## Children's Center Needs Help By Evan Kramer

The Port Orford Children's Center needs your help. Earlier this year to save on rent they moved into a room at Driftwood Elementary School. They now pay \$200 a month rent at the school and are on a year to year lease. The Children's Center is currently the beneficiary of a grant that provides them with \$700/month for their operating expenses. This grant will run out in June, 1997.

The Center provides child care services for an average of 10-20 families a month. They are being forced to raise their rates from \$1.75 an hour per child to \$2.00 an hour to keep up with expenses which include a part time director, teacher and assistants. The Children's Center loses money on a monthly basis.

Here's some of the things the Children's Center needs in order to keep operating and providing this valuable serve for the residents of Port Orford. They need an experienced grant writer to help the board or preferably join the board and help write grants. They need a free space to house the center. They could use more volunteers who would donate consistent hours (volunteers would have to submit to criminal background checks). Volunteers are also needed who could run or

help with fund raising events.

If there is anything on the Children's Center wish list you can provide call board member Phil Nemrava at 332-0123 and discuss it with him.

## Tarno Wins Senate Race

Last week we printed the election results we had received from the county clerk's office as of 10:00am on Wednesday morning, November 6. Judging from the amount of questions I've received the final results are still not well known. Despite a Wednesday, November 6 headline in the Coos Bay World on page 3 entitled "Lehman, Brecke go to Salem", incumbent state senator Brenda Brecke is not going back to Salem. She was defeated by challenger, state representative Veral Tarno, by 2,306 votes. Tarno gathered up 23,731 votes to Brecke's 21,425. They ran in State Senate District 24 which includes Coos, Curry and parts of Douglas and Lane County. Ken Messerle will join Tarno representing our area in Salem having been elected state representative in a contest with Martha Weaver-Britell.

In other races Bill Roberts defeated Cheryl Thorp by 385 votes for the position of Curry County Commissioner position #3. Lloyd Olds was the winner in the other

commissioner race for position #2 defeating Tamie Kaufman by a 1,319 vote margin. Olds and Roberts will join TV Skinner on the board of commissioners in January.

The closest race belongs to the contest between incumbent county clerk Rene Kolen and challenger Elaine Joy for the clerk's job. With all ballots counted the "unofficial final results" shows Kolen with 5 more votes than Joy out of a total of 11,039 votes. There will be a recount next week. This photo finish reminds me how important each and every vote is. The new district attorney for Curry County will be Patrick Foley whose winning margin over John Spicer was 593 votes. He will replace Kim Olin.

One important ballot proposition that we showed winning as of publication time last week eventually lost and that was Measure 32, funding for light rail. Meanwhile controversial Measure 47 came back from the jaws of defeat. We showed it losing but it went on to pass with 52% of the vote as absentee ballots were counted and tipped the balance. The close race for U.S. Senator was won by Gordon Smith though it took several days before that contest was decided. Smith is replacing Mark Hatfield who has served

### Flu Shots Still Available

Curry County Health Department reports that 2,837 flu shots and 407 pneumonia shots were given county wide during the month of October, 1996.

Flu and pneumonia shots will continue to be available throughout the month of November at all three health department locations: in Brookings on Tuesdays from 1-4:00pm and Thursdays from 9-11:00am (except Thanksgiving); in Gold Beach on Wednesdays from 9-11:00am and 1-4:00pm; and in Port Orford on Thursdays

(except Thanksgiving) from 9-11:30am and 1-4:00pm. Clients with Medicare need to bring their cards with them when they come to the health department. For non-Medicare clients, the cost of the flu shot is \$8 and \$20 for the pneumonia shot.

Flu shots are recommended for all persons 65 years of age or older, residents of long term care facilities housing persons of any age with chronic medical conditions, and people with long-term health problems or who are less able to fight infections. Flu shots are also recommended for anyone who has close contact with people who are at risk for getting a serious case of flu. Questions regarding flu and/or pneumonia vaccinations can be answered by calling the local health department: Brookings 469-3836; Gold Beach 247-7011, extension 265; or Port Orford 332-4041.

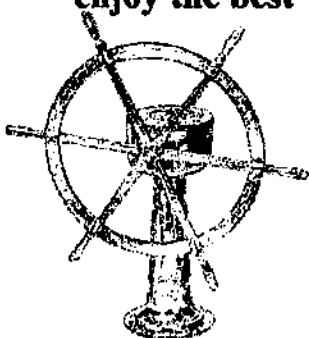

## Register of Historic Places

The State Historic Preservation Office is announcing November 1996 open house dates for properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places and receiving property tax relief under the state's special assessment program.

The list, which is distributed monthly, is also available through the State Historic Preservation Office and certain participating chambers of commerce, historical societies, assessor's offices and local landmarks offices.

Under the special assessment program, a property's assessed value is frozen for 15 years for purposes of local property taxes. Owners of commercial properties may reapply for an additional 15 years. In return for this benefit, owners are required to hold an annual open house for the public. The open house must be held at least one day a year for a minimum of

four consecutive hours between 9:00am and 9:00pm. Owners may choose any day of the year except state observed national holidays.
