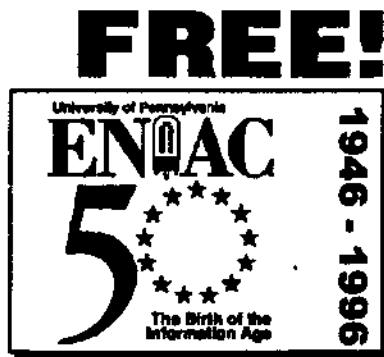

## Committee Meetings By Evan Kramer

Tammy asked me to start this article by saying I had a dream where it was sunny in Port Orford and not rainy and windy. Well it's anything but sunny and warm today and there's not much I have to do with the weather. Meanwhile I'm grateful we have electricity since service is out on Elk River Road (thanks to a large fallen hemlock tree) and north of Langlois.

Many public events take place in Port Orford. This year in addition to such regulars as the Fourth of July Jubilee Celebration, Port Orford Grand Prix and Port Orford Arts Festival two new events have been added. They are the Volkswalk on Memorial Day Weekend and the Port Orford Mountain Bike Races scheduled for Saturday, July 6. Now these events don't just happen like a winning lottery ticket. Much planning and work by committees of people meeting frequently bring these events to fruition. I've been watching the work Murleen O'Hearn has put into the mountain bike races. She has put together a brochure describing the different races and has already distributed many of them, and not just in the local area. Many have been handed out in Northern California. Looking at the brochure it is plain to see that they don't lack for sponsors or support though it's

Murleen who is doing most of the work.

The Jubilee Committee met on Wednesday and continued planning for Port Orford's biggest event of the year. The theme of this year's Jubilee celebration is "Salmon, Surfing and Sailing". The Jubilee auction will be on June 8. Money raised from this auction goes for paying for the fireworks display at Battle Rock Park. The parade and concession booths were discussed. People or groups who wish to participate in the parade or run a concession booth at Battle Rock Park on July 4 can get a form at Chetco Credit Union, First Interstate Bank, Buck's Sentry Market, the Port Orford Chamber of Commerce office and the liquor store. Times are still being set for many of the individual events at the Jubilee but one which has been set is the Port Orford Fishermen's Association salmon barbecue on July 4 at 3:00pm at Driftwood Elementary School. The Fishermen's Association will sponsor the dinghy races this year as well as a survival suit race and possibly a live crab race. The Jubilee pins have been produced and this year the committee will be selling pins, bolo ties, key chains and earrings. The pin that Bob Sutton has designed and produced is a salmon in keeping with this year's theme.

The Common Good board of directors

held a meeting Thursday night and we were introduced to two new board members. They are Frank Cramer, who is the new secretary for the group and the Rotary Club representative on the board Mark Creighton. These are two fine additions to the group which includes president John Stockman and vice-president Ray Johnson. A big thank you goes out to Marian Eskelson who served as secretary the last many years. Ray Johnson asked me to pass on a request to the public. The Common Good is in need of donations of children's clothing for the racks they maintain at Driftwood Elementary School and Blanco Middle School. Ray can be reached at 332-6325 if you want to give the donated clothing to him on behalf of the Common Good or you can drop your donations off at the Common Good building at 14<sup>th</sup> and Idaho on Wednesdays. Charles Quillen told the group he would be in charge of the Shoes For Kids program again this year.

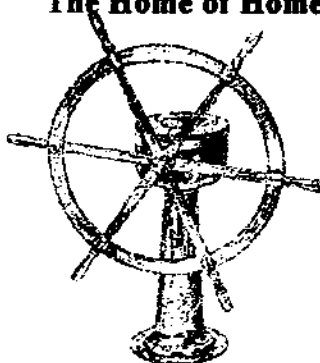

### School Changes

The transition team representing the Driftwood and Blanco site councils will host an open meeting on Thursday, May 2 at 7pm in room 3 at Blanco Middle School to discuss a proposal to switch the elementary grades to the white building and the Middle School grades to the red building. Data concerning the move will be available prior to the meeting at both Blanco and Driftwood. The final recommendation is to be submitted to the School Board at their May 14 meeting.

### Happy Birthday!

This year is the time to wish a happy birthday to all computers. The first electronic computer, Eniac, was publicly unveiled on Feb. 14, 1946 in Philadelphia. It had 18,000 vacuum tubes, took up 240 sq feet, and "ate" 174kw of power. It ran at a speed of 100kHz.

25 years ago, in 1971, Intel introduced its 4004 chip - the first microprocessor and

the great granddaddy (several times over) to our current generation of PC's. The 4004 led to the 8008 in 1972, the 8080 in 1974, the 8086 in 1978, the 80286 in 1982, the 80386 in 1985, the 80486 in 1989, the Pentium in 1993, and the Pentium Pro in 1995.

By comparison the Pentium Pro has 5.5 million transistors (vacuum tubes are no longer used - transistors serve the same purpose but are smaller, more rugged, and use less power.) It runs at up to 200MHz (2,000 times faster). The chip, even in its ceramic packaging, takes only a few square inches of space. It runs on a few watts of power.

Moore's law says that computer power doubles about every two years. The first computers were used for mathematics, next they were used for business data processing. Now the focus is on communications. Expect many changes!

At this time of inquest into the February 12 shooting death of Ted Davis, I would like to remind public and authorities alike that there are at least three vested interests in the affair, each of which equally demands justice: (1) a citizen has been deprived of his life; (2) a police officer's reputation is under a cloud; and (3) the respect and trust of a large segment of the community for its police has been impaired. Within its limited legal scope, an inquest can only accomplish so much. It may or may not restore Deputy Gardiner's reputation, but nothing can return Mr. Davis's life, and the only way to reestablish community trust is to reduce the chances of such an event ever occurring again.

Is it even within the scope of an inquest to examine the police procedures that may have contributed to or might have

prevented such an event? If it is not, how can we as citizens address this question and assist our police force to answer it? I want to live in a community where a citizen can trust police officers to be disciplined professionals - who are also ordinary, fallible human beings - well-trained and well-supported to handle the volatile situations to which they are exposed, and where the police officers know they have the trust of citizens - also ordinary, fallible human beings - who may create volatile situations or need protection from them. This desire may be idealistic, but anything less is unacceptable.

## Absentee Ballots

Renee Kolen, Curry County Clerk informs registered voters that Absentee Ballots for the Primary Polling Place Election are now available.

"Many voters are wanting to know when they are going to receive their ballot for this May 21, 1996 Primary Election." Kolen said. "We want to inform voters that the May 21 primary election is a polling place election and not a vote-by-mail election." Kolen added.

The 1996-96 legislative session passed a bill that would have allowed Primary and General polling place elections to be conducted by mail. However, Governor John Kitzhaber subsequently vetoed that bill. "Voters who prefer to vote by mail during a polling place election can simply request an absentee ballot from our office and we will be happy to mail them one." Kolen said.
