Get Your Kicks In '96 By Evan Kramer

"Get Your Kicks In 96" is the theme of this year's Curry County Fair and Rodeo. Reminds me of a famous song about an even more famous road. The Fair opens on Thursday, July 25 and runs through Sunday, July 28. The Fairgrounds are located in the heart of Gold Beach on Highway 101 across from the Bookworm Bookstore. This year the Fair will feature many special attractions including the rodeo at 7:00pm on Friday and Saturday nights a well as destruction derby on Sunday afternoon at 3:00pm.

People who have entries for the fair and can't get down to Gold Beach can drop off your entries in Port Orford at the Liquor Store on Monday, July 22 or Tuesday, July 23, at Sea Breeze Florist. Please, no livestock. I talked with Fair Board member Viola Cuatt and she told me she has advance tickets for the rodeo including reserved seating at \$12.00 per ticket. The advance general admission tickets she has for sale include general admission to the rodeo and cost \$5.00. She also has ticket books for the midway rides. Viola told me the rodeo this year features the second largest prize money in the state of Oregon.

Presenting Tom Paxton

I am pleased to share with everyone news of a big musical event for Port Orford. The Port Orford Arts Council has signed an agreement that will bring folk music legend (he deserves the title) Tom Paxton to Port Orford. He will perform two concerts on Wednesday, October 16, at the Port Orford Community Building. The first concert will be performed during the day for students at Driftwood Elementary School. This will be a free concert sponsored by the Arts Council for the students only. That same evening Paxton will take the stage again to perform for one and all. Tickets for that show will be \$10 for adults and \$8.00 for people under 18.

Tom Paxton has been around a long time and recorded many albums. He began performing in the early 1960's in Greenwich Village. Some of his more famous songs include "The Last Thing on My Mind", "Ramblin' Boy", "Bottle of Wine" and "The Marvelous Toy". He has recorded 33 albums starting with "I'm the Man Who Built the Bridges" in 1962 and including his most current one "Wearing The Time" which was released last year. Paxton is noted for his biting social commentary, wonderful sense of humor and his children's songs. He exemplifies

"family values" and often writes about his family. He is also known to get the audience singing along with his songs.

Tickets will go on sale in September.





SWOCC July Workshops


Southwestern Oregon Community College will be offering several workshops in Gold Beach throughout the month of July. Pre-registration is required for all the workshops.


