Take A Hike By Evan Kramer

I don't just attend city council meetings and do chores around the house. This past Sunday I decided enough was enough and packed a lunch, let Myrtle the dog into the back of the truck and headed down to Humbug Mountain State Park.

I parked in the lot by the Myrtle Grove, adjacent to the gazebo. I had decided to fill in the blanks on the part of the Oregon Coast Trail I hadn't walked along in that area. I headed under the Highway 101 bridge and past the long abandoned fish hatchery. This time of year the blackberry vines are so thick there is very little showing of the concrete walls that formed the holding ponds for the fish. Anybody want to share with us the history of this archaeological treasure? I half expected Indiana Jones to pop up any minute looking for grand wazoo of the fourth preamble.

We headed toward the campground along the trail which at times is level with Highway 101 but is on the other side of Brush Creek. The trail does gain some altitude and puts enough distance from the car traffic to make you feel like you're not walking along the highway. I kept my eyes on the trail as I didn't want to step on any of the many salamanders and spotted banana slugs as well as the many varieties of mushrooms popping out of the leaf covered trail. Myrtle's nose kept busy

with a wide range of scents which had her looking up many trees and in every culvert we passed.

One thing nice about hiking along this trail now is walking amongst the maple trees with their leaves in full fall color. Eventually the trail takes you to a fork in the road. You can make a choice of continuing on the trail or entering the park campground. I chose the trail which is the abandoned remnant of the old Highway 101. This trail leads one through the park and lets you out on the new Highway 101 south of Rocky Point Bridge.

Heading back to the truck we took a cutoff from coast trail which leads you into the campground and see a little new territory. The park is open year round now and there were a few campers braving the colder weather though they weren't tent camping. The condition the park is in is impressive. It is almost faultlessly maintained. The benches and camp sites are in a state of readiness for the next visitors.

At the end of this pleasant day at the park I thought I'd say something positive about the great job the park employees have kept the park in to manager Mike Hewitt. Then I found out just yesterday that Hewitt is resigning his position as park manager as of Friday, November 17. He will then take a position with NCR Electronics in Port Orford. The park unit that Hewitt manages includes Humbug Mountain

State Park, Cape Blanco Lighthouse and State Park and the Hughes House. Best of luck to you in your new endeavors Mike.

Students Suspended At High School

18 students at Pacific High School were detained by school officials on Wednesday, November 1, as the culmination of a one week long surveillance operation at the school. Unbeknownst to the students they had been under observation with the use of a video camera for the previous week and on Wednesday school officials decided to act. The camera was trained on an outside bathroom located adjacent to the soccer field at the high school. The students were charged with a variety of illegal behavior including breaking into the restroom, smoking tobacco and chewing tobacco.

They were interviewed by school principal Mike Nickless and other school officials before each being issued 2 day suspensions. Nickless said some confessed to smoking while others didn't. He also said no citations were issued by the Curry County Sheriff's Department. Nickless revealed that a search of student lockers with the help of a police dog came up with no contraband or cigarettes.

The Internet is now accessible from Port Orford or Langlois via a local phone call to 332-7043. Bandon also went live last week at 348-2866. Brookings, Gold Beach, and Coos Bay have all had local access for some time and @Harborside reports they hope to have Reedsport on line on Nov. 17.

This link is important to our small coastal cities as it helps us keep connected with culture, news, education, and jobs. Lack of local Internet access and the high cost of using on-line services from Port Orford was the most often mentioned problem in the recent Port Orford SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) Assessment. This problem is now solved.

It's really hard to convey just how powerful the Internet is. You can do anything on it from reading a copy of Moby Dick, to looking up stock prices (15 minute delay from the official ticker price), to driving a simulated Martian rover. For example, I was recently asked if I could locate information on the "Rife generator." I'd never heard of it or Royal Rife but it took less than 10 minutes to get pages and pages of information on the subject.

Getting the system working is one part of the job. Getting your computer to use it is another.



Happy Internet campers should have at least a 14.4kbps modern and a 386 computer running Microsoft Windows 3.1 or later (or the equivalent Apple Mac.) It may be possible to use slower moderns or DOS-only software but it will be difficult and limiting.

