating and expanding the visitor center at Battle Rock Park, remodeling the Community Building and pushing ahead for an interpretative center at the Coast Guard station on Coast Guard Hill.

Weaver-Britell went on to extol the benefits of the Internet. She said incorporating planning on the Internet was important to the community. She accesses CompuServe and through that the Internet. She displayed some printed pages from the Web which displayed impressive graphics. She said the City needs to do something with the Internet and should consider the FreeNet. She suggested the Internet be talked about more during the RDI strategic planning meetings.

Weaver-Britell fielded a couple of questions and concerns from chamber members concerning the city parks.

One question concerned when the Pinehurst public fishing dock would be reopened for public use. It has been closed since December, 1993, when city work crews ran a water intake line along the top of dock into the lake. This was to be a temporary solution to the problem created when the city water supply at Hubbard Creek was made undrinkable and the city switched over to Garrison Lake water. Weaver-Briteli said the #1 priority of the city master water plan was to place the intake line further out in the lake and get it off the dock.

A complaint was lodged to her about the condition of the bathrooms at Buffington Park including lack of paper towels and toilet paper to graffiti. She said one problem was that there are many people responsible for maintenance of the park and there was a need for more coordination of these workers who included city people, green thumb and state workers.

City of Port Orford

The City of Port Orford will hire an engineering firm to design improvements to the drinking water treatment plant, and distribution system with the help of a \$119,600 Community Development Block Grant, Oregon Economic Development Dept. Director Bill Scott announced today.

The total cost to complete the mandated project is estimated at \$1.5 million. The City will provide \$29,900 of the total cost of engineering.

"There is no doubt the city could not afford to finance the design of our water system improvements without assistance of federal and state funds," said Mayor Delaine Kennedy.

The existing water treatment plant and distribution system was originally constructed in the 1950's and does not meet the Giardia, inactivation requirements of both federal and state Surface Water Treatment Rule regulations. Giardia in water systems causes stomach and intestinal illnesses in humans.

The treatment plant also has difficulty reducing turbidity levels in the finished water supplied to the residents. The city's main water source, Hubbard Creck Impoundment, needs dredging. Other improvements which are identified in the Water System Master Plan include leaking distribution system lines, a 45 year

old reservoir is suspected of leaking, and the Hubbard Creek raw water intake line is leaking and in danger of collapsing.

The engineering firm will design improvements to the water treatment plant, a new Garrison Lake intake structure, Hubbard Creek intake line, dredging Hubbard Creek Impoundment, distribution system, pump station, reservoir improvements. The firm will also look at environmental and financial needs associated with the project.

The state Community Development Block Grant Program offers federally funded grants to communities for projects that principally benefit people of low and moderate income. The Oregon Economic Development Department receives about \$16 million each year from the US Dept. of Housing and Urban Development for the program.

Nearly 70 grant awards are made annually to rural cities and counties with these funds for public works, community facility, housing rehabilitation, technical assistance and handicap accessibility projects.

Port Orford is located along the Pacific Ocean in Southwest Oregon in Curry County. The city is comprised of 1,035 residents of which 65.7 percent or 680 persons are considered low and moderate income persons.

fewer booby traps to cause trouble since half-correct software isn't allowed, but you may have to deal with these exceptional situations before Win 95 works. Here are some tips to minimize the trauma associated with installation troubles.

- 1. Make a full backup of your hard disk.
- Clean up your hard disk. Use an uninstall program to weed out unused files from your hard disk.
- 3. Make sure you have a boot diskette.
- Make an extra copy of your config.sys and autoexec, but files.
- 5. Run Windows Setup and configure for generic VGA.
- 6. Reduce config.sys and autoexec.bat to the bare minimum needed.
- 7. WIN95 offers to create backups. Do it.
- 8. Run Windows then do Alt-File-Run to install WIN95.
- If install doesn't work, try running it from DOS instead of from Windows.

To gain the benefits of the new Windows, you will also have to buy new upgrades to all your windows software. Caution: Microsoft Plus Pack Pinball is addictive!
