History Preserved On The Hill By Evan Kramer

The University of Oregon is currently holding a Historic Preservation Field School in Port Orford. The three two week sessions will wrap up on August 3 but before the students and teachers leave. town they're holding a series of talks about what they've done. On Tuesday night the presentation was held on the top of Coast Guard Hill in the life boat station or, as it is also known, the barracks. The talk was led of by Don Peting, a professor from the University of Oregon who is in charge of the field school. He said the University offers an M.A in historic preservation and there are now 25 students in that program.

The three two week sessions focused on Hughes House, Cape Blanco Headlands, and the Port Orford Headlands site which once served as the U.S. Coast Guard Life Saving Service complex. Peting said some of the things the students have done were to put new roof pieces on the Hughes House, do some historically accurate repairs to the house and build new windows for the barracks building which will be installed after the bats migrate.

Peting discussed goals for the former Coast Guard site in a series of three phases called the Port Orford Headlands Design Project. Phase I includes an interpretive plan to explain what the area is all about. He mentioned people driving up to the life saving station and not understanding the connection with the buildings to the purpose they once served since the ocean is not readily apparent. He also talked about having exhibits in the barracks building, an office for the Point Orford Heritage Society, a lift to make both the basement and first floor of the barracks handicap accessible and using one of the two garages as a boat building shop.

Problems with the road in the park and parking were discussed. One solution would be a new access road that leads behind the garages to a new parking lot where public bathrooms would be located. Some other ideas for the area included rebuilding the practice tower and the lookout tower and restoring what is now used as a parking lot back to what it was originally built for which is a tennis court.

Phase II ideas included boat building demonstrations, improving the trail system in the park, rebuilding the water tower as well as the weather tower and opening up the steps which led from the barracks building down to Nellie's Cove where the life boats where kept.

Phase III was discussed by Dave Pinyerd, student coordinator for the field school. He presented a series of his drawings depicting a life boat saving station interpretive center located on Highway 101 in Port Orford. The drawings of the eye catching building were a hit with those who attended the meeting on Tuesday night. It included a recreation of a boat house to draw people into the building. An idea to reduce the amount of people driving up the hill to the life boat station included using a shuttle bus to take people from the interpretive center to the life saving station.

One important thing that needs to be understood is the three phases of development that were presented on Tuesday night are the student's design ideas for the area. It is now up to Oregon State Parks and the people of this community to decide if they want to follow up on them and how they want to go about it. Most of their ideas would restore the area and its buildings to what they used to be like when it was an active Coast Guard facility.

Point Orford Heritage Society President Viola Cuatt concluded the meeting by telling everyone that there would be an open house and tours at the barracks

Regulated Use Closure

Due to increasingly high fire danger, District Manager Gene Brock of the Coos Forest Protective Association announced that a Regulated Use Closure went into effect Saturday, July 27, 1996. This closure will effect all lands within Regulated Use Areas CS-2, CS-5, and all private, state, county and BLM lands within Regulated Use Areas SK-1 and

This Regulated Use Closure contains the following requirements and restrictions which apply to all timber, brush and grass areas. These requirements shall remain in effect until further notice.

- Smoking is prohibited while traveling except in vehicles on roads, in boats on the water, and at designated locations.
- Open fires are prohibited, including campfires, charcoal fires, cooking fires and warming fires, except at desig-

nated locations. Portable cooking stoves using liquefied or bottled fuels are allowed.

- Chain saw use is prohibited between the hours of 1:00pm and 8:00pm in areas subject to Industrial Fire Precaution Level I and Level II. Chain saw use is permitted at all other hours, if the following fire fighting equipment is present with each operating saw: one axe, one shovel, and one operational 8 ounce or larger fire extinguisher. In addition, a fire watch is required for at least one hour after the use of each saw.
- Chain saw use is prohibited in areas subject to Industrial Fire Precaution Level III and IV.
- Use of motorized vehicles, including motorcycles and all terrain vehicles, is prohibited, except on improved roads.

ing equipment is required while traveling, except on state or county roads: one axe, one shovel, and one galion of water or one operational 2 ½ pound or larger fire extinguisher.

- Use of fireworks is prohibited.
- Cutting, grinding and welding of metal is prohibited between the hours of 1:00pm and 8:00pm.
- Use of exploding targets is prohibited.

As used in this proclamation, unless the context otherwise requires "Restrictions" means those requirements which must be complied with then on lands subject to this proclamation, unless waived by the forester. Such requirements do not apply to activities for which a permit has been issued in accordance with ORS 477.625

I subscribed to two humor lists and found myself getting 50+ messages a day! There is no charge for being on most of these lists. Check it out at www.lsoft.com (click on CataList to see the lists.)

Seek and ye shall find dept. When you are using a search engine to find pages of interest, there are three tips you should know. Searching on a single word is easy but usually results in too many hits, most of which you don't want. With multiple words, you get even more hits - all pages



having any of the words you listed. Use a plus sign before a word to get only pages that have that word. A minus sign can be used to exclude pages that have that word. Phrases should be included in quotes. For example: "apple pie" would return only pages with the phrase "apple pie" on them. +pie +apple would return any page that has both the word pie and the word apple on it. +pie -apple would give all pages with the word pie that did NOT have the word apple on them. Read the tips on your search engine's page for more help.


