## Mountain Bike Race

June is breaking out all over which means there's only one month until the Port Orford Jubilee Mountain Bicycle Race. The Race is sponsored by the Sixes Grange along with NORBA and will be held on Saturday, July 6.

There are six different races which will all be going on at the same time, all sharing parts of the same race course. Here is a description of each race taken directly from the Bike Race brochure which Mirleen O'Hearn and Julie Hawthorne have so diligently been working on and distributing.

### Youth Sunset Course

The Sunset course, 1.5 miles, is all on Hensley Hill, through varied terrain on off-road trails and logging roads, in a forested setting. Start and finish lines are in a rural neighborhood of Port Orford.

### Christmas Tree Trail

This course is 2.5 miles, starting on a gravel road on Hensley Hill, followed by a challenging hill through a Christmas tree farm, then on old logging roads through a forested setting to finish on Hensley Hill.

## Bagley Creek Trail

Bagley Creek Trail is 16 miles, starting at the Elk River check point. It follows Elk River Road to the Bonnaville Sub Station, turns up Bagley Creek via a challenging hill, cresting in a forested area. It continues on the ridge into Port Orford's Hubbard Creek watershed, finishing in town at the Community Building.

## Marsh Ranch Run

This is a 20 mile course starting from the Elk River check point with a 3 mile warm-up on pavement, proceeding through the Marsh Ranch, up a staircase incline to the ridge above Elk River. This challenging trail winds through varying terrain of forest on off-road trails, logging and paved roads, finishing at the Community Building.

## Masters Pleasure Route

The Masters Run is 16 miles starting from Hensley Hill, north on a paved to gravel road along a ridge overlooking the Elk River, through a Christmas tree farm, into forested shade, across the North Fork Hubbard Creek, up a short steep hill finishing at the Community Building.

## Touring Course

This course starts from the Elk River

check point and follows the Marsh Ranch Run. This is a noncompetitive ride, so you can take time through the same scenic area and finish in downtown Port Orford.

## Independence Day Parade

Participants are invited and encouraged to take part in Port Orford's Fourth of Jubilee Parade. Interested riders should come to the parade's line-up at the City Hall on 20<sup>th</sup> St., west of Highway 101 at 10:00am and look for the mountain bicycle contingent.

There are several categories based on your age and an entry fee for the race.

The youth categories are 6-7, 8-9, and 10-12. The entry fee for youth is \$3.

Other age groups are juniors, 13-15 and 16-18, entry fee \$15. Seniors are 19-25 and 26-34 and the entry fee is \$25. Veterans are 35-44 with an entry fee of \$25. Masters are 45 years and older with an entry fee of \$25. The touring or noncompetitive category is \$15 to enter and the single speed (all ages) is \$15 to enter. These early entry fees are good through July 3, 7:00pm. After that a late fee of \$5 is added. The age category you fit in is determined by your age as of December 31, 1995.

### Mobile Mammography

Curry General Hospital's mobile mammography unit will make its monthly visit to Curry Family Medical clinic in Port Orford, Wednesday, June 12. The unit comes to the Port Orford clinic every second Wednesday.

Low-income women can get funding for free mammograms through the Texas-based Susan G. Komen Foundation. Check with the clinic for eligibility details.

The American Cancer Society recommends a first-time mammogram for most women by age 40. Mammograms are recommended every one to two years for women 40 to 49, and annually for women 50 and older. Those 60 and older should be especially aware of the importance of early detection because they are at increased risk for developing breast cancer.

Besides scheduling visits in Port Orford,

patients can schedule mammograms throughout the month at Curry General Hospital in Gold Beach.

Also, as part of the Curry Breast Health Network's mission to "protect and educate Curry County women," groups and organizations can request a speaker on topics such as breast cancer detection, up-to-date methods of finding tiny tumors, and alternatives to surgical biopsies. Bets Byrtus, coordinator of the Curry Breast Health Network and breast cancer survivor, also speaks to groups of any size. Drawing from her personal experiences with family, friends and doctors, her frank discussions can include topics "you've always wanted to know but were afraid to ask." For more information, phone Byrtus at the Breast Health Network at (541) 247-6621.



**Computer Comments  
by Valerie Jean Kramer**

Chicken Little may have been wrong about the sky falling but computer prices have sure tumbled a lot in the last six months. Last Thanksgiving we were selling a multimedia 486-100 with 8Mb RAM and 630Mb hard drive for \$1700. Today we can offer a multimedia Pentium 100 with 16Mb RAM and 850Mb hard drive for \$1449 (see our ad for details).

Two factors have combined to cause this price collapse. Intel has been fast and furiously releasing new CPU chips. They are expected to formally release their 200Mhz Pentium this month and a 300Mhz chip is being developed. As

new chips are released, prices drop on the older ones.

At the same time, memory manufacturers have been ramping up production on higher density chips and opening new fab lines to increase production. This has led to a substantial price drop on RAM. For quite a while, I could quote about \$50 per megabyte for RAM but there is no longer such a simple formula. Each different type has its own (lower) price. For example, the current price on 16Mb 72-pin SIMM(4x32-70) is \$179.95 or about \$11 per megabyte! Don't you wish gas, food, or automobile prices would drop like that!