A "new-user" package of software and instructions is available to help subscribers get started. It is important to follow the instructions carefully and avoid making assumptions or skipping steps. A tip sheet is available at The Downtown Fun Zone to help you through some of the common mistakes.

If you already have an AOL or Compuserve account, log on through the Internet. This way you don't have to pay for the long distance call and can save yourself about \$6.00 per hour!



Letter to the Editor,

We are angry and frustrated grandparents. On October 1st, the last day of Dr. Pitchford;s contract at Curry Family Medical Clinic, my wife had stopped by the office to pick up medical records to take to her surgeon in Coos Bay. (My wife had just had major surgery). The office staff, who have always been great, efficiently found the records and made copies. During this time my wife asked if there was a possibility of our grand-daughter seeing Dr. Pitchford or Karen.

She has had recurring fever, diarrhea, and had developed rash on her face. We were told that Karen was not there and that Dr. Pitchford was pretty well booked, but that there were openings for the following day. We said fine, thinking that this would be a good time to meet Dr. Nickerson and see what kind of doctor he was! Upon arriving for her 3pm appointment the following day, we were asked if our granddaughter had an up to date medical card (our daughter and she are on The Oregon Health Medical Plan). We were also asked if we and our daughter intended to stay with Curry Family Medical Clinic. We answered that our intentions were to go with Dr. Pitchford who has been our doctor for the past two years, but that we could not answer on behalf of our daughter who was at work. Also, at this time, we were asked to sign release forms for our medical records (which had just been received that day) to the receptionist who promptly said that our granddaughter could not be seen because Dr. Pitchfords name was still on the card as the doctor. We thought this unusual because our granddaughter had just seen Karen, the General Practitioner with the identical medical card without any problems.

We asked when this policy had been changed. The answer was "As of today!!" We felt flabbergasted because of this bureaucracy, our 2 ½ year old grand-daughter was refused to be seen by Dr. Nickerson. We felt we were singled out

because we chose to continue with the services of Dr. Pitchford. This should not have affected our granddaughter. We would have gladly paid for this office visit as we have done in the past, but felt by the end of this conversation our granddaughters medical care under this New Administration wasn't Curry Family Medical Clinic's primary concern.

During most of this conversation Dr. Nickerson was present next to the receptionists desk, but did not have the courtesy to come out to introduce himself nor try to explain any of the circumstances.

At this time, he was the only practicing doctor in this small town. A good humanitarian doctor would have said "lets take care of the baby first, then we'll straighten out the paperwork later." My wife voiced her opinions and we left, frustrated, not knowing what was wrong with our granddaughter.

Dr. Nickerson had not put the care and welfare of his patient first. Thus, our daughter and granddaughter will also be going to Dr. Pitchford!!

Our granddaughter has an appointment with Dr. Pitchford at his new office on opening day, Monday Nov. 6th.

We're sure she will be treated like a First Class Citizen!!

Letter To The Editor,

The bed tax certainly has stirred up controversy this year. All due, I believe, to a basic misunderstanding of the bed tax ordinance. The ordinance tells how the bed tax is to be collected and spent. It requires that the money collected first be spent to cover the cost of operating the City's existing cultural and tourist related facilities. The ordinance says that these costs are determined annually by the City manager. The City's cultural and tourist facilities are listed in such City documents as the City's Comprehensive Plan.




Unfortunately, some people have misunderstood the ordinance to mean, not that the City manager determines the operating costs annually, but that she on a yearly basis determines what are the City's cultural and tourist facilities. Because of this misunderstanding the bed tax committee may have used incorrect calculations in their recommendations to the Council.

Why should the average resident care about this issue? Isn't it just the motel owners business? Everyone should care because, every dollar of bed tax money that does not go to cover the cost of operating the City's cultural and tourist related facilities is replaced by a dollar collected as property tax. If \$10,000 of the bed tax money that the City's budget already allocated to Parks is removed and made available for bed tax grants, this \$10,000 will be made up from your property taxes. I believe that we Council members should work to reduce your property taxes, not increase them.






