You Take The High Road By Evan and Valerie Kramer

Day 8 (Aug. 22) - Glasgow - Loch Lomond - Fort William - Grantown Scotland's rugged landscape dominates the day. Along the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond into the Highlands to visit infamous Glencoe. Then past Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain, to Fort William, to see the Commando Memorial with its stunning mountain views. Next we continue through the glens to Grantown. (FBD)

Although we were scheduled to see the Burrell Museum in Glasgow yesterday, we were running behind and didn't get to it till this morning. (We also didn't get our fish & chips at Harry Ramsden's till Edinburgh.)

Valerie's not usually excited by art museums but she enjoyed this one. She's been interested in the works of Rodin ever since she read about some of them in Robert Heinlein's "Stranger in a Strange Land." The museum had several bronze casts of his works including one of The Thinker. A guard explained that the original was carved in marble and that a number of bronze casts were made under Rodin's supervision thus theirs was "an original copy."

Valerie was also particularly interested in the stained glass and bought, and read, a book about it. Most, if not all, of the stained glass we had seen in America was merely different colors of glass, either flat or rippled, cut to shape and separated by lead moldings. This medieval stained glass had been abraded, overlaid with pigments, and otherwise processed to yield exquisite details and colors within each panel instead of just a single color. You have to see it to appreciate it but it produced a much more vibrant and alive kind of image. We also saw this kind of work in many of the cathedrals and castles we visited.

After leaving Glasgow we headed to Loch Lomond where we took an optional one hour cruise on a tour boat. Loch Lomond is over 600' deep and is the largest expanse of fresh water in Britain (as opposed to Lake Windemere which last week we said was the largest lake in England.) The waters of Loch Lomond lap round the foot of the 3200' tall Ben Lomond mountain. It is a beautiful sight and steeped in history and legend. From the boat we saw the entrance to a cave supposedly used by Rob Roy.

Loch Lomond is also famous in song and you probably have sung at least the chorus (full lyrics are available at http://

www.cs.hut.fi/~zaphod/search/lyrics/ loch_lomond)

O' ye'll tak the high road and I'll tak the low road,

And I'll be in Scotland afore ye;
But me and my true love will never meet

On the bonnie bonnie banks o' loch Lomond

The often jolly singing is wildly at variance with the real meaning of the song. The song is said to have been written by a Jacobite prisoner in Carlisle jail. His cellmate was to be set free while he was to be executed. In Scottish legend, when a man died, his soul would immediately return underground to his native country. Hence upon his death, he would take the "lowroad" while his freed cellmate would travel overland taking the "high road." Played to a slow beat, the beautiful melody and touching story make this a brilliant example of the Scottish spirit.

After a lunch stop in Tyndrum, we made an all-too-brief stop at Glencoe. The bus pulled into a modest size turnout overlooking the valley. A piper in full kilt was playing various songs such as Amazing Grace, Loch Lomond, and the Ballad of Glencoe on his bagpipe. Moderately heavy clouds over the green and purple

slopes lent a moody atmosphere to the view. Valerie is not much of a hiker but the trails winding through the heather made even her wish she could go for a walk.

All was not always so peaceful, however. In February of 1692 the Campbells came thru the snow with orders to kill the McDonalds of Glencoe. Ignorant of those orders the McDonalds offered them hospitality and, in return were murdered in their sleep. This marked the end of the Highland way of life. 

City Gets "Good" Dirt By Evan Kramer

I received a phone call on Saturday afternoon that work was going on at city manager Dotti Myers' house and city equipment including a back hoe and dump truck were being used along with city personal. A little later I received a call that the back hoe did not belong to the city. A little after I:00pm I drove by her house to see what was going on. No equipment of any kind nor any people were visible though it did look like some excavation work had taken place.

The gist of the rumor and innuendo mill was that city equipment and personal had been used at Myers' house. On Tuesday morning I prepared a written list of questions directed toward the city manager about the situation and drove over to city hall. I asked to speak to Dotti and after she was done talking to two other people I went into her office and asked her what was going on regarding the equipment

and personal. By then she had already received an inquiry from one of the city councilors and had prepared a letter addressed to Mayor Kennedy and directed to all councilors.

Here's what I found out from talking to Dotti. The back hoe was owned and operated by a private licensed contractor in Port Orford who put in three hours on the job. I spoke with him and confirmed this. The dump truck did belong to the city and the driver was a city employee. He was working on his own time and was paid for his labor by Myers. One thing Dotti told me that surprised me was I had been the first person who had come to her and asked about the situation.

What did the city get out of the deal? Quite a bit actually. They received three dump truck loads of top soil which was transported to an area of Buffington Park the city has been filling in. The fill dirt or top soil is something you normally pay for the privilege of receiving. Dotti told

me it goes for up to \$150 a load. Top soil in Port Orford is actually at a premium. I know having just filled three half whiskey barrels planters full of it in front of our store and having received a number of inquiries where I got the "good" dirt from

I learned a lesson from all this. Next time before I get sucked into the black hole of the rumor and innuendo mill I'll go right to the source and begin investigating the situation. The very fabric of life in Port Orford is being ripped apart by gossip and rumors. It's time all of us took a deep breath and found out what is really going on before we run around town or burn up the phone wires accusing someone of wrong doing. My apologies to city manager Dotti Myers for my small part in spreading misinformation.
