The Port Orford City Council at their February 12 meeting voted by a 4-2 margin to begin the process of repealing the city's bed tax ordinance. They will have to write and pass an ordinance that abolishes the bed tax ordinance to accomplish this goal. The ordinance as currently written provides for the collection of a 6% bed tax on people staving at motels and hed and breakfasts within the city limits. Every year several civic organizations, including the City of Port Orford, apply for the dispersal of these funds. The 1995-96 amount was \$28,000. Every year there are more grant requests than money available and this has caused more than a little hard feelings.

I urge the City Council to reconsider their vote and not proceed along this course. I speak to the four council members who voted to begin the repeal process; Ralph Donaldson, Carl Eskelson, Tim Sparks and Robert Warring. The majority Council vote was in response to and in agreement with the recommendation of the bed tax review committee to abolish the ordinance.

Several civic organizations have benefited from the funds raised by this ordinance. The Lightin' Bugs are one of those deserving groups. Though they receive bed tax money they also put on fund-wisers and do a lot of hard work. Every year since moving to Port Orford in 1990 Valerie and I have attended their Little Reno night (except 1995 when they didn't hold one.) These evening have been one of the social highlights of the year. The Bugs are typical of many groups in town. They have a small core of dedicated volunteers but are spread too thin for the amount of work and money they need to raise. The bed tax funds helps them pay for replacing some 50% of the Christmas lights every year that either break or burn out. The Bugs provide the time consuming labor as well as additional money through their fundraising efforts.

Another group that receives bed tax money is the Chamber of Commerce. This money is used for promotional materials including the Discover Port Orford brochure and advertising in several vacation guides including the Del Norte Vacation Guide, the World vacation guide, S.O.V.A. magazine and the Fabulous North Curry. The Chamber does its share to raise money including sponsoring the Labor Day Auto Races, Circus, Fourth of July Jubilee and this year, the Volkswalk. These events are put on for the enjoyment of local

people and to attract tourists to visit Port Orford. The Chamber will continue to function without bed tax money but the advertising and promotion money won't be there. I don't see any benefit to the motel owners who agreed with the bed tax review committee's recommendation. One thing about the argument about this town promoting itself as the only one on the coast without a bed tax. Take away the bed tax and there won't be the money to promote this concept.

The two garden clubs are another fine example of a group that receives a small amount of bed tax money and goes a long way with the funds. They buy bulbs and plants with their money and then provide the labor and time to plant and tend to these beautification projects.

A portion of the bed tax money goes to the repair and maintenance of the city's cultural and tourist related facilities. Take away the tax and these facilities including the visitor center at Battle Rock Park, Port Orford Community Building and the restrooms, horse paddock, A-frame cabin, etc. at Buffington Park will suffer from the lack of capital that is needed to both maintain and improve them. What will happen is that instead of some support for

Dear Friends, in reference to the possibility of Port Orford rescinding its bed tax, perhaps we should confirm exactly what the County bed tax ordinance is. It seems to me that at the time Curry County was writing its bed tax ordinance, the language read that the County ordinance shall apply to all areas of the county that do not have a city bed tax. If the county ordinance does in fact read this way, if Port Orford dropped its bed tax, the county bed tax would go into effect in Port Orford. I respectfully suggest that Port Orford keep its bed tax if the county would otherwise impose one. I respectfully suggest that Port Orford bed tax be fully dedicated to a fund for the upkeep. maintenance and improvement of the Community Building, the restroom building at the beach, and the A-frame. The Community Building is a resource for all of the community social and civic groups.

The Community Building needs insulation, lighting, a multiple microphone sound system, finishing of the wall paneling, removal of the dark wallboard and substitution of drywall plasterboard, improvements to the bathrooms and the dressing rooms for performers. The Community Building is an extraordinary resource that should not be allowed to deteriorate.


Correction To Letter

Elk River Management Plan

Elk River is one of several rivers on the southern Oregon Coast that has been included on the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality's proposed list of Water Quality Limited Water Bodies. The Elk River was listed for high summer water temperature and habitat modification. In order to remover Elk River from this list and any State and Federal regulations, Elk River must have a functioning management plan.

On Tuesday, March 5, 1996 at the Elk River Campground, 7pm, there will be a meeting of a working committee to begin a management plan for the Elk River. This plan will commit the landowners to provide fencing for livestock, off-stream water systems, and riparian planting to begin rejuvenating the lower Elk River for fish rearing habitat. Any persons willing to provide useful input are welcome to attend.
