Salmon, Surfing and Sailing By Evan Kramer

Yes folks, it's time to put aside all the local controversies, unfold our lawn chairs, get film in the cameras and enjoy Port Orford's Fourth of July Jubilee celebration. This year's jubilee theme is Salmon, Surfing and Sailing. The first event this week is the pet show in back of Jennie's Old Town Cantina on Wednesday afternoon at 1:00pm. This pet show isn't limited to cats and dogs so those out there with more exotic pets are also welcome.

Most of the Jubilee events take place on Thursday and what better way to begin your day with family and friends than a ham and eggs breakfast served by the Port Orford Rotary Club at Driftwood Elementary School. They start fixing and serving breakfast at 7:00am. The breakfast continues through 11:00am. When you're done eating you can stop by the bonsai and quilt shows which are also at the school.

The North Curry Family and Children's Center is sponsoring this years sand sculptor event at Port Beach at 9:00am.

The centerpiece of each year's Jubilee is the parade down Highway 101 from Port Orford City Hall to Battle Rock Park which starts at 11:00am. The grand marshal of this year's parade is Monty Montgomery, owner of the local Texaco station. Look for a mountain bike riding contingent in the parade this year as well as the mountain bike donated by Coca Cola which will be raffled off at the conclusion of the races. Also look for a group representing the Port Orford Library summer reading program.

The dinghy races at Battle Rock Park begin at 1:30pm and is one of several events during the afternoon. One of my favorites is the fish box derby. Cars begin their descent down 11th Street at Jackson and cross the finish line in front of the Community Building.

If you get hungry after watching the races you can head over to Driftwood school for the Port Orford Fishermen's Association salmon barbecue at 3:00pm. This is an all you can eat meal which includes salmon, baked beans, shrimp, cole slaw and dessert.

The third and final performance of this year's Jubilee Melodrama entitled "The Great American Mello Drama"takes place at 6:00pm at the Community Building. Then it's time to rest up and get ready for the shining finale to the Fourth of July at Battle Rock Park. As darkness settles in the Port Orford Volunteer De-

partment under the direction of chief George Gehrke takes center stage and set off the fireworks.

This year the Jubilee celebration continues through Saturday, July 6, with two more fun events starting with the horse-shoe tournament at Buffington Park. Sign up at 10am and the tournament begins at 10:30am.

The first annual Port Orford Mountain bike race concludes this year's Jubilee celebration. The races start at 11:00am. Several of the races will finish up at the Community Building so those wishing to watch as the participants ride up to the building need be there around noon.

There's also plenty of live musical entertainment this week as the Port and Starboard Restaurant presents Timberwolf Wednesday through Saturday nights while Pitches' Tavern showcases The New South Band Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday nights. Over at the Star Theater Jack Ponting and the Port Orford Meteorite along with the Antique Dog band take the stage for one night only on July 4.

There's plenty going on to keep us all busy. Have a fun and safe Fourth of July.

Surely this was a close call. Do we have to wait until someone dies before this deplorable policy is reversed?




