## City Council Report By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford City Council held a workshop meeting followed by a special session on Monday morning. Leading off the workshop agenda was the council retreat. The council was split in their opinions of where to hold a council retreat. Martha Weaver-Britell suggested that city manager Dotti Myers check with Judy Shay about serving as the facilitator at the meeting. Weaver-Britell said the council needed to use a facilitator and that Shay could provide questions for the council to consider. She and Ralph Donaldson spoke in favor of holding the workshop in Port Orford. George Kennedy disagreed and said the council should "get the hell out of town". He said the League of Oregon Cities recommends against holding workshops "in town".

The council discussed the water and sewer billing cycle. Weaver-Britell said one third of the bills are being paid late and recommended a monthly billing cycle. Myers said the cost of switching to a monthly billing would add \$500 a month or \$6,000 a year to the billing cost for the city. Norma House said that 95% of the problem the city is having with the water and sewer bills is people moving in and out of houses and apartments and not paying their bill. Ralph Donaldson suggested the owners of the homes pay the water bill. Robert Warring suggested

this all be put on the agenda for the year end review of the water and sewer bills which will occur in April, 1996. The new rates went into effect on February 24, 1995. Norma House will meet with the local real estate association concerning their suggestions with collecting the bills.

The council adjourned their workshop session at the Wheelhouse Restaurant and moved over to the city hall council chambers for their special session. They made a motion to fill two appointments to the city bed tax committee. Ron Culbertson will represent the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce at the Chamber's request. Paul Bodtke was chosen to fill the position of citizen at large. The motion was approved unanimously.

George Kennedy gave a brief report on the Community Building roof specifications he had worked on with Tim Sparks. They came up with three different jobs for bid which will now be advertised in the newspapers.

The council moved on to the lease with the Chamber of Commerce for the visitor center at Battle Rock Park. The lease was hammered out to everyone's satisfaction at a meeting attend by Robert Warring, Carl Eskelson and Chamber President Dick Wold. The chamber will now provide the city with an annual record of visitors to the center, telephone inquiries and mail responses to promotional materials. The city will compen-

sate the chamber \$2,000 for the fiscal year 1995-96 for running the center. They also agreed to the following memorandum of understanding. "Prior to March 1, 1996 the City of Port Orford will design a tourism program. The Chamber is willing to assist in its development". Robert Warring made a motion to accept the lease agreement for 1995-96. It passed unanimously.

The council heard from Port Orford Fire Chief George Gehrke about the delivery of water for septic tanks and swimming pools. The issue arose at the last city council meeting when Louis Nichols from the Roto Rooter Company complained to the council about having to compete with the fire department on the delivery of water to private users. George told the council the fire department had been delivering water for 15 to 20 years. He said the fire department has raised \$34,000 in donations through various fund raising efforts including delivering water, pancake breakfasts and supervised burns and that money had been spent on fire department equipment. Weaver-Britell said the fire department should continue to deliver water. Warring said they should consult with the city lawyer about the department supplying water. Weaver-Britell made a motion to allow the fire department to continue with their current fund raising efforts if what they are doing is legal. It passed unanimously.

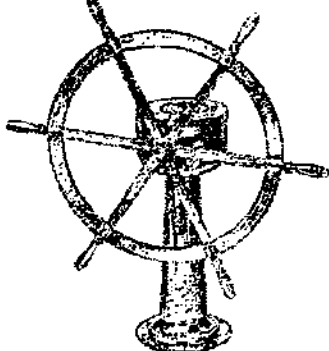

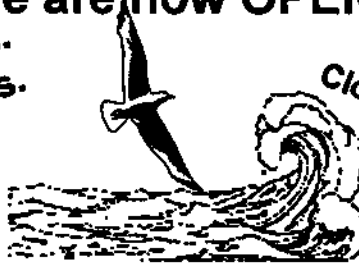

Concerning the character of the holiday, the rabbis of the Talmud wrote: "There were no days as happy for the Jewish people as the fifteenth of the Hebrew month when marriages were arranged and Yom Kippur".

The only sins forgiven on Yom Kippur are those committed against God. As for offenses committed against other people, it is written "Yom Kippur does not atone until (one) appeases his neighbors".

Therefore, Jewish tradition encourages people to begin the process of repenting well in advance of the holiday. If one has injured or offended another person, one is obliged to request forgiveness sincerely. Even if the request is refused initially, at least two more attempts at reconciliation should be made.

The victim of the offense likewise is required to be forgiving, provided the request for forgiveness is made sincerely.

The rabbis regard a person as cruel who withholds forgiveness even after three requests. Obviously, this designation would not necessarily apply if the offense committed was extreme or if it inflicted irrevocable damage.

Yom Kippur is the only fast day mandated in the Torah, it commences an hour before the holiday begins, and concludes twenty five hours later. On Yom Kippur, Jews are also forbidden to drink any liquid, bath, engage in sexual relations or wear leather shoes. The latter prohibition was intended to somewhat diminish comfort on this holiday of introspection. A popular modern explanation for the ban on leather shoes suggests that it would be presumptuous to appear before God asking for mercy while wearing shoes made from the skin of a slaughtered animal. As a result of this ban, traditional Jews dress incongruously on Yom Kippur - attired in their most formal suits and dresses, but with running or tennis shoes on their feet.

The last meal before the holiday is known as the closing meal. It is usually a light early dinner, traditionally, boiled chicken is served. Salty and spicy foods are avoided so as not to make fasters thirsty.