In the last year hard disk and CD-ROM

prices have dropped greatly. 28.8kbps modems are down as are the prices on audio cards. Most other prices remain fairly stable.

While its difficult to predict future prices, I'm being told RAM prices have started to rise slightly. CPU prices may continue to drop a bit but it looks like we are at about the bottom of this current price cycle so this is probably your best time to buy. (note: that's my opinion, not a guarantee!)

For a long time, I've advised people that they should expect their new computer system to last about 3-5 years. Not that it would break that quickly but because it would become obsolete and wouldn't be able to run the newest software or use the newest hardware. I derived that time frame empirically but recently put a couple of other facts together to confirm a basis for it.

A while back I read a magazine column in which the author recommended that one not upgrade their computer unless the new one was about four times faster. That sounded right to me and is just about the normal range being sold. Here are

To all of the above, add Moore's Law which states that computer power doubles every two years and you have an 4x speed upgrade every four years. Allowing for personal tastes and variations in systems being purchased yields my 3-5 year estimate. If you assume that a system costs about \$2,000 then this also means you

should budget at least \$500 per year on average for hardware upgrades or replacements for each computer you own.

I feel that today's best value is a multimedia Pentium 100 or 133 system with 16Mb RAM and a 1Gb or larger hard disk. Despite the substantial cost, I really like the 17" monitors. I hope their price will continue to drop over the next year or two. You should get a 28.8kbps modem since the Internet is becoming an

fully give you an edge on the war with our four-legged foe. We'll also have a booth in the county extension building and Master Gardeners will be there to answer your questions about gardening and water and septic problems. Plus, we'll be having an election to elect the WORST gardening problem you have, whether it is deer, snails and slugs, wind, rain, or even soil. We'll find out Curry County gardener's Public Enemy #1, with some of the runners-up and I'll give the results of the election in this column. Stop by our booth and cast your vote!

Now that plants are growing in the flower and vegetable gardens, "things" come along and munch on them. There are lots that munch, but this time I'm addressing bud worms - the little green worms that eat the flower buds on petunias and geraniums before they open, and the big tomato worm everyone knows - the tomato horn worm. *Bacillus thuringiensis* is readily available at any nursery, which will do these guys in. Mix as the label directs and spray your affected plants. Within hours, the worms stop eating. It can take up to 2 weeks for the worms to actually die, but they can't eat the plants they've been feeding on. What's so good about B.T. is it's totally natural and can be used on vegetables too. You don't have to wait before harvesting and eating. You can spray in the morning and pick the veggies for tonight's dinner if you wanted. It works on most all caterpillars and worms. One draw-back is if

you want butterflies, make sure of the caterpillar you are spraying! (It's easy with the bud worms - you can see them eating the buds and the horn worm is easily identifiable.

Speaking of tomatoes, have just received a bulletin from O.S.U. suggesting the use of black plastic when planting heat-loving plants like tomatoes, peppers, squash and melons. The sheeting will warm the soil and keep the heat in at night. They suggest laying the plastic down before planting, making holes where you'll be placing the plants. If you have drip irrigation, put drip lines under the plastic. If you use sprinklers to water, dampen the soil first, lay the plastic and cut the holes for your plants larger than 6 inches, to ensure that enough moisture gets to the ground around the plants. Also said to use a pitch fork to make holes in the plastic so water could soak through. (be careful of any drip lines!) And, though it wasn't mentioned, the plastic would help keep the weeds down.

We had a very good response at our Master Gardener's Plant Clinics at the Volkswalk in Port Orford and the Azalea Festival in Brookings. Met lots of wonderful people and were able to solve problems and give out information concerning gardening. In case you couldn't make it, we're still available on Wednesday's 9:00am to noon. And start thinking about your #1 gardening problem so you can "vote" at the Fair. Good gardening!

## Homing Pigeon Finds New Home By Alice Pfand

On May 27 I received a call for help. A pigeon had walked into the visitor center at Battle Rock Park and refused to leave. The pigeon was sleek and slender and had bands on both legs. I guessed it might be a lost homing pigeon. I took the bird home and gave it food and water. It was very tired and hungry. After eating its fill it took a long nap.

Now to find its owner. I immediately thought of the Internet and soon located the Homing Pigeon Flightline in Hous-

ton, Texas which features a lost bird report email address. I entered the bird's tag number and location. The next day I had an email reply. The pigeon's home club was in Vancouver, Washington. I called the club contact and was informed that they had a 400 mile race on May 25 from Glenn's Ferry, Idaho. Because of bad weather it took some of the pigeons 15 hours to return home. Our bird was really lost, had flown approximately 15 degrees off its flight plan, and spent an estimated 56 hours flying time.

They didn't want the pigeon back. Homing pigeons that can't find their way home aren't much use as racers. But Orville Laursen was happy to adopt the bird. He used to raise homing pigeons.
