#### Skinner Speaks To Chamber

Curry County Commissioner TV Skinner was the guest speaker at the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce on Monday at their membership meeting. Skinner spent most of the meeting talking about taxes and how the property tax money is distributed. He displayed a poster sized chart of how the property tax (not pecan) pic is sliced. 60.75% of the taxes go to schools while the amount which goes to the county for its budget is 6.27%. The total revenue the county collects for its share of the property tax pie is \$770,000 annually. He said the county handles and distributes property tax receipts to all the various taxing districts without taking anything out for administrative costs.

Skinner referred to a subject on many Chamber member's minds (1995-96 property tax bills) when he said that land and buildings were to be appraised and assessed at 100% of their true market value.

#### Letter to the Editor.

On behalf of the Curry County Health Department and more than 500 families in Curry County I would like to express my appreciation to Gordon Ensley for his leadership of the Curry Health District in the establishment of the Curry County Perinatal Program. This program is a collaborative effort involving the Curry Health District, the Curry County Health Department and private care providers. It came into being six years ago at a time when there were no private providers who were able to give prenatal care to low income pregnant women. The program opened in January of 1990 and has continued since that time





Gordon Ensley's efforts have supported the comprehensive services of the Perinatal program which includes prenatal care, labor and delivery, newborn and postpartum care of the new mother. In association with the Perinatal Program, the Public Health Department provides Maternity Case Management home visits and WIC nutrition services. Following the postpartum period many families continue to receive Public Health services such as infant immunization, family planning, and Babies First home visits. The total package of services available to families in the Perinatal program has assisted over 500 families in a having a healthy start for their children. The





program would not have happened without the support of Gordon Ensley. Thanks to the efforts of Mr. Ensley and others involved with the program, prenatal care has been available to all women in Curry County since 1990. Thank you, Gordon for all your work and support for the families of Curry County.

Now come enjoy - there is a pool table, TV, another game and our treasurer has a real nice office in there too.



#### Letter To The Editor.

A problem has developed around Port Orford's Transient Lodging Tax (Bed Tax) Committee. Business people who collect the tax feel they should say in how it is spent.

Port Orford's business people are allowed to keep 5 percent of the tax they collect to pay for their efforts in collecting it. At its October 9th meeting, the City Council, recognizing the intensity of the controversy over how the bed tax is to be spent, took the advice of Dick Wold, speaking for the Chamber of Commerce, and passed a motion that bed tax expenditure committee meetings be postponed until after the City's Ordinance Review Committee could review Bed Tax Ordinance 212-90B and make its recommendations to the Council.

The Bed Tax meeting with the support of the City Manager was held as scheduled. on October 10, 1995, in defiance of the City Council's vote. The various organizations that had petitioned for Bed Tax Funds were informed in writing by the Bed Tax Committee that their requests were being sent to the City Council with a recommendation to approve them.

In a written statement dated October 12. the City Council was notified by the Bed Tax Committee that the meeting had taken place as the City action in postponing it was illegal and it would have been unethical to cancel the meeting on such short public notice.

Dr. Pitchford has been my doctor for the past six years and has served the community of Port Orford for nine years. Many of us have made a commitment to use the clinic here, rather than go north, because we believe in the importance of a doctor

and the clinic in our community. Many of us are asking why a town meeting wasn't held to discuss whatever problems the board had with Dr. Pitchford. Many of us wonder how to help reinstate him.

We are delighted Karen Olson has decided to work at the clinic. It took two years to find someone willing to take Tom Enghauser's place. Why would Dr. Pitchford be fired just as she comes on board?

I want to publicly thank Tom Pitchford for the care and concern he has given me as a patient. I could always count on him. I hope people will attend the hospital board meeting at the City Hall on November 8<sup>th</sup> and ask some of the questions




#### So Simple It Works by: Paula Cracas

Even though Recycling Awareness Week is over. I'd never miss an opportunity to recycle. Here's a recycling idea I'd like to share with you. I'm going to number the used items I recycled in just this one idea. I started a WORM FARM! Some of you may not relish a worm farm, but before you start squirming, let me explain. Your plants will thank me. And you'll save on your garbage bill.

Somebody gave me an old fiberglass bathtub (1) they'd torn out of a remodel. I made a lid for it out of used lumber (2) and found the perfect sized hinge (3) at a yard sale. I put a layer of dirt (4 (hey, it wasn't new dirt; I had used it in my garden)) and added a thick layer of shredded newspaper (5). Then I put in a layer of leaves (6 - the trees were done with them), and some chicken manure (7 ditto re: the chickens). I went to Driftwood School and purchased some red worms (8 - they had been using them there) and carried them home in a used Styrofoam cup (9). I shredded the cup (10) and added it and the worms to the almost full bathtub. I covered the whole thing with the contents (11) of my compost bucket which I keep under my kitchen sink. By the way, the contents are officially known as "putrid garbage". Last, but not least, I added a layer of fresh grass clippings (12). I shut the lid, covered it with a large piece of black plastic (used, of course -13) and let it sit there until I had collected

another bucketful of putrid garbage. (Worms especially love coffee grounds.)

In a couple months, I opened the lid wide, turned the entire contents with a threetined pitchfork (14) I bought for a buck at a garage sale. Lo and behold, there were a bezillion red worms and their tiny white baby worms! And the whole kit and caboodie had miraculously turned into the most luscious soil a potted plant, or any plant in your garden, could hope to gather around its tiny roots.

You wouldn't have to use an old bathtub to get started. You could use an empty 5gallon paint bucket, with a few air holes in the lid, a layer of dirt, shredded newspaper, and putrid garbage on the bottom. I could spare a few worms. Bring your own Styrofoam cup. And a recycling idea that works for you.

A worm farm! So simple it works.

Skinner turned to discussion of the Oregon and California (O & C) timber lands. The county needs 5.7 million dollars from timber revenues to meet its annual budget but Skinner said only a small amount timber has been cut on O & C lands the past 18 months. He said the Federal government welfare payment has replaced the timber revenue. Skinner noted that the O & C timber lands were to be managed on a sustainable vield basis and that goal had been accomplished. He said in 1937 there were an estimated 50 billion board feet of harvestable timber in the 2.4 million acres of O & C lands and that in 1990 there were 49 billion board feet. Commissioner Skinner said the State of Oregon has a plan for sustainable yield timber harvest if it can get control of the lands. This would increase revenues to the counties.

#### Straw Bales Offered To Public

The Port Orford Watershed Council has taken delivery of three tons of straw bales for use in protecting Garrison Lake from construction site soil erosion. The straw bales will be offered, at no cost, to property owners whose earth-moving activities (site excavation, grading and such) could result in dirt washing into Garrison Lake's numerous feeder streams and wetlands, thus adding to the Lake's current purity problems.

Council Chairman, David Wilken, said, "This is a pilot project which we hope will raise local awareness of the ways human activities can degrade the Lake, as well as all watershed areas. Once area residents become familiar with the problem, we hope they will make use of this tool in all their future construction activities."
